


The 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit

1. WISDOM: helps us see the world differently and from God's point of view.

2. UNDERSTANDING: enables us to know more clearly the mysteries of faith.

3. COUNSEL [also known as Right Judgment]: helps us to discern what is right and what is wrong.

4. FORTITUDE [also known as Courage]: strengthens our will so that we can actually accomplish what is true, good and beautiful.

5. KNOWLEDGE: enables us to discover God's will in all things.

6. PIETY: helps us to love God, our merciful Father, and to obey his precepts out of love for him.

7. FEAR OF THE LORD [also known as Wonder and Awe]: helps us to understand how we must depend on God for everything. In other words, he is God, we are not.



5 THINGS EVERY CHRISTIAN SHOULD KNOW ABOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT


1 HE IS A PERSON  
The Holy Spirit is the third Person of the Trinity.

2 HE IS FULLY GOD  
All three persons of the Trinity are fully God and "equal in glory".

3 HE HAS ALWAYS EXISTED  
God eternally exists as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

4 YOU RECEIVE HIM AT BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION  
We receive Him first in Baptism, and then is strengthened in the gifts of the Holy Spirit at Confirmation.

5 CHRISTIANS ARE TEMPLES OF THE HOLY SPIRIT  
We have the Holy Spirit indwelling in us. We must live accordingly.

# Sunday Reflection

I'm not very good at telling jokes. I like them, but after I hear one and laugh at it, I let it go and forget it. I suspect this doesn't just apply to jokes. The Gospel today hints that the disciples may have had the same weakness when Jesus says the Spirit will "teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (John 14:26).

Jesus spent three years teaching his disciples and showing them how much God loves them and how to love their neighbor. He used parables as examples and miracles as signs of the Father's love. He answered their questions and explained things privately. Knowing that this would still not be enough, he promised to send the Spirit after he had risen. You have to experience some things to understand them. And that is what the disciples would do.

When they received the Spirit after Jesus' resurrection, they also began to do the things Jesus talked about. They fed the poor and healed the sick. Thus they began to experience Jesus in those around them. They would remember what Jesus had taught them and apply it in their lives. They even accepted suffering for their faith.

We too can receive that promise from Jesus to have the Spirit teach and remind us. As we share our faith with others, we begin to experience Jesus in them.

As we listen to the Lord in prayer, we are reminded of passages in the Bible and we begin to understand how they apply in our lives. May the Holy Spirit teach and remind us of the signs of God's love.



No soy muy bueno contando chistes. Me gustan, pero después de escuchar uno y reírme, lo dejo pasar y lo olvido. Me imagino que esto no se aplica sólo a los chistes. El Evangelio de hoy da a entender que los discípulos pueden haber tenido la misma debilidad cuando Jesús dice que el Espíritu "les enseñará todas las cosas y les recordará todo cuanto yo les he dicho" (Juan 14,26).

Jesús pasó tres años enseñando a sus discípulos y demostrándoles cuánto Dios los ama y cómo amar al prójimo.

Utilizó parábolas como ejemplos y milagros como signos del amor del Padre. Respondió a sus preguntas y explicó las cosas en privado. Sabiendo que esto todavía no sería suficiente, prometió enviar al Espíritu después de resucitar. Hay que experimentar algunas cosas para entenderlas. Y eso es lo que hacían los discípulos.

Cuando recibieron el Espíritu después de la resurrección de Jesús, también comenzaron a hacer las cosas de las que Jesús habló. Alimentaron a los pobres y sanaron a los enfermos. Así comenzaron a experimentar a Jesús en quienes los rodeaban. Recordaban lo que Jesús les había enseñado y lo aplicaban a sus vidas. Incluso aceptaban el sufrimiento por su fe.

Nosotros también podemos recibir esa promesa de Jesús de que el Espíritu nos enseñará y nos recordará. Cuando compartimos la fe con los demás, comenzamos a experimentar a Jesús en ellos. Cuando escuchamos al Señor en la oración, recordamos pasajes de la Biblia y comenzamos a entender cómo se aplican en nuestras vidas. Que el Espíritu Santo nos enseñe y nos recuerde las señales del amor de Dios

### DRESSING RESPECTFULLY FOR MASS

Mass is holy, it's the sacrifice of our Savior for us. Saints and angels are with you at Mass, surrounding the Eucharist. It's a break from the stress of the world, an opportunity to refocus yourself on Christ for the rest of the week, and a heavenly partaking in communion.

#### What You wear to Mass makes a Statement

The significance of Mass is endless, so your intentional dress at Mass is a statement to yourself and to others that this is not just any other activity... this is important.

Children know by their special clothes that Mass is a unique time and will follow their parents' example for how to act in Mass. It's not every day that a five year old puts on a polo shirt and nice shoes. Why not begin showing them how extraordinary Mass is from head to toe (freshly combed hair and dress shoes)?

Also, others will see the respect of parishioners and understand that this isn't just a casual occurrence. Mass is to be treated honorably, and the external expression of our spiritual faith is evangelical; it teaches; it spreads to Good News of Christ to ourselves, our families, friends, and others who witness our efforts of neatness and attention to detail.

Dressing up for Mass isn't a fashion competition, as if the better you dress, the holier you are. Rather, it's a way for each person to dress differently than their ordinary attire for school, for football games or for lazy Sunday afternoons. Because Mass is not ordinary; it's extraordinary.



"You're not going there not just to sit there for an hour quietly,". "You're going there to learn, to grow spiritually, to come into the real presence of Jesus." Preparing for Mass is more than getting in the car mindlessly and finding a pew. From the moment you start getting dressed in your finest, you are preparing your hearts for communion with your Savior, which calls for your utmost reverence.

#### What Not To Wear To Mass

1. Flip-flops and beachwear – Keep these items for fun in the sun, not worshipping the Son.
2. T-shirts and jeans – Great for hanging out with friends, but keep it classy when you are in the presence of God.
3. Revealing or too-tight shirts, skirts, and pants – Dress in a way that allows others to keep their focus on the beauty of God, not on your body.
4. Sweatpants, yoga pants, pajama pants, and gym shorts – Our culture loves to be comfy, but Mass is not for lounging. We suggest saving these items for when you return home.
