From the Desk of Fr. Jason Freiburger....

Dear Parishioners,

The past couple of weeks since returning from Alaska have kept me busy. I knew, as anyone who has been on a lengthy vacation does, that there is often a lot of work to be done when one returns. However, I have never had the experience of returning to the pastoral care of two parishes before now. Thankfully, various parishioners, including some whose efforts I may never be made aware of, volunteered and continued working to transform the St. Patrick rectory into a residence for the Dominican priests. Some of the priests who teach at the University of Notre Dame, and others who have helped celebrate Masses throughout the week, moved in last Saturday. The new pastor, Fr. Reginald Wolford, O.P. is attending to some final commitments before arriving to begin serving as pastor August 20th . That will be a bittersweet day as I surrender all of you over to his care.
