

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.074862 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Henderson County Emergency Services District No. 4 ("District").

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.074862 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.072132 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.074862 per \$100
DE MINIMIS RATE	\$0.128585 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for the District from the same properties in both the 2025 and 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that the District may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for the District exceeds the voter-approval rate for the District.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for the District, the rate that will raise \$500,000, and the current debt rate for the District.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that the District is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2025 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON August 31, 2026 at 7 p.m. at 525 South Tool Drive, Tool, Texas 75143.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, the District is not required to hold an election at which the voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Board of Emergency Service Commissioners of the District at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE TAX RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{Property tax amount} = (\text{tax rate}) \times (\text{taxable value of your property}) / 100$$

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average homestead by the District last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by the District this year.
