Hymn: I Need Thee Every Hour VU 671 vv. 1, 3 & 4

Jazz-pop and Christian recording artist Emma Nissen performs a gorgeous version of this classic hymn. The stanzas were written by housewife Annie Hawks in 1872, who showed her poem to her pastor, Robert Lowry. Lowry added the refrain lyrics and composed the tune, and the completed hymn was publicly unveiled later that year at a meeting of the National Baptist Sunday School Association in Cincinnati, Ohio.

This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

1 Thessalonians 4:16-5:6 (NET)

- ¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven with a shout of command, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷ Then we who are alive, who are left, will be suddenly caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so, we will always be with the Lord. ¹⁸ Therefore encourage one another with these words.
