In fidelity to Jesus Christ, in 1858 Irish and German immigrants founded St. Patrick Parish—the Mother Parish of South Bend—and in 1877 Polish immigrants founded St. Hedwig Parish—the Mother Parish of the Polish Community of South Bend. Saint Patrick Parish and Saint Hedwig Parish combined as one parish with two historic churches on August 22, 2024. The Parish sets to the western edge of Downtown South Bend in the West Washington National Historic District. As a faith community, we seek to bring the gifts of these two traditions together as one in the Roman Catholic Rite—to proclaim the Gospel and to celebrate the Eucharist in order to strengthen our resolve and to seek to live the Gospel message and so enrich our lives and the lives of others, our neighborhood, and our workplaces.

From the Desk of Fr. Reginald Wolford, OP

Dear Friends,

I trust that many of you have been as delighted as I am with the music at our masses lately, especially the growth of our 10:30 choir. We are blessed to have Andrew Goldstein acting as our music director currently (he will introduce himself to you in this space next week) while Jim Nowinski is still glorifying the Lord with his organ skills. Two weeks ago, I wrote a little about the spirituality of singing of the antiphons. Today I would like to tell you about what you can expect at our different masses going forward, as far as their musical character:

The **4pm Saturday** vigil will be a simpler and quieter mass, with some singing being led by the priest, and a seasonal Marian chant at the end.

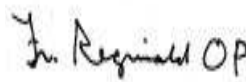
The **9am Sunday** mass will have singing led by a cantor, accompanied by the organ.

The **10:30 mass** will be our "High" mass, with choir and organ, and many sung acclamations and responses between the priest and the people. I plan on usually chanting the Gospel at this one (after I practice that a little more). I would also like to have additional instruments on the greatest feast days, as far as our abilities allow. So, expect the 10:30 to be the most "all out" of our masses - though I promise not to make it take much more than an hour.

The **5:30** will be an a cappella chant mass, meaning that the cantor will lead the singing, without any instrumental accompaniment. This mass will also lend itself to more silent moments. There is a mysterious beauty to praising God with the bare human voice, and I want us to be able to experience that regularly. This one will also end with a Marian chant.

Through the prayers of St. Gregory and St. Cecilia, may the Lord bless our efforts to praise him with our voices.
