

Parish Mission Statement

In fidelity to Jesus Christ, in 1858 Irish and German immigrants founded St. Patrick Parish—the Mother Parish of South Bend—and in 1877 Polish immigrants founded St. Hedwig Parish—the Mother Parish of the Polish Community of South Bend. Saint Patrick Parish and Saint Hedwig Parish combined as one parish with two historic churches on August 22, 2024. The Parish sets to the western edge of Downtown South Bend in the West Washington National Historic District. As a faith community, we seek to bring the gifts of these two traditions together as one in the Roman Catholic Rite—to proclaim the Gospel and to celebrate the Eucharist in order to strengthen our resolve and to seek to live the Gospel message and so enrich our lives and the lives of others, our neighborhood, and our workplaces.

From the Desk of Fr. Jason Freiburger....

Dear Parishioners of St. Patrick-St. Hedwig Parish,

Next Sunday we will continue the traditional Blessing of Palms with the Episcopal congregation of St. James Cathedral. We will meet on the corner of West Washington and Taylor Streets in parking lot across from Tippecanoe Place Restaurant at 10:00 am. After the Blessing of Palms we will process to St. Patrick Church for the 10:30 am Mass.

We have now entered the final two weeks of Lent, which focus our attention on the passion and death of Jesus. However, the term "Passiontide", to describe these two weeks, is no longer used in order to maintain the overall unity of the Lenten season. Notice that the Stations of the Cross are not covered. The humanity of Jesus is visible, but the divinity of Jesus remains hidden throughout His Passion. The tradition of covering objects may have begun in medieval times when a huge, unadorned purple cloth was hung in front of the altar during Lent, preventing the congregation from seeing the altar. This was called a "hunger cloth" and provided a "fast of the eyes" Over time, the cloths became smaller, and eventually the practice of veiling individual crosses and images became what it is today. All of this is meant to increase our anticipation of the celebration of Easter.
