They help **combat evil and sanctify the life of those who have faith.** They act through the intercession of the Catholic Church.

Sacramental actions

The Sign of the Cross, blessings, prayers, etc.

Some objects include:



Crucifix

Place it in your home to remind you that your home belongs to Christ.



Blessed Salt

Scatter it around the perimeter of your home and on the doors.



Holy Water

Sprinkle it over your family and your home.



Medals

Wear them with faith and lead a righteous life.

Sunday Reflection

The parable in today's the Gospel has a crooked steward who is commended by his master for being prudent, or clever, trying to protect himself. Jesus wanted us to be just as clever in serving the Lord. Let's look at the first two readings and how they challenge us to do more.

The reading from Amos talks about those "who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor" (Amos 8:4). The challenge here is to ask yourself, "What do I do for the poor?" Most parishes have organizations to help the needy and are happy to get volunteers. Do you ever think of praying for the poor?

Speaking of prayer, our second reading also challenges us to do more. Paul recommends prayers for "kings and for all in authority" (1 Timothy 2:2). It's easy to pray for friends and family; how much time do we give to prayers for government leaders and executives? Paul reminds us that God wants everyone to be saved (1 Timothy 2:4), sinners as well as saints, terrorists and embezzlers, atheists and agnostics. I'll bet you don't spend much time praying for the "bad guys."

Yet Jesus said, "Love your enemies. Pray for those who hurt you" (Matthew 5:44). I can't say I've ever heard anyone say that was their favorite Bible passage. But if Jesus expects more from those who love him, who are we to let him down?

La parábola del Evangelio de hoy trata sobre un administrador deshonesto que es elogiado por su amo por ser hábil o astuto al intentar protegerse. Jesús quiere que seamos igual de astutos al servir al Señor. Analicemos las dos primeras lecturas y cómo nos desafían a hacer más.

La lectura de Amós habla de quienes “los que buscan al pobre sólo para arruinarlo” (Amós 8,4). El desafío aquí es preguntarse: “¿Qué hago yo por los pobres?”. La mayoría de las parroquias tienen organizaciones para ayudar a los necesitados y están felices de recibir voluntarios. ¿Alguna vez piensas en rezar por los pobres?

Hablando de la oración, la segunda lectura también nos desafiaba a hacer más. Pablo recomienda orar por “por los jefes de Estado y las demás autoridades” (1 Timoteo 2,2). Es fácil rezar por amigos y familiares; ¿cuánto tiempo dedicamos a rezar por los líderes y ejecutivos del gobierno? Pablo nos recuerda que Dios quiere la salvación de todos (1 Timoteo 2,4), tanto pecadores como santos, terroristas y malversadores, ateos y agnósticos. Supongo que la mayoría de nosotros no dedicamos mucho tiempo a rezar por los “malos”.

Sin embargo, Jesús dijo: "Amen a sus enemigos. Oren por quienes los lastiman" (Mateo 5,44). No creo que haya escuchado a nadie decir que ese era su pasaje bíblico favorito, pero si Jesús espera más de quienes lo aman, ¿quiénes somos nosotros para defraudarlo?
