The Readings

A Reading from the prophet Isaiah 51:1-6

Listen to me, you that pursue righteousness, you that seek the Lord.

Look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were dug. Look to Abraham your father and to Sarah who bore you; for he was but one when I called him, but I blessed him and made him many.

For the Lord will comfort Zion; he will comfort all her waste places, and will make her wilderness like Eden, her desert like the garden of the Lord; joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song. Listen to me, my people, and give heed to me, my nation; for a teaching will go out from me, and my justice for a light to the peoples. I will bring near my deliverance swiftly, my salvation has gone out and my arms will rule the peoples; the coastlands wait for me, and for my arm they hope.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

The Sermon

Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

Presider: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Godparents:

We present Charles Lobb Wasden to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Presider: Will you be responsible for seeing that Charles is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents: *I will, with God's help.*

Presider: Will you by your prayers and witness help Charles to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents: *I will, with God's help.*

Presider: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Parents and Godparents: *I renounce them.*

Presider: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Parents and Godparents: *I renounce them.*

Presider: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Parents and Godparents: *I renounce them.*

Presider: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Parents and Godparents: I do.

Presider: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Parents and Godparents: I do.

Presider: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Parents and Godparents: I do.

The Presider addresses the congregation, saying

Presider: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Charles in his life in Christ?

People: **We will.**

Presider: Let us join with Charles who is committing himself to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Presider: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

People: **I do.**

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: **I believe in Jesus Christ, God's eternal Son, our Savior.**

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you cherish the wondrous works of God, and protect the beauty and integrity of all creation?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: May Almighty God, the Father of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by God's grace, in Christ Jesus our Savior. Amen.

Prayers for the Candidate

Presider: Let us now pray for Charles who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Deacon: Deliver him, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Open his heart to your grace and truth.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Keep him in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Send him into the world in witness to your love.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon: Bring him to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Presider: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. **Amen.**

Thanksgiving over the Water

The Presider blesses the water, first saying:

Presider: God is with you.

People: **And also with you.**

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Presider: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, O God, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Presider touches the water.

Presider: Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. Amen.

The Baptism

Presider: *Charles Lobb Wasden*, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Charles Lobb Wasden you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. **Amen.**

Charles Lobb Wasden, receive this candle as a sign of the light of Christ that now dwells in you. **Amen.**

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: **We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

Presider: The peace and love of Christ be always with you.

People: **And also with you.**

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Presider: Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God. In the fullness of time bring us, with [_____ and] all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**
