# A RESOLUTION GRANTING CONDITIONAL APPROVAL OF THE 611 LAND DEVELOPMENT, LLC MINOR SUBDIVISION PLAN

WHEREAS, the applicant, 611 Land Development, LLC, submitted a minor subdivision plan application titled "Final Minor Subdivision for 611 Land Development, LLC" (the "Plan"). The Plan proposes a minor subdivision of property located on the northern side of SR 0611 between Bartonsville Avenue and Frantz Road into two (2) parcels. The existing parcels are identified as Monroe County Tax Parcel No. 12.2.1.26-2. The property is located in the C Commercial Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer has reviewed the Plan and offered comments in his letters dated May 7, 2024, December 5, 2024 and March 6, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Pocono Township Planning Commission recommended the conditional plan approval of the Plan at a meeting held on March 10, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Pocono Township Board of Commissioners desire to grant the conditional approval of the Plan, subject to the following.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of Pocono Township, County of Monroe, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

That the following requests for modification from the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance are hereby granted:

1. SALDO Sections 390-43.A.(10) and 390-47.C.(2) — Lot lines should follow municipal and county boundaries. The applicant shall be permitted to have Lot #2 cross the existing municipal boundary line shared between Hamilton Township and Pocono Township.

That the "Final Minor Subdivision for 611 Land Development, LLC" as shown on the plan prepared by prepared by Devco Infra LLC, dated March 7, 2024, as revised, be hereby approved with the following conditions and provided the plan is revised as follows, subject to the review and approval of the Township Engineer and/or Township Solicitor:

- 1. The applicant shall comply with all of the conditions and requirements identified in the Township Engineer's letters dated May 7, 2024, December 5, 2024 and March 6, 2025.
- 2. The applicant shall pay all necessary fees associated with the Plan, including but not limited to any outstanding plan account charges and all professional services fees, prior to the recording of the Plan.
- 3. The applicant shall obtain all required permits and approvals from other governmental agencies

prior to presenting the Plan for signatures.

- 4. The applicant shall provide three (3) mylars for recording the plans and eight (8) sets of paper prints which are signed and notarized by the owner and sealed by the engineer.
- 5. The applicant shall meet all conditions of the final plan approval, and Plan shall be recorded within twelve (12) months of Conditional final plan approval, and agrees that if such conditions are not met, the Conditional final plan approval will be considered void.
- 6. The applicant shall accept these conditions in writing within five (5) days of receipt of the Board of Commissioners' Resolution, otherwise the application is denied.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Applicant, 611 Land Development LLC, is proposing to subdivide a 46.503 acre property located along the northern side of SR 0611 between Bartonsville Avenue and Frantz Road. The site has frontage on all three (3) roadways and is located in Pocono, Hamilton, and Stroud Townships. A 0.137 acre portion



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of the existing property is located across Frantz Road (on the northestern corner of the intersection of Frantz Road and S.R. 0611). The property is located in the C-Commercial District in Pocono Township. The natural resource areas present on the site include wetlands, streams, woodlands, and steep slopes. A vacant house and several out-buildings are also located on the site.

Proposed Lot No. 1 is shown to be 41.826 acres and Lot No. 2 as 4.677 acres. The plans propose development of Lot No. 1 with a stormwater infiltration basin while Lot No. 2 will be developed with a proposed hotel with a total of 120 rooms; 60 for Springhill Suites and 60 for Townplace Suites. A new access drive will be constructed from SR 0611 within Hamilton Township. The developed area is mostly within Hamilton Township; however, a loading area, and a portion of the proposed parking and dumpster areas are within Pocono Township. A stormwater infiltration basin on Lot No. 1 is also within Pocono Township. The site will be served by public water and sewer.

The plans were accepted by the Township Planning Commission at its meeting held on April 8, 2024.

Based upon our review of the submitted information and our previous review letter dated December 5, 2024, we offer the following comments and/or recommendations for your consideration.

#### **ZONING ORDINANCE COMMENTS**

- 1. In accordance with Section 470-20.B.(1)(gg), "customary accessory uses incidental to the above permitted uses" are permitted.
  - a. During the proposed land development, the existing dwelling (principal use) on Proposed Lot #1 will be removed. However, the existing garage, barn, shed, and chicken coop are shown to remain. The existing accessory uses shall be removed with the existing dwelling (principal use). (Previous Comment 1) The existing shed and chicken coop are now shown as to be removed. The response letter indicates the existing garage and barn are structurally sound and will remain. The existing garage and barn are accessory uses and cannot remain without a principal use. The existing structures shall be removed or relief from the Zoning Ordinance will be required. (Previous Comment 1) The response letter indicates a variance will be sought as needed to keep the existing garage and barn. The Zoning Officer shall determine whether the existing garage and barn may remain without a primary use or if a variance will be required.
  - b. Previous Comment 1.b satisfied.
- 2.-5. Previous Comments 2 thorough 5 satisfied.

#### SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE COMMENTS

One (1) waiver is requested from the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance as discussed in Comment 21.

#### MINOR SUBDIVISION PLAN COMMENTS

The following items are required in support of the Minor Subdivision Plan (Sheet C-101).



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- 6. In accordance with Sections 390-18.B.(6)(c) and 390-18.E, the applicant shall be responsible for submission of the plan and all required supporting documentation to the Monroe County Planning Commission. "No official action shall be taken by the Board of Commissioners until either the Township has received the comments of the Monroe County Planning Commission or a period of 30 days has expired following transmittal of the preliminary plan to the County Planning Commission." Proof of submission to and comments from the County Planning Commission shall be provided to the Township. (Previous Comment 6) A response to the April 17, 2024 Monroe County Planning Commission comments was provided with this submission. No further action required.
- 7. In accordance with Sections 390-18.F, 390-28.C.(2), and 390-29.J.(8)(a), the Township shall concurrently make its decision on the sewage facilities planning module, and, if approval is granted, the completed sewage planning documents shall be forwarded to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. Minor subdivision plan approval shall be conditional upon Department of Environmental Protection sewage planning approval. Sewage planning shall be completed and approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP). (Previous Comment 7) All correspondences with, submissions to, and permit from PADEP for sewage planning shall be provided.
- 8. In accordance with Section 390-27.A.(3), "the survey shall not have an error of closure greater than one in 10,000 feet and shall include a boundary closure report". In addition, and in accordance with Section 390-27.B.(11), the Minor Subdivision Plan shall include "sufficient data, acceptable to the Township, to determine readily the location, bearing and length of every boundary, road or lot line. All dimensions shall be shown in feet and hundredths of a foot. All bearings shall be shown to the nearest one second of an arc." Lot closure reports shall be submitted in support of the Proposed Lots #1 and #2. (Previous Comment 8) The following comments related to the submitted lot closure reports shall be addressed.
  - a. Lines 13 and 14 in the Line Table on Sheet C-106 are consistent with the Lot 1-North closure report, however the bearing and/or distances are inconsistent with the Lot 2 closure report. (Previous Comment 8.a) Line 14 still needs to be corrected for consistency with the Lot #1 North, Lot #1 North Net, Lot #2, and Lot #2 Net closure reports. (Previous Comment 8) The bearing along Line 14 is listed as SW on the plan and SE in the closure report. It appears the plan shall be revised to reference SE.

b.-c. Previous Comments 8.b and 8.c satisfied.

- 9.-20. Previous Comments 9 through 20 satisfied.
- 21. In accordance with Section 390-43.A.(10), "lot lines should follow municipal and county boundary lines, rather than cross them. Reserve strips controlling access to lots, public rights-of-way, public lands or adjacent private lands are prohibited." In addition, and in accordance with Section 390-47.C.(2), "lots divided by municipal boundaries shall be avoided. Where a subdivision is divided by a municipal boundary, the applicant shall so notify the governing body of each municipality affected so that an administrative agreement for the platting and taxing of lots between the municipalities can be executed, if such agreement is necessary." The proposed subdivision creates Proposed Lot #2 which crosses the existing municipal boundary line shared between Hamilton Township and Pocono Township. The plan shall be revised. (From Previous



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Comment 21) A waiver was requested to permit the subdivision line to cross the municipal boundary line. The requested waiver was recommended for approval by the Planning Commission at its meeting held on February 10, 2025.

22. Previous Comment 22 satisfied.

#### LAND DEVELOPMENT PLAN COMMENTS

- 23. In accordance with Section 390-16.C.(3), "the applicant shall be responsible for submission of the plan and all required supporting documentation to the Monroe County Planning Commission, the Monroe County Conservation District, PennDOT, and all other governing agencies". In addition, and in accordance with Section 390-29.J.(19), the Land Development Plan shall include "copies of all other required permits or the applications made thereof". Submissions to, correspondences with, and approval from the following outside agencies shall be provided to Pocono Township:
  - a. Monroe County Planning Commission

Per Section 390-16.F, "no official action shall be taken by the Board of Commissioners until either the Township has received the comments of the Monroe County Planning Commission, or a period of 30 days has expired following transmittal of the preliminary plan to the County Planning Commission". (Previous Comment 23.a) A response to the April 17, 2024 Monroe County Planning Commission comments was provided with this submission. No further action required.

- b. Monroe County Conservation District/Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Erosion Control Adequacy and NPDES Permit An Incompleteness Letter dated April 19, 2024 was issued by the Monroe County Conservation District. (Previous Comment 23.b) A revised submission was made to the County Conservation District on January 17, 2025 and the application was deemed complete by the County Conservation District under cover letter dated February 19, 2025.
- c. Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Sewage Facilities Planning Module

Per Section 390-16.G, "the Township shall concurrently make its decision on the sewage facilities planning module, and if approval is granted, the completed sewage planning documents shall be forwarded to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. Preliminary plan approval shall be conditional upon Department of Environmental Protection sewage planning approval." (Previous Comment 23.c) A review by the Township Sewer Engineer was distributed on February 4, 2025. A copy of a revised submission to Hamilton Township under cover letter dated February 12, 2025 was shared with this office.

d. Pennsylvania Department of Transportation – Highway Occupancy Permit

Per Section 390-16.H, "if a highway occupancy permit shall be required for access to a Township or state road, approval of the preliminary plan shall be conditional upon the issuance of a highway occupancy permit by the Township and/or PennDOT, as the case may



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- be". (Previous Comment 23.d) A revised submission was made to PennDOT under cover letter dated February 18, 2025.
- e. Pocono Township Sewer sanitary sewer service design and capacity (Previous Comment 23.e) The comments provided in the Sanitary Sewer Engineer's letter dated February 4, 2025 shall be addressed.
- f. Brodhead Creek Regional Authority water service will-serve and sewage treatment capacity (Previous Comment 23.f) A Will Serve letter dated May 15, 2024 was submitted.
- g. Pocono Township Volunteer Fire Company (Previous Comment 23.g) The Fire Company responded on February 26, 2025 with no comments.
- 24.-26. Previous Comments 24 through 26 satisfied.
- 27. In accordance with Section 390-29.I.(11), "if land to be subdivided lies partly in or abuts another municipality, the applicant shall submit information concerning the location and proposed design of roads, layout and size of lots and provisions of public improvements on land subject to his control within the adjoining municipalities. The design of public improvements shall provide for a smooth, practical transition where specifications vary between municipalities. Evidence of approval of this information by appropriate officials of the adjoining municipalities also shall be submitted." (Previous Comment 27) Evidence of approval by Hamilton Township shall be provided upon receipt.
- 28.-31. Previous Comments 28 through 31 satisfied.
- 32. In accordance with Sections 390-29.J.(10) and 390-51.A, all soil erosion and sedimentation control plans shall meet the specifications of the Monroe County Conservation District and PA DEP, and shall comply with Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Title 25, Chapter 102, Department of Environmental Protection regulations for soil erosion and sedimentation control. An Incompleteness Letter dated April 19, 2024 was issued by the Monroe County Conservation District. (From Previous Comment 32) A revised submission was made to the County Conservation District on January 17, 2025 and the application was deemed complete by the County Conservation District under cover letter dated February 19, 2025. All submissions to, correspondence with, and approvals from the Conservation District shall be provided.
- 33. Previous Comment 33 satisfied.
- 34. In accordance with Sections 390-29.J.(15) and 390-48.T.(10), where access is to a state road, a valid state highway occupancy permit shall be obtained prior to plan recording. Where PennDOT standards differ from those of the Township, the more restrictive regulations shall apply. All submissions to, correspondences with, and permit from PennDOT shall be provided. (Previous Comment 34) A revised submission was made to PennDOT under cover letter dated February 18, 2025. All submissions to, correspondences with, and permit from PennDOT shall be provided.
- 35.-36. Previous Comments 35 and 36 satisfied.



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- 37. In accordance with Section 390-32.B and Section 390-41, no final plan shall be signed by the Board of Commissioners for recording in the office of the Monroe County Recorder of Deeds until:
  - 1) All improvements required by this chapter are installed to the specifications contained in Article <u>VI</u> of this chapter and other Township requirements and such improvements are certified by the applicant's engineer; or
  - 2) Proposed developer's agreements and performance guarantee in accord with § 390-35 and the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, Act 247 of 1968 as amended, have been accepted by the Board of Commissioners.

(New Comment) A construction cost estimate has been submitted for improvements related to the proposed Wetland Basin located within Pocono Township. The estimate will be reviewed under separate cover.

- 38.- 42 Previous Comments 37 through 41 satisfied.
- 43. In accordance with Section 390-48.AA, "sidewalks and road crosswalks may be required where necessary to provide proper pedestrian circulation or to provide access to community facilities and common areas. Sidewalks, where required or provided, shall be located within the road right-of-way immediately adjacent to the curbs, except as may be approved by the Township to accommodate road trees or other landscaping. Sidewalks and road crosswalks shall be constructed in accord with the most current PennDOT RC67M standard and Americans With Disabilities Act standards." A Monroe County Transit Authority (MCTA) bus stop is currently located at the northeastern corner of SR 611 and Bartonsville Avenue. Sidewalks shall be provided along all project street frontages; SR 611, Bartonsville Avenue, and Frantz Road to facilitate safe pedestrian circulation. (From Previous Comment 42) The proposed sidewalk east of the new driveway ends at the beginning of the proposed right-turn lane. This area of sidewalk is located in Hamilton Township and should be provided as required by Hamilton Township.
- 44. In accordance with Section 390-52.A.(1), "all subdivisions and land developments shall be served by an adequate water supply and sewage disposal system; and the developer shall provide evidence documenting said adequacy". Approvals from the Brodhead Creek Water Authority, Pocono Township, and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection shall be received in support of the water and sanitary sewer services. (Previous Comment 43) A Will-Serve letter has been issued by the Brodhead Creek Regional Authority. Approvals for sanitary sewer from Pocono Township and PADEP shall still be provided-
- 45.-51. Previous Comments 44 through 50 satisfied.
- 52. In accordance with Section 390-55.F.(1)(a), "all subdivisions and land developments shall be landscaped with property line buffers that act to integrate new development with its surroundings and to separate incompatible land uses."
  - a. In accordance with Table 390-55-1, a 10-foot wide low intensity buffer consisting of nine (9) canopy trees and five (5) ornamental trees are required along the western property line



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(418.96-feet). In addition, and in accordance with Section 390-55.F.(3)(g), "existing healthy trees, shrubs, or woodlands may be substituted for part or all of the required plants with the approval of the Township. The minimum quantities and/or visual effect of the existing vegetation shall be equal to or exceed that of the required buffer as determined by the Township." No trees are proposed along the western property line, however existing trees are proposed to remain. The required trees shall be provided, or the Applicant shall demonstrate the existing trees meet the intent of the required buffer. (Previous Comment 51.a) Three (3) canopy trees are now proposed along the new driveway and parking area and 3 ornamental trees are now proposed on the western side of Wetland Basin-1. The Applicant is proposing to utilize the new trees with the existing woodlands to remain to meet this requirement.

A partial waiver is required for use of the existing woodlands. Photographs of the existing woodlands in support of the waiver request shall be presented to the Township.

b. In accordance with Table 390-55-1, a 10-foot wide low intensity buffer consisting of five (5) canopy trees and three (3) ornamental trees are required along the northern property line (216.32-feet ±). No trees are proposed, and the plan shall be revised. (Previous Comment 51.b) No trees are proposed. Woodlands exist between proposed Wetland Basin-1 and the northern property line. The Applicant is proposing to utilize the existing woodlands to remain to meet this requirement.

A partial waiver is required for use of the existing woodlands. Photographs of the existing woodlands in support of the waiver request shall be presented to the Township.

- 53.-54. Previous Comments 52 and 53 satisfied.
- 55. In accordance with Section 390-58.E, "any subdivision or land development regulated under this § 390-58 shall be required to dedicate the specified amount of common open space, unless the Board of Commissioners and the applicant mutually agree to the payment of recreation fees-in-lieu of land, the construction of recreational facilities, the reservation/donation of common open space through an allowed alternative ownership method, or a combination of any of the foregoing". Prior to final plan approval the developer shall determine whether common open space will be proposed or if a fee-in-lieu of will be provided. (Previous Comment 54) The response letter suggests the 19.08 acres of Common Open Space is proposed. Per Section 390-58.G, the Applicant shall discuss with the Township whether common open space or a fee in-lieu-of will be required.
- In accordance with Section 390-60.A, "traffic impact study shall be submitted to the Township, as part of a preliminary plan and final plan for any subdivision or land development application expected to generate more than 250 new trips per day; for residential subdivisions or land developments containing 15 or more dwelling units or residential lots in the aggregate; or all nonresidential developments (with the exception of agricultural development) with buildings containing in excess of 20,000 square feet of floor space in the aggregate; development-of any kind impacting 30 acres of land or more in the aggregate." The required traffic impact study shall be submitted for review. (Previous Comment 55) The proposed development will include -a full access driveway onto S.R. 0611 and a 150 linear foot right-turn lane into the project site from S.R. 0611 north. The project will generate 750 additional vehicles during the typical



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weekday. The Traffic Impact Assessment (TIA) notes that the Cranberry Creek Apartments, the Wawas at Cherry Lane/Warner Road and Bartonsville Avenue, the Golden Slipper hospital development, and the Turtle Walk motor vehicle dealership were all considered in the analysis. The TIA further indicates the proposed development is not anticipated to impact traffic operations within the area of the development.

#### STORMWATER MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE COMMENTS

Waivers are requested from the Stormwater Management Ordinance as discussed in Comments 57, 58, 59, and 60.

The project site is located within the C, Provisional Direct Discharge District of the Brodhead-McMichael Watershed. The receiving water is Pocono Creek which has a Chapter 93 classification of High Quality, Cold Water Fishery (HQ/CWF).

- 57. In accordance with Section 365-10.I.(6)(b)[1], wetland buffer permitted activities/development includes "stormwater conveyance required by the municipality or other body or agency having jurisdiction; buffer maintenance and restoration; the correction of hazardous conditions; stream crossings permitted by DEP and passive unpaved stable trails shall be permitted within the wetland buffer. No other earth disturbance, grading, filling, buildings, structures, new construction, or development shall be permitted within the wetland buffer." The proposed grading, driveway, and parking area are not permitted activities in the wetland buffer, and the plan shall be revised for compliance with this Section. (From Previous Comment 56) The wetland buffer impacts have been added to Sheets CLS-1 and CLS-2. Disturbance of the wetland buffer is still proposed and shall be addressed. (Previous Comment 56) A waiver was requested to allow unpermitted activities within the required wetland buffer. The Planning Commission recommended approval of this waiver request at its meeting held on February 10, 2025.
- In accordance with Section 365-10.I.(6)(b)[2], the area of the wetland buffer altered by activities 58. permitted in accordance with Subsection I(6)(b)[1] above shall be minimized to the greatest extent practicable, as determined by the municipality. In no case shall more than 20% of the cumulative wetland buffer on the subject parcel be altered by the activities permitted in accordance with Subsection I(6)(b)[1]. This 20% disturbance shall include both the disturbance created by the applicant and any subsequent owner of the parcel or a portion of the parcel developed by the applicant (i.e., lot owner)." The plan shall include a calculation showing the area of existing wetland buffer and the area of disturbed buffer (in acres and percent) to confirm compliance with this Section for activities permitted in Section 365-10.I.(6)(b)[1]. (Previous Comment 57) Calculations have been added to Sheets CLS-1 and CLS-2. The calculations shall be revised to include the percent of the disturbed buffer area. In addition, the area of disturbance of the wetland buffer listed on Sheet CLS-1 is 164 square feet for the removal of the existing chicken coop. However, the existing house and shed that are proposed to be removed are also located within the wetland buffer and shall be included in the calculation on Sheet CLS-1. Areas to access the existing chicken coop and shed shall also be shown on the plan as disturbed area and included in the calculation on Sheet CLS-1. In addition, the calculation on Sheet CLS-1 does not account for the areas disturbed for proposed grading, driveway, and parking area, and shall be revised accordingly. (Previous Comment 57) A waiver was requested to allow unpermitted activities within the required wetland buffer. The Planning Commission

#### recommended approval of this waiver request at its meeting held on February 10, 2025.

- In accordance with Section 365-10.I.(8)(b), stream buffer permitted activities/development, includes "stormwater conveyance required by the municipality or other body or agency having jurisdiction, buffer maintenance and restoration, the correction of hazardous conditions, stream crossings permitted by DEP, fish hatcheries, wildlife sanctuaries and boat launch sites constructed so as not to increase the floodplain elevation, and unpaved trails, shall be permitted, providing no buildings are involved. No other earth disturbance, grading, filling, buildings, structures, new construction, or development shall be permitted." The demolition of the existing house, chicken coop, and shed, and proposed grading, driveway, and parking area are located within the required stream buffer. (From Previous Comment 58) The stream buffer impacts have been added to Sheets CLS-1 and CLS-2. Disturbance of the stream buffer is still proposed and shall be addressed. (Previous Comment 58) A waiver was requested to allow unpermitted activities within the required stream buffer. The Planning Commission recommended approval of this waiver request at its meeting held on February 10, 2025.
- 60. In accordance with Section 365-10.I.(8)(c), "the area of the [stream] buffer altered by activities permitted in accordance with § 365-10I(8)(b) shall be minimized to the greatest extent practicable, as determined by the municipality. In no case shall more than 20% of the cumulative stream buffer on the subject parcel be altered by the activities permitted in accordance with § 365-10I(8)(b). This 20% disturbance shall include both the disturbance created by the applicant and any subsequent owner of the parcel or a portion of the parcel developed by the applicant (i.e., lot owner)." The plan shall include a calculation showing the area of the existing stream buffer and the area of the disturbed buffer (in acres and percent) to confirm compliance with this Section for activities permitted in Section 365-10.I.(8)(b). (Previous Comment 59) Disturbance calculations have been added to Sheets CLS-1 and CLS-2 and are noted to be 2,450 square feet for the proposed house, chicken coop, and shed. It appears the disturbance should be 5,000 square feet ±. In addition, the area does not account for the proposed grading, driveway, or parking area. The calculation shall be revised accordingly. The calculations shall also be revised to include the percent of the disturbed buffer area. Areas to access the existing chicken coop and shed shall also be shown on the plan as disturbed area and included in the calculation on Sheet CLS-1. (Previous Comment 59) A waiver was requested to allow The Planning Commission unpermitted activities within the required stream buffer. recommended approval of this waiver request at its meeting held on February 10, 2025.
- 61.-66. Previous Comments 60 to 65 satisfied.
- 67. In accordance with Sections 365-15.A, 365-19.A.(4), 365-20.C.(2), and 365-21.C, any earth disturbance must be conducted in conformance with Pennsylvania Title 25, Chapter 102, Erosion and Sediment Control. An erosion and sediment control plan, including all reviews and letters of adequacy obtained by the Conservation District shall be provided. An Incompleteness Letter dated April 19, 2024 was issued by the Monroe County Conservation District. (From Previous Comment 66) A revised submission was made to the County Conservation District on January 17, 2025 and the application was deemed complete by the County Conservation District under cover letter dated February 19, 2025. All submissions to, correspondences with, and permit from the County Conservation District shall be provided.

#### STORMWATER MANAGEMENT AND STORM SEWER DESIGN COMMENTS

#### MISCELLANEOUS COMMENTS

- 80. Plans have previously been submitted to PennDOT for intersection improvements at S.R. 0611 and Bartonsville Avenue/Rimrock Road. Part of those improvements include a right-turn lane starting at the municipal boundary with Hamilton Township. The proposed right-turn lane is now shown on the plan and labeled as "Pocono Twp. Future Road Improvement Project".
  - While Pocono Township is the initiator of the project, the Township is partnering with developers to complete the improvements. The developer of the Wawa project site located across Bartsonville Avenue is proposing improvements along S.R. 0611 in close proximity to the Springhill Suites project site. 611 Land Development, LLC shall coordinate with the Wawa developer on the extent of those improvements. (Previous Comment 79) The response letter indicates the proposed S.R. 0611 improvements for this Springhill Suites development are being coordinated with the Wawa development located across Bartonsville Avenue.
- 81. The Subdivision Plan proposes use of only a small portion of the parcel. The Applicant shall provide additional information on the intended use for the remainder of the property. (Previous Comment 80) The response letter indicates the owner/developer currently has no plans for the remainder of the property.
- 82.-91. Previous Comments 81 through 90 satisfied.

#### **PLAN REVISION COMMENTS**

- 92-97. Previous Comments 91 through 96 satisfied.
- 98. Easement Description Plans have been added to the plan set and will be reviewed under separate cover. (New Comment)

The above comments represent a thorough and comprehensive review of the information submitted, with the intent of giving the Township the best direction possible. However, due to the nature of the comments in this review, the receipt of new information may generate new comments.

We recommend the above comments be addressed to the satisfaction of Pocono Township prior to approval of the Final Minor Subdivision Plan and the Preliminary Land Development Plan.

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer reviewed the Plan and offered comments in his letters dated July 16, 2021, January 20, 2022, and April 20, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Pocono Township Planning Commission (the "P.C.") recommended conditional preliminary/final plan approval at its meeting held on April 25, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Pocono Township Board of Commissioners granted Conditional Plan Approval by way of its Resolution 2022-24 on June 6, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has submitted an amended Preliminary/Final Land Development Phase A – Stormwater Management dated December 6, 2024 (the "Phase A Plan") in conjunction with a revised E&S Report and Compliance Narrative and revised PCSM Report and Compliance Narrative both dated October 18, 2024 (collectively the "Phase A Submittal"); and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer has reviewed the Phase A Submittal and offered comments in his letter dated, February 19, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the P.C. recommended conditional preliminary/final plan approval of the Phase A Plan at its meeting held on March 10, 2025; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of Pocono Township, County of Monroe, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

That the "Amended Swiftwater Solar Project Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan – Phase A Stormwater Management" as shown on the Phase A Plan prepared by Timmons Group, dated May 28, 2021, as revised, be hereby approved with the following conditions and provided the Plan is revised as follows, subject to the review and approval of the Township Engineer and/or Township Solicitor:

1. The Applicant shall comply with all of the conditions and requirements identified in the Township Engineer's letters dated July 16, 2021, January 20, 2022, April 20, 2022 and, February 19, 2025.

- 2. The Applicant shall enter into an Improvements Agreement with the Township and provide appropriate security.
- 3. The Applicant shall enter into a Maintenance Agreement with the Township and provide appropriate security.
- 4. The Applicant shall enter into a Stormwater Management and Maintenance Agreement with the Township.
- 5. The Applicant shall obtain all required permits and approvals from all other governmental and regulatory agencies, including but not limited to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, prior to presenting the Plan for signatures.
- 6. The Applicant shall meet all conditions of the preliminary/final plan approval, and Plan shall be recorded within twelve (12) months of Conditional Plan approval, and agrees that if such conditions are not met, the Conditional Plan approval will be considered void.
- 7. The Applicant shall accept these conditions in writing within five (5) days of receipt of the Board of Commissioners Resolution, otherwise the Plan is denied.

Pursuant to the Township's request, we have performed our first review of the Amended Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan for Swiftwater Solar. The submitted information was prepared by Timmons Group and consists of the following items.

- Amended Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan dated September 24, 2021, revised December 6, 2024.
- E&S Report and Compliance Narrative dated May 28, 2021, revised October 18, 2024.
- PCSM Report and Compliance Narrative dated May 28, 2021, revised October 18, 2024.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The site is located east of Interstate Route 380 (SR 0380), north and adjacent to Sullivan Trail Road (SR 4004) and Back Mountain Road, west of Summit Road and south of Swiftwater Creek. The property is located within the RD, Recreation Zoning District. The Applicant is leasing Tax Map Parcel 12/16/1/, 1 and a large portion of Tax Map Parcel 12/111903 for the project. The total leased area of the site is 643.99 acres, of which 471.20 acres are proposed to be disturbed. The site consists of woodlands, steep slopes, wetlands, a pond, and an existing private road which takes access from Back Mountain Road. Parcel 12/111903 has Floodway and Floodplain Area along Swiftwater Creek; however, the Floodway and Floodplain are outside of the leased area of the site.

The proposed development will include the construction of a fenced enclosure, solar panel fields, a substation, gravel access roads, underground electric lines, and sixteen (16) infiltration detention basins. The site drains to three different watersheds: Swiftwater Creek to the North, Dry Sawmill Run to the Southwest, and Scot Run to the Southeast. Access to the property will be via a single driveway entrance from Back Mountain Road. Water and sewer service are not proposed for this project.

This amended plan removes the bulk site grading and includes impervious areas such as the MV Skids and the substation.

This review includes Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance Comments related to the entire project site, and comments related to the stormwater management design in Phase D only. Separate reviews will be provided for Phases B, C, and D.

Based on our review of the above information, we offer the following comments and/or recommendations for your consideration.

#### SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE COMMENTS

Comments 1 through 6 discuss waivers that were previously requested from the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance and granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022.

- 1. In accordance with Section 390-48.H.(1), "wherever there exists a dedicated or platted portion of a road or alley along a boundary of the tract being subdivided or developed the remainder of said road or alley shall be platted to the width required by this chapter based on the classification of the road within the proposed development". A waiver from Section 390-48.H.(1) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to not required widening of Sullivan Trail and Summit Road. This amended plan does not change or provide access to and does not change the volume of traffic along Sullivan Trail or Summit Road.
- 2. In accordance with Section 390-48.K.(2), "the private access road shall not exceed 750 feet in length as measured from the edge of the right-of-way of the abutting road to the point of connection to the lot. The width of the private access road shall conform to Table 390-48-1. Any proposed road exceeding the seven-hundred-fifty-foot length shall comply with all normal standards which apply to road construction." A waiver from Section 390-48.K.(2) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to permit the proposed private access road to be longer than 750-feet and to not meet the requirements of Table 390-48-1. This amended plan does not revise the proposed private access road.
- 3. In accordance with Section 390-50.D.(4), "the maximum water depth, measured from the invert of the lowest outlet orifice to the peak one-hundred-year water surface elevation, shall not exceed five feet". A waiver from Section 390-50.D.(4) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to permit the stormwater stored in the proposed basins to have a depth greater than 5-feet. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request. Further review of Basin 305 is pending receipt of the proposed re-design.
- 4. In accordance with Section 390-50.D.(5), "the maximum slope of the earthen detention basin embankments shall be four horizontal to one vertical". A waiver from Section 390-50.D.(5) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to permit the grading at the proposed basins to exceed a slope of 4:1. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.
- 5. In accordance with Section 390-50.D.(7), "the minimum top width of the detention basin berm shall be 10 feet". A waiver from Section 390-50.D.(7) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to not require a berm width of 10-feet in cut sections. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.

- 6. In accordance with Section 390-50.D.(8), "in order to ensure proper drainage on the basin bottom, a minimum grade of 2% shall be maintained for areas of sheet flow. For channel flow, a minimum grade of 1% shall be maintained." A waiver from Section 390-50.D.(8) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to permit flat bottom basins. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.
- 7. In accordance with Section 390-51.A, "all soil erosion and sedimentation control plans shall meet the specifications of the Monroe County Conservation District and PA DEP, and shall comply with Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Title 25, Chapter 102, Department of Environmental Protection regulations for soil erosion and sedimentation control". The amended Land Development Plan shall meet the requirements of Chapter 102 and will require an amendment to the existing NPDES Permit. All submissions to, correspondences with, and permit from the County Conservation District shall be provided.

#### STORMWATER MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE COMMENTS

Comments 8 and 9 discuss waivers that were previously requested from the Stormwater Management Ordinance and granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022.

- 8. In accordance with Section 365-11.A.(3), the size of the recharge facility shall be based on the volume criteria in Subsection (a). A waiver from Section 365-11.A.(3) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting on June 6, 2022 to permit the use of the PADEP water quality spreadsheets to satisfy this requirement. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.
- 9. In accordance with Sections 365-13.B and D, "all calculations consistent with this chapter using the Soil Cover Complex Method shall use the appropriate design rainfall depths for the various return period storms according to the region in which they are located as presented in Table B-1 in Appendix A<sup>III</sup> of this chapter". Waivers from Sections 365-13.B and 365-13.D were granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting on June 6, 2022 to permit the use of the NOAA rainfall data. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.
- 10. 12. The emergency spillway width of Basin 201 is inconsistent with the approved width (36-feet currently and 34-feet approved).

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Applicant is proposing to combine three (3) existing properties located on the northwesterly side of Laurel Lake Road between Michele Lane and Marilou Lane.

- A. Existing Parcel 1 (Parcel ID No. 12.9A.2.9), owned by the applicant, has an area of 15,000 square feet and is located within the R-1, Low Density Residential Zoning District. It contains an existing house, driveway, shed, well, and septic area.
- B. Existing Parcel 2 (Parcel ID No. 12.9A.2.2), owned by the applicant, has an area of 15,000 square feet and is located within the R-1, Low Density Residential Zoning District.
- C. Existing Parcel 3 (Parcel ID No. 12.9A.2.8-1), owned by the applicant, has an area of 15,436 square feet and is located within the R-1, Low Density Residential Zoning District. It contains apportion of the existing house and shed.

The minimum lot area required within the R-1; Low Density Residential Zoning District is two (2) acres. All three lots are existing non-conformities as their lot areas are each less than two (2) acres. Additionally, the existing house is situated across the common lot line of Parcels 1 and 3. The proposed lot combination will create a new lot having an area of 1.04 acres which reduces the existing lot size non-conformity and provides for the house to be on one lot, thereby eliminating that non-conformity. No development is proposed.

#### **ZONING ORDINANCE COMMENTS**

It is noted that the existing house slightly encroaches into the rear yard setback. While this is an existing non-conformity which is not affected by the proposed combination, the existing setback dimension shall be labeled on the plan. (Previous Comment 1) The existing 38.97-foot setback dimension has been added to the plan. No further action is required.

#### SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE COMMENTS

- 2. In accordance with Section 390-18.E, "no official action shall be taken by the Board of Commissioners until either the Township has received the comments of the Monroe County Planning Commission or a period of 30 days has expired following transmittal of the preliminary plan to the County Planning Commission". An MCPC response letter dated February 10, 2025 has been received. The MCPC noted an acreage discrepancy with the Assessment Records which must be resolved. (Previous Comment 2) The surveyor's response states, "The listed area corresponds with the acreage from the original subdivision lot acreages from Map Book 36 Page 25." No further action is required.

Pursuant to the Township's request, we have performed our first review of the Amended Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan for Swiftwater Solar. The submitted information was prepared by Timmons Group and consists of the following items.

- Amended Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan dated September 24, 2021, revised December 6, 2024.
- E&S Report and Compliance Narrative dated May 28, 2021, revised October 18, 2024.
- PCSM Report and Compliance Narrative dated May 28, 2021, revised October 18, 2024.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The site is located east of Interstate Route 380 (SR 0380), north and adjacent to Sullivan Trail Road (SR 4004) and Back Mountain Road, west of Summit Road and south of Swiftwater Creek. The property is located within the RD, Recreation Zoning District. The Applicant is leasing Tax Map Parcel 12/16/1/, 1 and a large portion of Tax Map Parcel 12/111903 for the project. The total leased area of the site is 643.99 acres, of which 471.20 acres are proposed to be disturbed. The site consists of woodlands, steep slopes, wetlands, a pond, and an existing private road which takes access from Back Mountain Road. Parcel 12/111903 has Floodway and Floodplain Area along Swiftwater Creek; however, the Floodway and Floodplain are outside of the leased area of the site.

The proposed development will include the construction of a fenced enclosure, solar panel fields, a substation, gravel access roads, underground electric lines, and sixteen (16) infiltration detention basins. The site drains to three different watersheds: Swiftwater Creek to the North, Dry Sawmill Run to the Southwest, and Scot Run to the Southeast. Access to the property will be via a single driveway entrance from Back Mountain Road. Water and sewer service are not proposed for this project.

This amended plan removes the bulk site grading and includes impervious areas such as the MV Skids and the substation.

This review includes Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance Comments related to the entire project site, and comments related to the stormwater management design in Phase D only. Separate reviews will be provided for Phases A, B, and C.

Based on our review of the above information, we offer the following comments and/or recommendations for your consideration.

#### SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE COMMENTS

Comments 1 through 6 discuss waivers that were previously requested from the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance and granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022.

- 1. In accordance with Section 390-48.H.(1), "wherever there exists a dedicated or platted portion of a road or alley along a boundary of the tract being subdivided or developed the remainder of said road or alley shall be platted to the width required by this chapter based on the classification of the road within the proposed development". A waiver from Section 390-48.H.(1) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to not required widening of Sullivan Trail and Summit Road. This amended plan does not change or provide access to and does not change the volume of traffic along Sullivan Trail or Summit Road.
- 2. In accordance with Section 390-48.K.(2), "the private access road shall not exceed 750 feet in length as measured from the edge of the right-of-way of the abutting road to the point of connection to the lot. The width of the private access road shall conform to Table 390-48-1. Any proposed road exceeding the seven-hundred-fifty-foot length shall comply with all normal standards which apply to road construction." A waiver from Section 390-48.K.(2) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to permit the proposed private access road to be longer than 750-feet and to not meet the requirements of Table 390-48-1. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.
- 5. In accordance with Section 390-50.D.(7), "the minimum top width of the detention basin berm shall be 10 feet". A waiver from Section 390-50.D.(7) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to not require a berm width of 10-feet in cut sections. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.

A waiver from Section 390-50.D.(8) was granted by the Board of Commissioners at its meeting held on June 6, 2022 to permit flat bottom basins. The basin design in Phase C of this Amended Plan does not alter the previous request.

#### Dear Commissioners:

Pursuant to the Township's request, we have performed our third review of the above referenced project. The submitted information consists of the following items.

- March 19, 2025 email response from Jonathan Shupp, P.L.S., S.E.O. to our previous comment letter.
- Plan entitled "Lot Joinder of Lands of Charles Defazio", prepared by Jonathan Shupp, P.L.S., S.E.O., dated January 30, 2025, revised March 5, 2025.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Applicant is proposing to combine three (3) existing properties located on the southeasterly side of Laurel Loop Road.

- A. Existing Lot 42 (Parcel ID No. 12.11A.1.16), owned by the applicant, has an area of 0.6861 acres and is located within the R-1, Low Density Residential Zoning District. It contains an existing gravel drive.
- B. Existing Lot 43 (Parcel ID No. 12.11A.1.17), owned by the applicant, has an area of 0.6862 acres and is located within the R-1, Low Density Residential Zoning District. It contains an existing house, driveway, septic, and well.
- C. Existing Lot 44 (Parcel ID No. 12.11A.1.18), owned by the applicant, has an area of 0.6189 acres and is located within the R-1, Low Density Residential Zoning District. It contains an existing gravel drive.

The minimum lot area required within the R-1; Low Density Residential Zoning District is two (2) acres. All three lots are existing non-conformities as their lot areas are each less than two (2) acres. The proposed lot combination will create a new lot having an area of 1.9912 acres which reduces the existing non-conformity with respect to lot size. Additionally, the existing house on Lot 43 is in violation of the side yard setback. The proposal will eliminate this non-conformity. No development is proposed.

Based upon our review of the above information and our previous review letter dated March 18, 2025, we offer the following comments and/or recommendations for your consideration.

#### SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE COMMENTS

1. Previous Comment 1 satisfied.

- 2. In accordance with Section 390-28.A.(3), "the survey shall not have an error of closure greater than one in 10,000 feet and shall include a boundary closure report". A boundary closure report was provided. Segment #7 of the closure does not match the plan. The discrepancy must be resolved. Additionally, the MCPC noted an acreage discrepancy with the Assessment Records which also must be resolved. (Previous Comment 2) The plan has been revised to match the closure report. The issue of the discrepancy with the Assessment Records must be resolved with the County prior to recordation. (Previous Comment 2) The surveyor's response states, "The assessment records on the acreage comes from a plan dated 1960. The lots aren't even labeled with acres on the plan. They would have just been assumed by the assessment office in 1960." No further action is required.

The regular meeting of the Pocono Township Board of Commissioners was held on March 12, 2025 and was opened by Chair Richard Wielebinski at 6:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **Public Comment**

Cheryl Parks (Resident) –. Concerned with a special exception application, missing site plan, wetlands issues, unauthorized property changes, deed restrictions, drainage problems, and multiple dogs on the neighboring property. Bought her property in 1987 and feels harassed by neighbor.

Charles Kepler (Resident) – Announced candidacy for Pocono Township Commissioner. Opposes LERTA, arguing it favors big corporations over small businesses and suggests a more targeted approach for historic buildings and local businesses. Proposed a community workshop.

B. Winot explained how nothing Mr. Kepler described constitutes a LERTA.

Vincent Trapasso (Resident) – Explained how a LERTA will assist local developers like himself to continue to build and assist in keeping the taxes within the township down for everyone.

Josh Knapp (Resident) – Opposes blanket LERTA but sees value in a targeted approach. Warns it could shift the tax burden. Cited the Johnson & Johnson warehouse as an example. B. Winot corrected his information. Urged a more responsible review to earn his support.

DeVito explained the issue being, can we selectively exclude a use that is permitted in a district with a blanket LERTA Ordinance. B. Winot stated that every objection at the school board level has been about the warehouses. He suggested excluding the overlay. L Devito pointed out that it does not address the wind and solar. Amended Motion: B. Winot made a motion, seconded by R. Wielebinski, to authorize and direct the Solicitor to research and prepare an amendment to the LERTA Ordinance of this Township to exclude all uses permitted in the Enterprise Warehouse Overlay District. All in favor. Motion carried.
- B. Winot made a motion, seconded by R. Wielebinski, to partner with Susquehanna Accounting & Consulting Services Inc, to perform long-term Police Cost Study. Discussion, E. Gnandt asked if they specialize in Police studies. J. Belvin clarified. All in favor. Motion carried.
- B. Winot made a motion, seconded by R. Wielebinski, to direct the Township Solicitor to research and prepare a proposed amendment to the Township's Zoning Ordinance clarifying that solar farms and wind arrays are not defined or regulated as "essential services." Discussion: B. Winot spoke with the head of the EPA, Lee Zeldin. The US Government is going to determine that they are not essential services, they are secondary power sources, as they can never switch to either one of them. They cannot be base load power. 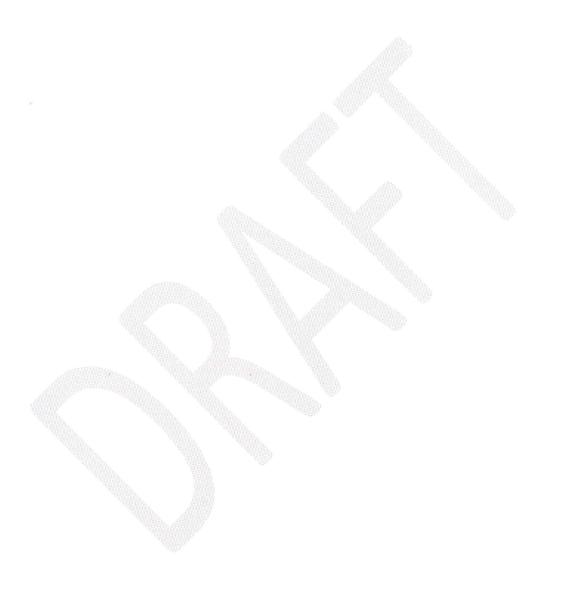

**BEGINNING** at a point on the southerly PennDOT Legal Right-of-Way line of S.R. 0611, Sta. 254+69.36 (46.10' LT);

**THENCE** along the southerly PennDOT Legal Right-of-Way line of S.R. 0611, as shown on the attached plan titled, TRAFFIC SIGNAL EASEMENT PLAN, DWG. NO. E-3, S 62°46'20" E,

a distance of 1.00 foot;

**THENCE** partly along said southerly PennDOT Legal Right-of-Way line of S.R. 0611 and partly along the westerly PennDOT Legal Right-of-Way line of Rimrock Drive (S.R. 3023), along a circular non-tangent curve to the right, having a radius of 60.00 feet, an arc length of 43.24 feet and a chord bearing S 31°19'20" E, a distance of 42.31 feet;

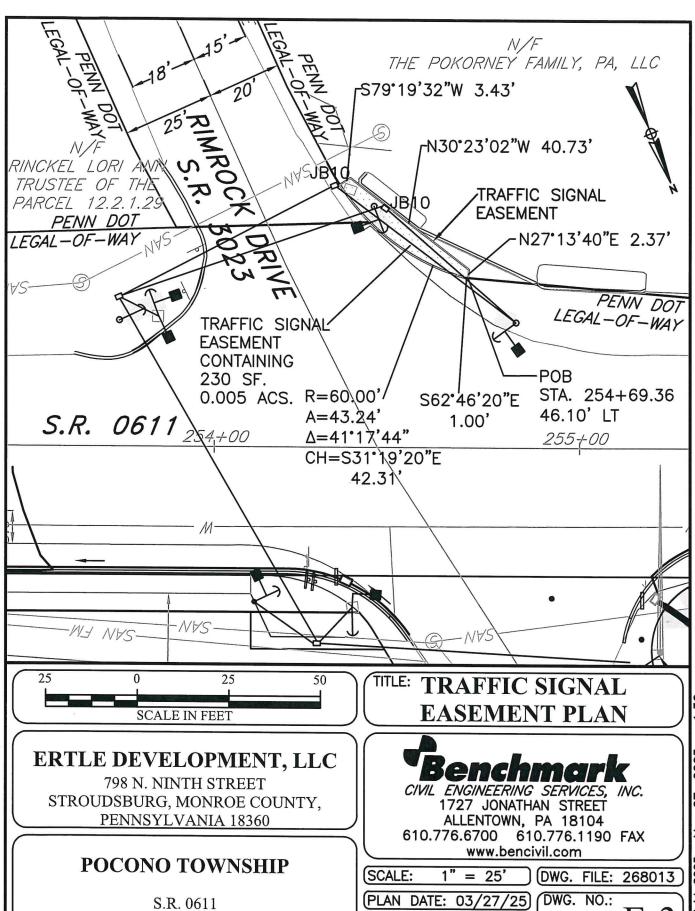

#### **GENERAL**

ENCORE shall not be liable for any damage or loss sustained by CUSTOMER as a result of ENCORE's failure to perform any obligation under this AGREEMENT, including delay in performing inspections or installation of equipment, equipment failure or for interruption of service, due to electric failure, labor disputes, walk-outs, war, pandemics, acts of God, or other causes.

#### REPORTS

The inspection and/or test of CUSTOMER'S FIRE SYSTEM(S) shall be completed on ENCORE's then current Report form which shall be given to the CUSTOMER, with a copy, if required, to the authority having jurisdiction. The Report and recommendations by ENCORE are only advisory in nature and are intended to assist CUSTOMER in reducing the possibility of loss to property by indicating obvious defects or impairments noted to the FIRE SYSTEM(S) which require prompt consideration. They are not intended to imply that all other defects or hazards have been identified or that no others exist, or that all aspects of the FIRE SYSTEM(S) and equipment are in operating condition at the time of inspection. Final responsibility for the condition and operation of the FIRE SYSTEM(S) lies with the CUSTOMER.

## ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT

In the event additional equipment is installed after the date of completion of the Agreement, the annual inspection charge shall be adjusted in accordance with ENCORE's prevailing rates as of the first inspection of such additional equipment.

#### WATER SUPPLY

ENCORE shall not be liable or responsible for the adequacy or condition of the water supply post inspection.

## **GOVERNING LAW AND JURISDICTION**

This AGREEMENT will be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the internal laws of the state or commonwealth in which ENCORE is providing the work under this AGREEMENT (the "STATE"). The parties also agree to submit all disputes arising under this AGREEMENT to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the STATE.

### **ASSIGNMENT**

This Agreement and any terms hereof are not assignable by CUSTOMER without the written consent of ENCORE. ENCORE may assign this Agreement or any terms hereof without CUSTOMER consent.

### WORK NOT INCLUDED

Certain additional services may be required by Authorities Having Jurisdiction ("AHJ"").AHJ or internal organizational requirements may be more restrictive than NFPA and/or state and local requirements. It is the CUSTOMER's responsibility to make themselves aware of applicable codes and references in order to ensure that contracted services are in compliance with these additional requirements.

Additionally, the testing and inspection provided under this AGREEMENT does not include:

- 1. Testing or inspection of any equipment on a city right of way
- 2. Testing or inspection of any device(s) in a concealed space or any area not accessible to ENCORE during any inspection
- 3. Number of devices in excess of device counts provided by CUSTOMER. Devices not reflected in documentation provided are subject to incremental billing based on time needed to access and test them
- 4. Testing or inspection of any device(s) located in areas that meet confined space requirements as defined by OSHA
- 5. Fire Alarm disconnect/reconnect fees
- 6. Fire watch or watch fees from the fire department if required

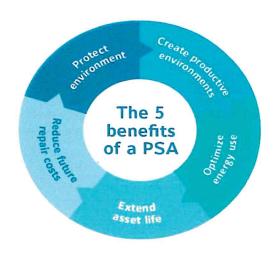

# **Special Additions and Exceptions**

# TERMS AND CONDITIONS DEFINITIONS (REV 1/25)

DIGITAL ENABLED SERVICES mean services provided hereunder that employ JCI software and related equipment installed at Purchaser facilities and JCI cloud-hosted software offerings and tools to improve, develop, and enable such services. Digital Enabled Service may include, but are not limited to, (a) remote servicing and inspection, (b) advanced equipment fault detection and diagnostics, and (c) data dashboarding and health reporting.

CONTRACT PRICE means the price that Customer shall pay to JCI for the Services.

**COVERED EQUIPMENT** means the equipment for which Services are to be provided under this Agreement. Covered Equipment is set forth in Schedule A - Equipment List.

**EQUIPMENT FAILURE** means the failure, under normal and expected working conditions, of moving parts or electric or electronic components of the Covered Equipment that are necessary for its operation.

PREMISES means those Customer premises where the Covered Equipment is located or Services performed pursuant to this Agreement.

**REMOTE MONITORING SERVICES** means remote monitoring of Covered Equipment and/or systems including building automation, HVAC equipment, and fire alarm, intrusion, and/or other life safety systems for alarm and event notifications using a UL Certified Central Station.

REMOTE OPERATIONS CENTER (ROC) is the department at JCI that remotely monitors alarm and industrial (HVAC) process signals.

REMOTE OPERATING SERVICES means remote interrogation, modification and/or operation of building automation, HVAC equipment, and/or other Covered Equipment.

**REPAIR LABOR** is the labor necessary to restore Covered Equipment to working condition following an Equipment Failure, but does not include services relating to total equipment replacement due to obsolescence or unavailability of parts.

**REPAIR MATERIALS** are the parts and materials necessary to restore Covered Equipment to working condition following an Equipment Failure, but excludes total equipment replacement due to obsolescence or unavailability of parts, unless excluded from the Agreement. At JCI's option, Repair Materials may be new, used, or reconditioned.

SCHEDULED SERVICE MATERIALS are the materials required to perform Scheduled Service Visits on Covered Equipment, unless excluded from the Agreement.

SCHEDULED SERVICE VISITS are the on-site labor visits required to perform JCI recommended inspections and preventive maintenance on Covered Equipment.

**SERVICES** are the work, materials, labor, service visits, and repairs to be provided by JCI pursuant to this Agreement except that the Services do not include the Connected Equipment Services or the provision of other software products or digital or cloud services, which are provided under separate terms and conditions referenced in Section P.

### A. JCI'S SERVICES FOR COVERED EQUIPMENT

- 1. BASIC COVERAGE means Scheduled Service Visits, plus Scheduled Service Materials (unless excluded from this Agreement). No parts, equipment, Repair Labor or Repair Materials are provided for under BASIC COVERAGE.
- 2. PREMIUM COVERAGE means BASIC COVERAGE plus Repair Labor, plus Repair Materials (unless excluded from the Agreement). If Customer has ordered PREMIUM COVERAGE, JCI will inspect the Covered Equipment within forty-five (45) days of the date of this Agreement, or as seasonal or operational conditions permit. JCI will then advise Customer if JCI finds any Covered Equipment not in working order or in need of repair. With Customer's approval, JCI will perform the work necessary to put the Covered Equipment in proper working condition, subject to the terms of this Agreement. Customer will pay for such work at JCI's standard rates for parts and labor in effect at the time that the work is performed. If Customer does not want JCI to perform the work identified as necessary by JCI, any equipment thereby affected will be removed from the list of Covered Equipment, and the Contract Price will be adjusted accordingly. Should Customer not make JCI's recommended repairs or proceed with the modified PREMIUM COVERAGE, JCI reserves the right to invoice Customer for the cost of the initial equipment inspection.
- 3. EXTENDED SERVICE means Services performed outside JCI's normal business hours and is available only if Customer has PREMIUM COVERAGE. Extended Service is available either 24/5 or 24/7, at Customer's election. The price for Extended Service, if chosen by Customer, is part of the total Contract Price.
- 4. REMOTE MONITORING SERVICES OR REMOTE OPERATING SERVICES. If Remote Monitoring Services or Remote Operating Services are provided, Customer agrees to furnish JCI with a list of the names, titles, addresses, email addresses, and phone numbers of all persons authorized to be contacted by, or be able to contact the ROC to perform specific agreed upon actions with the appropriate authority. If JCI's Services include "Remote Monitoring Services with Open and Close," Customer also agrees to furnish JCI with Customer's daily and holiday opening and closing schedules. Customer agrees to maintain and update the call lists with accurate information. Customer further agrees to notify JCI of such changes as soon as possible. JCI/ROC is not responsible to find new contacts/numbers if the contacts on the call lists cannot



be reached. A maximum of three contacts are allowed for any time of the day. If none of those contacts can be reached, then neither JCI nor the ROC are responsible for damages. Customer is responsible for any and all costs and expenses arising from Customer's failure to provide timely updates for any of the contact information submitted to the ROC.

5. CUSTOMER SERVICE INFORMATION PORTAL. Customer may be able to utilize JCI's Customer Service Information Portal during the term of the Agreement, pursuant to the then applicable Terms of Use Agreement.

#### B. OUT OF SCOPE SERVICES

If, during any Service Visit, JCI detects a defect in any of Customer's equipment that is not Covered Equipment under this Agreement (an "Out of Scope Defect"), JCI may (but shall have no obligation to) notify Customer of such Out of Scope Defect. If Customer elects for JCI to repair such Out of Scope Defect, or if JCI otherwise performs any Services or provides any materials, parts, or equipment outside the scope of the Services (collectively, "Out of Scope Services"), Customer shall direct JCI to perform such Out of Scope Services in writing, and Customer shall pay for such Out of Scope Services at JCI's standard fees or hourly rates. If, after receiving notice of an Out of Scope Defect, Customer elects not to engage JCI to repair such Out of Scope Defect, Customer shall defend and indemnify JCI from and against any and all losses, damages, claims, costs and expenses arising directly or indirectly out of such Out of Scope Defect. Any Out of Scope Services performed by JCI at the direction of Customer pursuant to this Section shall be subject to the Customer Terms in effect as of the Effective Date (the "Customer Terms"), which Customer Terms are incorporated into this Agreement by this reference. A copy of the Customer Terms currently in effect is found at <a href="https://www.johnsoncontrols.com/customerterms">www.johnsoncontrols.com/customerterms</a>.

#### C. EXCLUSIONS

JCI's Services and warranty obligations expressly exclude:

- (a) the repair or replacement of ductwork, casings, cabinets, structural supports, tower fill/slats/basin, hydronic and pneumatic piping, and vessels, gaskets, and piping not normally replaced or maintained on a scheduled basis, and removal of oil from pneumatic piping;
- (b) disposal of hazardous wastes (except as otherwise expressly provided herein);
- (c) disinfecting of chiller condenser water systems and other components for biohazards, such as but not limited to, Legionella unless explicitly set forth in the scope of services between the parties. Unless explicitly provide for within the scope of services, this is Out of Scope Services and the Customer's exclusive responsibility to make arrangements for such services with a provider other than JCI. Mentions of chiller tube cleaning, condenser cleaning, cooling tower cleaning or boiler tube cleaning in any scope of services, only involve work to remove normal buildup of debris and scale using tube brush cleaning, pressure washing or acid flushing. Reference to such cleaning does not include chemical cleaning, disinfection or chemical water treatment required to eliminate, control or disinfect against biohazards such as but not limited to Legionella;
- (d) refrigerant; supplies, accessories, or any items normally consumed during the use of Covered Equipment, such as ribbons, bulbs and paper;
- (e) the furnishing of materials and supplies for painting or refinishing equipment;
- (f) the repair or replacement of wire in conduit, buried cable/transmission lines, or the like, if not normally replaced or maintained on a scheduled basis:
- (g) replacement of obsolete parts; and
- (h) damages of any kind, including but not limited to personal injury, death, property damage, and the costs of repairs or service resulting from:
  - abuse, misuse, alterations, adjustments, attachments, combinations, modifications, or repairs to Covered Equipment not performed, provided, or approved in writing by JCI;
  - equipment not covered by this Agreement or attachments made to Covered Equipment;
  - acts or omissions of the Customer, including but not limited to the failure of the Customer to fulfill the Customer Obligations and
    Commitments to JCI as described in Section F of this Agreement, operator error, Customer's failure to conduct preventive
    maintenance, issues resulting from Customer's previous denial of JCI access to the Covered Equipment, and Customer's failure to
    keep the site clean and free of dust, sand, or other particles or debris, unless such conditions are previously expressly acknowledged
    by JCI in writing;
  - use of the Covered Equipment in a manner or environment, or for any purpose, for which it was not designed by the manufacturer;
  - site-related and environmental conditions, including but not limited to power failures and fluctuations in electrical current (or "power surges") and biohazards such as but not limited to Legionella associated with condenser water, cooling tower systems and subcomponent systems;
  - the effects of erosion, corrosion, acid cleaning, or damage from unexpected or especially severe freezing weather;
  - issues or failures not specifically covered by this Agreement; or
  - occurrences beyond JCI's reasonable control and without JCI's fault or negligence.

### D. PAYMENT TERMS; PRICE ADJUSTMENTS

Unless otherwise agreed by the parties in writing, fees for Services to be performed shall be paid annually in advance. Fees and other amounts due hereunder are due thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice, which shall be paid by Customer via electronic delivery via EFT/ACH. Such payment is a condition precedent to JCI's obligation to perform Services under the Agreement. Any invoice disputes are waived unless identified in writing by Customer within 21 days of the date of invoice. Payments of any disputed amounts are due and payable upon resolution. Customer acknowledges and agrees that timely payments of the full amounts listed on invoices is an essential term of this Agreement and that failure by Customer to make payment in full when due is a material breach of this Agreement. Work performed on a time and material basis shall be at the



then-prevailing JCI rate for material, labor, and related items, in effect at the time supplied under this Agreement. Customer shall provide financial information requested by JCI to verify Customer's ability to pay for goods or Services. If Customer fails to provide financial information or if JCI, in its sole discretion determines that reasonable grounds exist to question Customer's ability or willingness to make payments when due (e.g., not making payments when due, late payments, or a reduction in Customer's credit score), JCI may defer shipments, change payment terms, require cash in advance and/or require other security, without liability and without waiving any other remedies JCI may have against Customer. JCI shall provide Customer with advance written notice of changes to payment terms. Customer further acknowledges that if there is any amount outstanding on an invoice, it is material to company and will give JCI, without prejudice to any other right or remedy, the right to, without notice: (i) suspend, discontinue or terminate performing any services and/or withhold further deliveries of equipment and other materials, terminate or suspend any unpaid software licenses, and/or suspend JCl's obligations under or terminate this Agreement; (ii) charge Customer interest on the amounts unpaid at a rate equal to the lesser of one and one half (1.5) percent per month or the maximum rate permitted under applicable law, until payment is made in full; and (iii) pay all of JCl's costs of collection, including (1) actual out of pocket expenses and charge Customer actual costs, plus a collection fee of twenty-five percent (25%) of the past due amount if collected through a collection agency or attorney and thirty-five percent (35%) if litigation is commenced to collect such past due amount. JCl's election to continue providing future services does not, in any way diminish JCl's right to terminate or suspend services or exercise any or all rights or remedies under this Agreement. JCl shall not be liable for any damages, claims, expenses, or liabilities arising from or relating to suspension of services for non-payment. In the event that there are exigent circumstances requiring services or the JCI otherwise performs services at the premises following suspension, those services shall be governed by the terms of this Agreement unless a separate contract is executed. If Customer disputes any late payment notice or JCI's efforts to collect payment. Customer shall immediately notify JCI in writing and explain the basis of the dispute. Customer will pay all of JCI's reasonable collection costs (including legal fees and expenses). In the event of Customer's default, the balance of any outstanding amounts will be immediately due and

This Agreement is entered into with the understanding that the Services to be provided by JCI are not subject to any local, state, or federal prevailing wage statute. If it is later determined that local, state, or federal prevailing wage rates apply to the Services to be provided by JCI, JCI reserves the right to issue a modification or change order to adjust the wage rates to the required prevailing wage rate. Customer agrees to pay for the applicable prevailing wage rates. JCI may increase prices upon notice to the Customer to reflect increases in material and labor costs. Prices do not include taxes, fees, duties, tariffs, false alarm assessments, permits and levies or other charges imposed and/or enacted by a government, however designated or imposed (collectively, "Taxes"). All Taxes are the responsibility of Customer, unless Customer presents an exemption certificate acceptable to JCI and the applicable taxing authorities. If JCI is required to pay any such Taxes or other charges, Customer shall reimburse JCI on demand. If any such exemption certificate is invalid, then Customer will immediately pay JCI the amount of the Taxes, plus penalties and interest. Prices may be adjusted by JCI prior to shipment to take into account increases in the cost of raw materials, component parts, third party products or labor rates or taxes; Trade Restrictions (as defined below); government actions; or to cover any unforeseen or other extra cost elements. "Trade Restrictions" means any additional or new tariff/duty, quota, tariff-rate quota, or cost associated with the withdrawal of tariff/duty concessions pursuant to a trade agreement(s).

If this Agreement is renewed, JCI will provide Customer with notice of any adjustments in the Contract Price applicable to any Renewal Term. Unless Customer terminates this Agreement in writing at least sixty (60) days prior to the start of the Renewal Term, the adjusted Contract Price shall be the price for the Renewal Term. Prices for products covered by this Agreement may be adjusted by JCI, upon notice to Customer at any time prior to shipment and regardless of Customer's acceptance of the JCI's proposal or quotation, to reflect any increase in JCI's cost of raw materials (e.g., steel, aluminum) inability to secure Products, changes or increases in law, labor, taxes, duties, tariffs or quotas, acts of government, any similar charges, or to cover any extra, unforeseen and unusual cost elements. If the actual number of devices installed or services to be performed is greater than that set forth in this Agreement, the price will be increased accordingly. If this Agreement extends beyond one year, Johnson Controls may increase prices upon notice to the Customer.

#### E. WARRANTIES

JCI warrants its Services will be provided in a good and workmanlike manner for 90 days from the date of Services. If JCI receives written notice of a breach of this warranty prior to the end of this warranty period, JCI will re-perform any non-conforming Services at no additional charge within a commercially reasonable time of the notification.

If JCI installs or furnishes a piece of equipment under this Agreement, JCI warrants that equipment labeled JCI shall be free from defects in material and workmanship arising from normal usage for a period of 90 days. No warranty is provided for third-party products and equipment installed or furnished by JCI. Such products and equipment are provided with the third-party manufacturer's warranty to the extent available, and JCI will transfer the benefits, together with all limitations, of that manufacturer's warranty to Customer. All transportation charges incurred in connection with the warranty for equipment and/or materials not covered under this Agreement shall be borne by Customer. Except as provided herein, if JCI receives written notice of a breach of this warranty prior to the end of this warranty period, JCI will repair or replace (at JCI's option) the defective equipment. These warranties do not extend to any Services or equipment that have been misused, altered, or repaired by Customer or third parties without the supervision of and prior written approval of JCI, or if JCI serial numbers or warranty decals have been removed or altered. All replaced parts or equipment shall become JCl's property. This warranty is not assignable. Warranty service will be provided during normal business hours, excluding holidays. The remedies set forth herein shall be Customer's sole and exclusive remedy with regards to any warranty claim under this Agreement. Any lawsuit based upon the warranty must be brought no later than one (1) year after the expiration of the applicable warranty period. This limitation is in lieu of any other applicable statute of limitations. CUSTOMER FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT THESE WARRANTIES ARE JCI'S SOLE WARRANTIES AND TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED UNDER APPLICABLE LAW ARE IN LIEU OF ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THOSE OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. JCI makes no and specifically disclaims all representations or warranties that the services, products, software or third party product or software will be secure from cyber threats, hacking or other similar malicious activity, or will detect the presence of, or eliminate, prevent, treat, or mitigate the spread, transmission, or outbreak of any pathogen, disease, virus or other contagion, including but not limited to COVID 19.

### F. CUSTOMER OBLIGATIONS AND COMMITMENTS TO JCI

- 1. Customer warrants it has given JCI all information concerning the condition of the Covered Equipment. The Customer agrees and warrants that, during the Term of this Agreement, Customer will:
- (1) operate the Covered Equipment according to the manufacturer's and/or JCI's recommendations;



- (2) keep accurate and current work logs and information about the Covered Equipment as recommended by the manufacturer and/or JCI;
- (3) provide an adequate environment for Covered Equipment as recommended by the manufacturer and/or JCI, including, but not limited to adequate space, electrical power, water supply, air conditioning, and humidity control;
- (4) notify JCI immediately of any Covered Equipment malfunction, breakdown, or other condition affecting the operation of the Covered Equipment;
- (5) provide JCI with safe access to its Premises and Covered Equipment at all reasonable and necessary times for the performance of the Services:
- (6) allow JCI to start and stop, periodically turn off, or otherwise change or temporarily suspend equipment operations so that JCI can perform the Services required under this Agreement;
- (7) as applicable, provide proper condenser, cooling tower and boiler water treatment for the proper functioning of Covered Equipment and protect against any environmental issues and instances of biohazards such as but not limited to Legionella;
- (8) carefully and properly set and test the intrusion alarm system each night or at such other time as Customer shall close the Premises:
- (9) obtain all necessary licenses and permits required for and pay all taxes associated with the Services;
- (10) notify JCI immediately of any claimed inadequacy in, or failure of, the Covered Equipment or other condition affecting the operation of the Covered Equipment;
- (11) furnish any necessary 110 volt A/C power and electrical outlets at its expense;
- (12) properly maintain, repair, service, and assure the proper operation of any other property, system, equipment, or device of Customer or others to which the Covered Equipment may be attached or connected, in accordance with manufacturer recommendations, insurance carrier requirements, or the requirements of any fire rating bureau, agency, or other authorities having jurisdiction thereof;
- (13) not tamper with, alter, adjust, disturb, injure, remove, or otherwise interfere with any Covered Equipment (including any related software) and not permit the same to be done;
- (14) refrain from causing false alarms, and reimburse JCI for any fine, penalty, or fee paid by or assessed against JCI by any governmental or municipal agency as a result thereof;
- (15) be solely responsible for the establishment, operation, maintenance, access, security and other aspects of its computer network ("Network") and shall supply JCI secure Network access for providing its services. Products networked, connected to the internet, or otherwise connected to computers or other devices must be appropriately protected by Customer and/or end user against unauthorized access; and
- (16) take appropriate measures, including performing back-ups, to protect information, including without limit data, software, or files (collectively "Data") prior to receiving the service or products.
- 2. Customer acknowledges and understands that unless water treatment for biohazards (such as Legionella) is explicitly included in the services JCI is providing, it is Customer's responsibility to provide such treatment. Customer also acknowledges that its failure to meet the above obligations will relieve JCI of any responsibility for any Covered Equipment breakdown, or any necessary repair or replacement of any Covered Equipment. If Customer breaches any of these obligations, JCI shall have the right, upon written notice to Customer, to suspend its Services until Customer cures such breach. In addition, Customer shall be responsible for paying or reimbursing JCI for any costs associated with corrective work required as a result of Customer's breach of these obligations.

#### G. INSURANCE

Customer is responsible for obtaining all insurance coverage that Customer believes is necessary to protect Customer, Customer's property, and persons in or on the Premises, including coverage for personal injury and property damage. THE PAYMENTS CUSTOMER MAKES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT ARE NOT RELATED TO THE VALUE OF THE PREMISES, CUSTOMER'S PROPERTY OR POSSESSIONS, OR THE PERSONS OCCUPYING OR AT ANY TIME PRESENT IN OR ON THE PREMISES, BUT RATHER ARE BASED ON THE COST OF THE SYSTEM AND THE SERVICES, AND TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION THE PROTECTION AFFORDED TO JCI UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. Customer hereby releases JCI from any liability for any event or condition customarily covered by commercial liability insurance. Customer understands that neither the Services nor the Covered Equipment are designed to reduce, but not eliminate, certain risks. JCI does not guaranty that neither the Services nor Covered Equipment will prevent personal injury, unauthorized entrances or fire and smoke damage to the Premises. Customer further agrees that Customer has read and understands the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

### H. INDEMNITY

JCI and Customer shall each indemnify the other party and its officers, agents, directors, and employees, from any and all damages, losses, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of third party claims, demands, or suits for bodily injury (including death) or damage to tangible property to the extent arising out of the negligence or intentional misconduct of the indemnifying party or its employees or agents. Customer expressly agrees that JCI shall be responsible for injury, damage, or loss only to the extent caused directly by JCI's negligence or intentional misconduct. The obligations of JCI and Customer under this section are further subject to sections I and K below.

#### I. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, IN NO EVENT SHALL JCI AND ITS AFFILIATES AND THEIR RESPECTIVE PERSONNEL, SUPPLIERS AND VENDORS ("JCI PARTIES") BE LIABLE TO YOU OR ANY THIRD PARTY UNDER ANY CAUSE OF ACTION OR THEORY OF LIABILITY EVEN IF ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES, FOR ANY: (1) SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, PUNITIVE, OR INDIRECT DAMAGES; (2) LOST PROFITS, REVENUES, DATA, CUSTOMER OPPORTUNITIES, BUSINESS, ANTICIPATED SAVINGS, OR GOODWILL; (3) BUSINESS INTERRUPTION; OR (4) DATA LOSS OR OTHER LOSSES ARISING FROM VIRUSES, RANSOMWARE, CYBER ATTACKS OR FAILURES OR INTERRUPTIONS TO NETWORK SYSTEMS. IN ANY CASE, THE ENTIRE AGGREGATE LIABILITY OF THE JCI PARTIES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT FOR ALL DAMAGES, LOSSES, AND CAUSES OF ACTION, WHETHER IN CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE), OR OTHERWISE SHALL BE LIMITED TO \$250,000. CUSTOMER UNDERSTANDS THAT JCI IS NOT AN INSURER REGARDING THE WORK OR THE SERVICES. JCI SHALL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGE OR LOSS THAT MAY RESULT FROM FIRE SAFETY OR SECURITY EQUIPMENT THAT FAILS TO PERFORM PROPERLY OR FAILS TO PREVENT A CASUALTY OR LOSS.



#### J. FORCE MAJEURE

JCI shall not be liable, nor in breach or default of its obligations under this Agreement, for delays, interruption, failure to render services, or any other failure by JCI to perform an obligation under this Agreement, where such delay, interruption or failure is caused, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, by a Force Majeure Event. A "Force Majeure Event" is a condition or event that is beyond the reasonable control of JCI, whether foreseeable or unforeseeable, including, without limitation, acts of God, severe weather (including but not limited to hurricanes, tornados, severe snowstorms or severe rainstorms), wildfires, floods, earthquakes, seismic disturbances, or other natural disasters, acts or omissions of any governmental authority (including change of any applicable law or regulation), epidemics, pandemics, disease, viruses, quarantines, or other public health risks and/or responses thereto, condemnation, strikes, lock-outs, labor disputes, an increase of 5% or more in tariffs or other excise taxes for materials to be used on the project, fires, explosions or other casualties, thefts, vandalism, civil disturbances, insurrection, mob violence, riots, war or other armed conflict (or the serious threat of same), acts of terrorism, electrical power outages, interruptions or degradations in telecommunications, computer, network, or electronic communications systems, data breach, cyber-attacks, ransomware, unavailability or shortage of parts, materials, supplies, or transportation, or any other cause or casualty beyond the reasonable control of JCI. If JCI's performance of the work is delayed, impacted, or prevented by a Force Majeure Event or its continued effects, JCI shall be excused from performance under the Agreement. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, if JCI is delayed in achieving one or more of the scheduled milestones set forth in the Agreement due to a Force Majeure Event, JCI will be entitled to extend the relevant completion date by the amount of time that JCI was delayed as a result of the Force Majeure Event, plus such additional time as may be reasonably necessary to overcome the effect of the delay. To the extent that the Force Majeure Event directly or indirectly increases JCI's cost to perform the services, Customer is obligated to reimburse JCI for such increased costs, including, without limitation, costs incurred by JCI for additional labor, inventory storage, expedited shipping fees, trailer and equipment rental fees, subcontractor fees, compliance with vaccination requirements or other costs and expenses incurred by JCI in connection with the Force Majeure Event.

### K. ONE-YEAR CLAIMS LIMITATION; FORUM; CHOICE OF LAW

JCI shall have the sole and exclusive right to determine whether any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of or relating to the Agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be submitted to a court of law or arbitrated. The laws of Delaware shall govern the validity, enforceability, and interpretation of this Agreement, without regard to conflicts of law principles thereof, and the exclusive venue for any such litigation or arbitration shall be in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The parties waive any objection to the exclusive jurisdiction of the specified forums, including any objection based on forum non conveniens. In the event the matter is submitted to a court, JCI and Customer hereby agree to waive their right to trial by jury. In the event the matter is submitted to arbitration by JCI, the costs of arbitration shall be borne equally by the parties, and the arbitrator's award may be confirmed and reduced to judgment in any court of competent jurisdiction. If Company prevails in any collection action, Customer will pay all of JCI's reasonable collection costs (including legal fees and expenses). Except as provided below, no claim or cause of action, whether known or unknown, shall be brought by either party against the other more than one year after the claim first arose. Claims not subject to the one-year limitation include claims for unpaid: (1) contract amounts, (2) change order amounts (approved or requested) and (3) delays and/or work inefficiencies.

#### L. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 1. The Initial Term of this Agreement shall commence on the date of this Agreement and continue as set forth herein. The Initial Term of this Agreement is three (3) years. After the Initial Term, this Agreement shall automatically extend for successive terms equal to the same length as the Initial Term unless the Customer or JCI gives written notice to the other that it does not want to renew at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the then-current term (each a "Renewal Term"). The Initial Term and any Renewal Term may be referred to herein as the "Term." Customer agrees to issue and send a Purchase Order to JCI at least thirty (30) days prior to expiration of the Original Term or any Renewal Term if necessary for payments to be processed, but failure to do so is not a pre-condition to Renewal Term payments being due to JCI. No Purchase Order is required for any emergency work requested by Customer. Customer shall have no right to reject such invoices due to the lack of a Purchase Order.
- 2. Remote Monitoring Services and Remote Operating Services may be immediately canceled by either party if JCl's Remote Operations Center, connecting wires, or monitoring systems are destroyed by fire or other catastrophe, or where the Premises are so substantially damaged that it is impractical to continue Services.
- 3. If either party fails to perform any of its material obligations under this Agreement, the other party shall provide written notice thereof to the party alleged to be in default. Should the party alleged to be in default fail to respond in writing or take action to cure the alleged default within ten (10) days of receiving such written notice, the notifying party may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice of such termination.
- 4. If JCI's performance of its obligations becomes impracticable due to obsolescence or unavailability of systems, equipment, or products (including component parts and/or materials) or because the JCI or its supplier(s) has discontinued the manufacture or the sale of the equipment and/or products or is no longer is in the business of providing the Services, JCI may terminate this Agreement, or the affected portions, at its sole discretion upon notice to Customer.
- 5. JCI may terminate this Agreement and discontinue any Services if JCI is unable to obtain or continue to support technologies, or for convenience upon forty-five (45) days written notice. JCI will not be liable for any damages or subject to any penalty as a result of any such termination.
- 6. JCI may terminate this Agreement, or the affected portions, at its sole discretion upon notice to the Customer if JCI's performance of its obligations are prohibited because of changes in applicable laws, regulations or codes.
- 7. In the event JCI is unable, after reasonable commercial efforts, to acquire and provide steel products, or products made from plastics or



other commodities, if required to perform work required by this Agreement, Customer hereby agrees that JCI may terminate the Agreement, or the relevant portion of the Agreement, at no additional cost and without penalty.

- 8. JCI may terminate this Agreement and discontinue any Service(s), if JCI's central monitoring center ("CMC") or remote operations center or either of their respective systems is substantially damaged by fire or catastrophe or if JCI is unable to obtain any connections or privileges required to transmit signals between the Customer's premises, JCI's CMC or the Municipal Fire or Police Department or other first responder. If Customer fails to maintain any required licenses or permits, JCI shall not be responsible for performing the services and may terminate the services without notice to Customer. JCI may terminate the services immediately upon notice to the Customer if JCI, in its sole discretion, determines that the Customer's premises are unsafe to be accessed by JCI's employees or subcontractors. JCI may terminate the services upon notice to the Customer, if Customer does not follow JCI's recommendations for updates and upgrades to the equipment and systems.
- 9. Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, Customer shall pay to JCI all undisputed amounts owed through the date of termination within thirty (30) days of such termination. For termination prior to the end of the Term, Customer agrees to pay JCI, in addition to any outstanding fees and charges for service(s) rendered prior to termination, 50% of the charges for services remaining to be paid for the unexpired term of the Agreement as liquidated damages but not as a penalty. Customer shall provide JCI with reasonable access to the premises to remove any JCI property and to un-program any controls, intrusion, fire, or life safety system, as applicable.. Customer shall be liable for all fees, costs, and expenses that JCI may incur in connection with the enforcement of this Agreement, including without limitation, reasonable attorney fees, collection agency fees, and court costs.

### M. ASBESTOS, MOLD, BIOAHAZARDS, AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

"Hazardous Materials" means any material or substance that, whether by its nature or use, is now or hereafter defined or regulated as a hazardous waste, hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant under any local, state, or federal law, regulation, or ordinance relating to or addressing public and employee health and safety and protection of the environment, or which is toxic, explosive, corrosive, flammable, radioactive, carcinogenic or otherwise hazardous or which is or contains petroleum, gasoline, diesel, fuel, another petroleum hydrocarbon product or polychlorinated biphenyls. "Hazardous Materials" specifically includes mold, lead-based paints, biohazards such as but not limited to Legionella and asbestos-containing materials ("ACM"). Neither Customer nor JCI desires to or is licensed to undertake direct obligations relating to the identification, abatement, cleanup, control, removal or disposal of ACM.

JCI will be responsible for removing or disposing of any Hazardous Materials that it uses in providing the Services ("JCI Hazardous Materials") and for the remediation of any areas affected by the release of JCI Hazardous Materials. For other Hazardous Materials that may be present at its facilities ("Non-JCI Hazardous Materials"), Customer shall supply JCI with any information in its possession relating to the presence of Hazardous Materials if their presence may affect JCI's performance of the Services. If either Customer or JCI becomes aware of or suspects the presence of Non-JCI Hazardous Materials that may interfere with JCI's Services, it shall immediately stop the Services in the affected area and notify the other party. As between Customer and JCI, Customer shall be responsible at its sole expense for removing and disposing of Non-JCI Hazardous Materials from its facilities and for the remediation of any areas impacted by the release of the Non-JCI Hazardous Materials and must provide a certificate of abatement before JCI will be obligated to perform or continue its Services, unless JCI had actual knowledge that Non-JCI Hazardous Materials were present and acted in disregard of that knowledge, in which case (i) JCI shalls be responsible at its sole expense for the remediation of any areas impacted by its release of such Hazardous Materials, and (ii) Customer shall remain responsible at its sole expense for the removal of Hazardous Materials that have not been released and for releases not resulting from JCI's performance of the Services. Customer shall defend and indemnify JCI against any losses, costs, damages, expenses, and claims arising out of its failure to comply with this Section M.

#### N. CUSTOMER DATA

Customer data obtained from the Services is owned by and shall belong to Customer. JCI will access and use Customer data to provide Services to Customer. Except as set forth herein, JCI will not disclose to any third party any individual Customer data acquired through performance of the Services without Customer's consent. Customer agrees that JCI and its subsidiaries, affiliates and approved third party contractors and developers may collect and use Customer data for any reason, as long as any external use of the data is on a de-identified basis that does not personally identify Customer or any individual. Customer hereby grants JCI a perpetual, worldwide, irrevocable, royalty free license to use, modify, manipulate, sublicense, and create derivative works from such data. JCI shall retain all rights to any intellectual property, data, materials and products created as a result of its performance of Services.

### O. JCI'S INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

JCI shall retain all right, title and interest in any (a) work provided to Customer, including without limitation, all software source and object code, documentation, technical information or data, specifications and designs and any changes, improvements or modifications thereto ("Deliverables"), and (b) Know-How (defined below) employed by JCI in the creation of the Deliverables or performance of the Services, whether known to JCI prior to, or developed or discovered or acquired in connection with, the performance of its obligations under this agreement. Ownership of all Deliverables and Know-How shall vest solely in JCI and no Deliverables shall be deemed "works made for hire." Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, ownership of all source files used in the course of performing the Services shall remain the exclusive property of JCI. For purposes of this Agreement, "Know-How" means any know-how, processes, techniques, concepts, methodologies, tools, analytical approaches, database models and designs, discoveries, and ideas furnished, produced by, developed, or used by JCI in the creation or provision of the Deliverables or in the performance of the Services, and any changes, improvements, or modifications thereto or derivatives thereof.

#### P. DIGITAL ENABLED SERVICES

Digital Enabled Services; Data. If JCI provides Digital Enabled Services under this Agreement, these Digital Enabled Services require the collection, transfer and ingestion of building, equipment, system time series, and other data to JCI's cloud-hosted software applications. Customer consents to and grants JCI right to collect, ingest and use such data to enable JCI and its affiliates and agents to provide, maintain, protect, develop and improve the Digital Enabled Services and JCI products and services. Customer acknowledges that, while Digital Enabled Services generally improve equipment performance and services, Digital Enabled Services do not prevent all potential malfunction, insure against all loss, or guarantee a certain level of performance. Customer shall be solely responsible for the establishment, operation, maintenance, access, security and other



aspects of its computer network ("Network"), shall appropriately protect hardware and products connected to the Network and will supply JCI secure Network access for providing its Digital Enabled Services. If Customer accesses and uses Software that is used to provide the Digital Enabled Services, the Software Terms (defined below) will govern such access and use.

#### Q. JCI DIGITAL SOLUTIONS

JCI Digital Solutions. Use, implementation, and deployment of the software and hosted software products ("Software") offered under these terms shall be subject to, and governed by, JCI's standard terms for such Software and Software related professional services in effect from time to time at <a href="https://www.johnsoncontrols.com/techterms">www.johnsoncontrols.com/techterms</a> (collectively, the "Software Terms"). Specifically, the JCI General EULA set forth at <a href="https://www.johnsoncontrols.com/buildings/legal/digital/generaleula">www.johnsoncontrols.com/buildings/legal/digital/generaleula</a> governs access to and use of software installed on Customer's premises or systems and the JCI Terms of Service set forth at <a href="https://www.johnsoncontrols.com/buildings/legal/digital/generaltos">www.johnsoncontrols.com/buildings/legal/digital/generaltos</a> govern access to and use of hosted software products. The applicable Software Terms are incorporated herein by this reference. Other than the right to use the Software as set forth in the Software Terms, JCI and its licensors reserve all right, title, and interest (including all intellectual property rights) in and to the Software and improvements to the Software. The Software that is licensed hereunder is licensed subject to the Software Terms and not sold. If there is a conflict between the other terms herein and the Software Terms, the Software Terms shall take precedence and govern with respect to rights and responsibilities relating to the Software, its implementation and deployment and any improvements thereto

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Agreement, unless otherwise agreed, the following terms apply to Software that is provided to Customer on a subscription basis (i.e., a time limited license or use right), (each a "Software Subscription"): Each Software Subscription provided hereunder will commence on the date the initial credentials for the Software are made available (the "Subscription Start Date") and will continue in effect until the expiration of the subscription term noted in the applicable statement of work, order or other applicable ordering document. At the expiration of the Software Subscription, such Software Subscription will automatically renew for consecutive one (1) year terms (each a "Renewal Subscription Term"), unless either party provides the other party with a notice of non-renewal at least ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of the then-current term. To the extent permitted by applicable law, Software Subscriptions purchases are non-cancelable, and the sums paid nonrefundable. Fees for Software Subscriptions shall be paid annually in advance, invoiced on the Subscription Start Date and each subsequent anniversary thereof. Customer shall pay all invoiced amounts within thirty calendar days after the date of invoice. Payments not made within such time period shall be subject to late charges as set forth in the Software Terms. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties in writing, the subscription fee for each Renewal Subscription Term will be priced at JCl's then-applicable list price for that Software offering. Any use of Software that exceeds the scope, metrics or volume set forth in this Agreement and applicable SOW will be subject to additional fees based on the date such excess use began.

#### R. PRIVACY

- 1. JCl as Processor: Where JCl factually acts as Processor of Personal Data on behalf of Customer (as such terms are defined in the DPA) the terms at <a href="https://www.johnsoncontrols.com/dpa">www.johnsoncontrols.com/dpa</a> ("DPA") shall apply.
- 2. JCI as Controller: JCI will collect, process and transfer certain personal data of Customer and its personnel related to the business relationship between it and Customer (for example names, email addresses, telephone numbers) as controller and in accordance with JCI's Privacy Notice at <a href="https://www.johnsoncontrols.com/privacy">https://www.johnsoncontrols.com/privacy</a>. Customer acknowledges JCI's Privacy Notice and strictly to the extent consent is mandatorily required under applicable law, Customer consents to such collection, processing and transfer. To the extent consent to such collection, processing and transfer by JCI is mandatorily required from Customer's personnel under applicable law, Customer warrants and represents that it has obtained such consent.

### S. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 1. All notices required to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be considered properly given if: (a) delivered in person, (b) sent via the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, registered or certified with return receipt requested, (c) sent by overnight delivery service (e.g., FedEx, UPS), or (d) sent by facsimile, email or other electronic means and confirmed by facsimile, return email or telephone.
- 2. This Agreement is not assignable by the Customer except upon written consent of JCI first being obtained. JCI shall have the right to assign this Agreement, in whole or in part, or to subcontract any of its obligations under this Agreement without notice to Customer. This Agreement inures to the benefit of and is applicable to any assignees or subcontractors of JCI, and is binding upon Customer with respect to said assignees or subcontractors with the same force and effect as it binds Customer to JCI.
- 3. If any provision of this Agreement is found to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained herein shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.
- 4. This Agreement is the entire contract between JCI and Customer and supersedes any prior oral understandings, written agreements, proposals, or other communications between the parties.
- 5. Customer acknowledges and agrees that any purchase order issued by Customer in connection with this Agreement is intended only to establish payment authority for Customer's internal accounting purposes and shall not be considered to be a counteroffer, amendment, modification, or other revision to the terms of this Agreement. No term or condition included or referenced in Customer's purchase order will have any force or effect and these terms and conditions shall control. Customer's acceptance of any Services shall constitute an acceptance of these terms and conditions. Any proposal for additional or different terms, whether in Customer's purchase order or any other document, unless expressly accepted in writing by JCI, is hereby objected to and rejected.
- **6.** JCI supplies "commercial items" within the meaning of the Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR), 48 CFR Parts 1-53. As to any customer order for a U.S. Government contract, JCI will comply only with those mandatory flow-downs for commercial item and commercial services subcontracts listed either at FAR 52.244-6, or 52.212-5(e)(1), as applicable.



7. If there are any changes to Customer's facilities or operations, or to applicable regulations, laws, codes, taxes, or utility charges, that materially affect JCI's performance of the Services or its pricing thereof, JCI shall have the right to an equitable and appropriate adjustment to the scope, pricing, and other affected terms of this Agreement.

# ADDENDUM TO PSA TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR MONITORING OF INTRUSION, FIRE AND OTHER SAFETY SYSTEMS

If Remote Monitoring Services explicitly includes remote fire alarm monitoring, security alarm monitoring or video monitoring in the scope of work or customer charges, the Agreement is hereby modified and amended to include the terms and provisions of this Addendum to the PSA for Monitoring of Intrusion, Fire and Safety Systems (the "Addendum"). Capitalized terms that are not defined herein, shall have the meaning given to them in the Agreement. In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions of this Addendum and those appearing in the Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Addendum shall prevail.

- 1. Remote Monitoring of Alarm Signals. If JCI receives an emergency alarm signal at JCI's ROC, JCI shall endeavor to notify the appropriate police or fire department, or other emergency response agency having jurisdiction and JCI shall endeavor to notify Customer or its designated representative by email unless instructed to do otherwise by Customer in writing and/or based on standard operating procedures for the ROC. JCI, upon receipt of a non-emergency signal from the Premises, shall endeavor to notify Customer's representative pursuant to Customer's written instructions, defaulting to email or text notification. Customer acknowledges that if the signals transmitted from the Premises will be monitored in a monitoring facility not operated by JCI, the personnel in such monitoring facilities are not the agents of JCI, nor does JCI assume any responsibility for the manner in which such signals are monitored or the response to such signal.
- 2. Remote Monitoring Services Pricing. Remote Monitoring Services shall be provided by JCI if the Agreement includes a charge for such Service. If such Service is purchased, JCI will monitor the number of alarms for the Premises and the initial charge is based on the pricing agreed to by the parties, subject to the terms and conditions of this Addendum. If the number of alarms produced at the Premises goes beyond the contracted number of alarms in a month, Customer will be billed an overage fee.
- 3. Communications Media. Customer acknowledges that monitoring of Covered Equipment requires transmission of signals over standard telephone lines and/or the Internet and that these modes of transmission may be interrupted, circumvented, or compromised, in which case no signal can be transmitted from the Premises to the monitoring facility. Customer understands that to allow the monitoring facility to be aware of such a condition, additional or alternative protection can be installed, such as line security devices, at Customer's cost and expense and for transmission via telephone line only. Customer acknowledges it is aware that line security devices are available and, unless expressly identified in Schedule A Equipment List, has declined to purchase such devices. Customer further acknowledges that such additional protection is not available for Internet transmission under this Agreement.
- 4. False/Unnecessary Alarms; Service Calls. At JCI's option, an additional fee may be charged for any false alarm or unnecessary Service Visit caused or necessitated by Customer. In addition, Customer shall be fully responsible and liable for fines, penalties, assessments, taxes, fees or charges imposed by a governmental body, telephone, communication, or signal transmission company as the result of any false alarm and shall reimburse JCI for any costs incurred by JCI in connection therewith. Customer shall operate the system carefully so as to avoid causing false alarms. False alarms can be caused by severe weather or other forces beyond the control of JCI. If an undue number of false alarms are received by JCI, in addition to any other available remedies available to JCI, JCI may terminate this Agreement and discontinue any Service(s) and seek to recover damages. If an agent is dispatched, by a governmental authority or otherwise, to respond to a false alarm, where the Customer, or any other party has intentionally, accidentally or negligently activated the alarm signal, Customer shall be responsible for and pay any and all fees and/or fines assessed with respect to the false alarms and pay to JCI the additional charges and costs incurred by it from a false alarm. If the Customer's system has a local audible device, Customer authorizes JCI to enter the Premises to turn off the audible device if JCI is requested or ordered to do so by governmental authorities, neighbors or anyone else and Customer will pay JCI its standard service call charge for each such visit. Police agencies require repair of systems which cause false dispatches. Customer shall maintain the equipment necessary for JCI to supply the Services and Customer shall pay all costs for such maintenance. At least monthly, Customer will test the system's protective devices and send test signals to the ROC for all monitoring equipment in accordance with instructions from JCI or the ROC. Customer agrees to test the monitoring systems, including testing any ultrasonic, microwave, infrared, capacitance or other electronic equipment prior to the end of each month and will immediately report to JCI if the equipment fails to respond to the test. Customer shall make any necessary repairs as soon after receipt of notice as is reasonably practical. Customer shall at all times be solely responsible for maintaining any sprinkler system in good working order and provide adequate heat to the Premises.
- 5. Remote Monitoring of Video Monitoring Services. During the Term, JCI's sole and only obligation arising from the inclusion of Video Monitoring Services in any Service offering shall be to monitor the digital signals actually received by JCI at its ROC from means of the Video System and upon receipt of a digital signal indicating that an alarm condition exists, to endeavor, as permitted by law, to notify the police or other municipal authority deemed appropriate in JCI's absolute discretion and to such persons Customer has designated in writing to JCI to receive notification of such alarm condition as set forth herein. No alarm installation, repair, maintenance or guard responses will be provided under this Video Monitoring Services option. JCI may, without prior notice to Customer, in response to applicable law or insurance requirements, revise, replace, discontinue and/or rescind its response policies and procedures.
  - a. Inception and conclusion of service. Video Monitoring shall be provided by JCI if this Agreement includes a charge for Video Monitoring Services. If such Video Monitoring Service is purchased, Video Monitoring Services will begin when the Video System is installed and operational, and when the necessary communications connection is completed. No obligation for the provision of this Video Monitoring Service will commence until these requirements are met.
  - b. Customer Equipment. Customer shall obtain, at its own cost and expense: (a) the equipment necessary to connect to JCI's ROC; and (b) whatever permission, permits or licenses that may be necessary from all persons, governmental authorities, utility, and any other related service providers in connection with the Services. The video system to be used by the Customer is intended to produce and transmit video images (the "Video System Images") of the Premises to the ROC (the "Video System"). JCI makes no promise, warranty or representation that the video system will operate as intended. Customer further agrees that, notwithstanding any role or



participation by JCI in Video System and Video System Images, JCI shall have no responsibility or obligation with regard to Customer, the Video System or any other Customer equipment.

- c. System Location. The Video System related cameras shall be located and positioned by Customer along with attendant burglary digital alarm signal(s). Customer shall ensure that the Video System related cameras will be positioned and located such that it will only produce or capture Video System Images of areas of the Premises. Customer will provide adequate illumination under all operating conditions for the proper viewing of the cameras. Customer acknowledges and agrees that JCI has exercised no control over, or participated in locating or positioning the Video System related camera including, but not limited to selecting what areas, locations, things or persons that the Video System Images may depict or capture.
- d. Images. Customer shall be solely responsible for the Video System Images produced or captured by the Video System and Customer shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless JCI and its officers, agents, directors, and employees, from any and all damages, losses, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of third party claims, demands, or suits in connection with the use, operation, location and position of the Video System, and the Video System Images resulting there from, including, but not limited to, any claims of any person depicted in a Video System image, including but not limited to, any claim by such person that his or her privacy has been invaded or intruded upon or his or her likeness has been misappropriated. Any duty to obtain the consent or permission of any person depicted in a Video System Image to have his or her likeness to be depicted, received, transmitted or otherwise used, and the duty to determine and comply with any and all applicable laws, regulations, standards and other obligations that govern the legal, proper and ethical use of video capturing devices, such as the Video System, including, but not limited to, notification that the Video System is in use at the Premises, shall be the sole responsibility of the Customer. JCI agrees to make Video System Images available to Customer and upon their respective request. JCI makes no promise, warranty or representation as to the length of time that it retains Video Images, or the quality thereof.
- e. Video System Signals. When a signal from the Video System is received, JCI reserves the right to verify all alarm signals before notifying emergency personnel, and may choose not to notify emergency personnel if it has reason to believe, in its sole discretion, that an emergency condition does not exist. JCI will first attempt to verify the nature of the emergency by using visual verification and/or the two-way voice system (if applicable) of the Video System included in Customer's system. If JCI determines that an emergency condition exists, JCI will endeavor to notify the proper police or emergency contact on a notification call list provided in writing by Customer to JCI, or its designee. When a non-emergency signal is received, JCI will attempt to contact the first available Customer representative on the notification call list but will not notify emergency authorities, this notification will be in the form of email or text and follow ROC processes. If the customer requires phone calls to the call list for any emergency or non-emergency situation, the customer will need to make this request in writing. Customer authorizes and directs JCI, as its agent, to use its full discretion in causing the arrest or detention of any person or persons on or around the premises who are not authorized by Customer. JCI WILL NOT ARREST OR DETAIN ANY PERSON
- f. Recordings. Customer consents to the tape recording of all telephonic communications between the Premises and JCI. JCI will have no liability arising from recording (or failure to record) or publication of any two-way voice communications, other video recordings or their quality. JCI shall have no liability in connection with Video System or the Video System Images, including, but not limited to, any failure, omission, negligence or other act by JCI, or any of its officers, employees, representatives, agents, contractors, or any other third party in connection with the receipt (or failure of receipt), transmission, reading, interpreting, or response to any Video Image.
- 6. Risk of Loss is Customer's. JCl does not represent or warrant that the Services will detect or prevent the events they are intended to help detect or prevent including any burglary, holdup, fire or otherwise ("Detection Events"), or that the Services will be uninterrupted or error-free. Customer assumes all risk of loss or damage to Customer's person or property, or the property of others, if such an event occurs. Neither JCl nor its suppliers shall have any liability for loss, damage or injury due directly or indirectly to Detection Events, or the consequences therefrom. Further, expressly excluded from this Agreement are the warranties of merchantability or fitness or suitability for a particular purpose NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, IF JOHNSON CONTROLS SHOULD BE FOUND LIABLE FOR LOSS, DAMAGE OR INJURY DUE TO AN ACT OR OMISSION BY JOHNSON CONTROLS OR A FAILURE OF THE EQUIPMENT OR SERVICE IN ANY RESPECT, ITS LIABILITY WILL BE LIMITED TO A SUM EQUAL TO 10% OF THE ANNUAL SERVICE CHARGE OR \$1,000, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, AS THE AGREED UPON DAMAGES AND NOT AS A PENALTY, AND AS THE EXCLUSIVE REMEDY. THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL APPLY IF LOSS, DAMAGE OR INJURY, IRRESPECTIVE OF CAUSE OR ORIGIN, AND REGARDLESS OF LEGAL THEORY, RESULTS DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY TO PERSON OR PROPERTY OR FROM PERFORMANCE OR NONPERFORMANCE OF DELIGATIONS IMPOSED BY THIS AGREEMENT. IF ANY THIRD PARTY, INCLUDING CUSTOMER'S SUBROGATING INSURER, MAKES A CLAIM OR FILES A LAWSUIT AGAINST JOHNSON CONTROLS IN ANY WAY RELATING TO THE EQUIPMENT OR SERVICES, CUSTOMER AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS JOHNSON CONTROLS FROM ANY AND ALL SUCH CLAIMS AND LAWSUITS INCLUDING THE PAYMENT OF ALL DAMAGES, EXPENSES, COSTS AND ATTORNEYS' FEES.
- 7. JCI'S RECEIPT OF ALARM SIGNALS, ELECTRONIC DATA, VOICE DATA OR IMAGES (COLLECTIVELY, "ALARM SIGNALS") FROM THE EQUIPMENT OR SYSTEM INSTALLED IN THE PREMISES IS DEPENDENT UPON PROPER TRANSMISSION OF SUCH ALARM SIGNALS. JCI'S ROC CANNOT RECEIVE ALARM SIGNALS WHEN THE CUSTOMER'S TELCO SERVICE OR OTHER TRANSMISSION MODE IS NOT OPERATING OR HAS BEEN CUT, INTERFERED WITH, OR IS OTHERWISE DAMAGED, OR IF THE ALARM SYSTEM IS UNABLE TO ACQUIRE, TRANSMIT OR MAINTAIN AN ALARM SIGNAL OVER CUSTOMER'S TELCO SERVICE OR TRANSMISSION MODE FOR ANY REASON INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO NETWORK OUTAGE OR OTHER UNDERSTANDS THAT SIGNAL TRANSMISSION OR DOWNTIME, ROUTING PROBLEMS, OR INSTABILITY OF SIGNAL QUALITY. CUSTOMER UNDERSTANDS THAT SIGNAL TRANSMISSION FAILURE MAY OCCUR OVER CERTAIN TYPES OF TELCO SERVICES SUCH AS SOME TYPES OF DSL, ADSL, VOIP, DIGITAL PHONE, INTERNET PROTOCOL BASED PHONE OR OTHER INTERNET INTERFACE-TYPE SERVICE OR RADIO SERVICE, INCLUDING CELLULAR, WIRELESS OR PRIVATE RADIO, OR CUSTOMER'S PROPRIETARY TELCOMMUNICATION NETWORK, INTRANET OR IP-PBX, OR OTHER THIRD-PARTY EQUIPMENT OR VOICE/DATA TRANSMISSION NETWORKS OR SYSTEMS OWNED, MAINTAINED OR SERVICED BY CUSTOMER OR THIRD PARTIES, IF: (1) THERE IS A LOSS OF NORMAL ELECTRIC POWER TO THE MONITORED PREMISES OCCURS (THE BATTERY BACK-UP FOR JCI'S ALARM PANEL DOES NOT POWER CUSTOMER'S COMMUNICATION FACILITIES OR TELCO SERVICE); OR (2) ELECTRONIC COMPONENTS SUCH AS MODEMS MALFUNCTION OR FAIL. CUSTOMER UNDERSTANDS THAT JCI WILL ONLY REVIEW THE INITIAL COMPATIBILITY OF THE ALARM SYSTEM WITH CUSTOMER'S TELCO SERVICE AT THE TIME OF INITIAL INSTALLATION OF THE ALARM SYSTEM AND THAT CHANGES IN THE TELCO SERVICE'S DATA FORMAT AFTER JCI'S INITIAL REVIEW OF COMPATIBILITY COULD MAKE THE TELCO SERVICE



UNABLE TO TRANSMIT ALARM SIGNALS TO JCI'S ROC. IF JCI DETERMINES IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION THAT CUSTOMER'S TELCO SERVICE IS COMPATIBLE, JCI WILL PERMIT CUSTOMER TO USE ITS TELCO SERVICE AS THE PRIMARY METHOD OF TRANSMITTING ALARM SIGNALS, ALTHOUGH CUSTOMER UNDERSTANDS THAT JCI RECOMMENDS THAT CUSTOMER ALSO USE AN ADDITIONAL BACK-UP METHOD OF COMMUNICATION TO CONNECT CUSTOMER'S ALARM SYSTEM TO JCI'S ROC REGARDLESS OF THE TYPE OF TELCO SERVICE USED. CUSTOMER ALSO UNDERSTANDS THAT IF JCI DETERMINES IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION THAT CUSTOMER'S TELCO SERVICE IS, OR LATER BECOMES, NON-COMPATIBLE, OR IF CUSTOMER CHANGES TO ANOTHER TELCO SERVICE THAT IS NOT COMPATIBLE, THEN JCI WILL REQUIRE THAT CUSTOMER USE AN ALTERNATE METHOD OF COMMUNICATION ACCEPTABLE TO JCI AS THE PRIMARY METHOD TO CONNECT CUSTOMER'S ALARM SYSTEM TO JCI'S ROC. JCI WILL NOT PROVIDE FIRE OR SMOKE ALARM MONITORING FOR CUSTOMER BY MEANS OTHER THAN AN APPROVED TELCO SERVICE AND CUSTOMER UNDERSTANDS THAT IT IS SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR ASSURING THAT IT USES APPROVED TELCO SERVICE FOR ANY SUCH MONITORING AND THAT IT COMPLIES WITH NATIONAL FIRE ALARM STANDARDS AND LOCAL FIRE CODES. CUSTOMER ALSO UNDERSTANDS THAT IF CUSTOMER'S ALARM SYSTEM HAS A LINE CUT FEATURE, IT MAY NOT BE ABLE TO DETECT ALARM SIGNALS IF THE TELCO SERVICE IS INTERRUPTED, AND THAT JCI MAY NOT BE ABLE TO DOWNLOAD SYSTEM CHANGES REMOTELY OR PROVIDE CERTAIN AUXILIARY MONITORING SERVICES THROUGH A NON-APPROVED TELCO SERVICE. CUSTOMER ACKNOWLEDGES THAT ANY DECISION TO USE A NON-APPROVED TELCO SERVICE AS THE METHOD FOR TRANSMITTING ALARM SIGNALS IS BASED ON CUSTOMER'S OWN INDEPENDENT BUSINESS JUDGMENT AND THAT ANY SUCH DECISION IS MADE WITHOUT ANY ASSISTANCE, INVOLVEMENT, INPUT, RECOMMENDATION, OR ENDORSEMENT ON THE PART OF ICI. CUSTOMER ASSUMES SOLE AND COMPLETE RESPONSIBILITY FOR ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING ACCESS TO AND USE OF THE NON-APPROVED TELCO SERVICE FOR CONNECTION TO THE ALARM MONITORING EQUIPMENT. CUSTOMER FURTHER UNDERSTANDS THAT THE ALARM SYSTEM MAY BE UNABLE TO SEIZE THE TELCO SERVICE TO TRANSMIT AN ALARM SIGNAL IF ANOTHER CONNECTION HAS DISABLED, IS INTERFERING WITH, OR BLOCKING THE CONNECTION.

#### **CUSTOMER ACCEPTANCE**

In accepting this Agreement, Customer agrees to the terms and conditions contained herein including those on the following page(s) of this Agreement and any attachments or iddens attached hereto that contain additional terms and conditions. It is understood that these terms and conditions shall prevail over any variation in terms and conditions on any purchase or deriver the document that Customer mayissue. Any changes requested by Customer after the execution of this Agreement shall be paid for by the Customer and such changes shall be authorized in writing. ATTENTION IS DIRECTED TO THE LIMITATION OF LIABILITY, WARRANTY, INDEMNITY AND OTHER CONDITIONS CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT.

Pricing is based upon the following billing and payment terms: Invoices will be delivered via email, payment due date of NET 30, and invoices are to be paid via ACH bank transfer. Johnson Controls ACH, EFT bank transfer details will be forth coming upon contractual agreement.

This offer shall be void if not accepted in writing within thirty (30) days from the date first set forth above.
