Dear Parishioners:

On this 4th Sunday of Easter, we hear in our readings about the commitment of the good shepherd to his sheep, that he lays down his life for his sheep. In our lives of faith we must ask how committed we are to the Good Shepherd. Are we as committed as he is to us? Would we give our lives for Him? Over time, I have noticed that sometimes I see people genuflecting on either knee as they enter their church pews. Did you know that there is a difference between genuflecting on the right knee versus the left? One genuflects on the left knee before a sovereign, like the King of England, but on the right knee before God alone. Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is Gods.



As we approach Mothers' Day, the Christ Child Society wants to make the lives of infants, toddlers and Moms in our community better, healthier and safer! The Christ Child Society will hold its annual Diaper Drop on Wednesday, May 8, from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM at the Christ Child Society Clothing Center in the Town and Country Shopping Center. Simply drive up and drop off your donation. When a baby cries, one of the first things Mom checks is his diaper. How do you soothe a crying baby if you don't have a clean, dry diaper? Imagine the stress and despair Moms feel when they can't soothe their babies in a most basic way - and inflation has impacted the price of diapers, too. Diapers will be delivered to local organizations by The Christ Child Society to be shared immediately with Moms in need. The CCS program, Foster Hope, will also provide diapers to babies entering foster care. Sizes 3 to 7 and pull-ups are in most demand.
