From the Desk of Fr. Reginald Wolford, OP Pardon and Peace

Dear Friends,

As you have heard in our mass announcements, and as you can see in the parish bulletin and website, we have begun offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation almost every day here at St. Patrick St. Hedwig Parish. You can look at the exact schedule, but an easy way to remember is that there are **confessions before** *almost* all of our masses - the exceptions being that they are not scheduled on Mondays, and they are *after* the 10:30 Sunday mass instead of before it.

A word about the importance of the sacrament of Confession and its practice: the Lord knows that, even after believing in Him and being baptized, we are weak and liable to fall back into sin. Therefore, after His resurrection, he said to his Apostles, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (Jn 20:22-23). The Church requires us to confess at least once a year, but it is a good idea to go more often, examining our consciences regularly. We are obliged to confess any mortal sins (i.e. when we have done something seriously wrong, with full knowledge and intention) including how many times they happened, but we are also encouraged to bring lesser sins and weaknesses. Also, any mortal sins must be confessed before receiving Holy Communion.

If it has been a while, or if you are nervous or afraid of Confession, I want to say that the confessional is a place of joy and victory. In it, you give Jesus a chance to do his favorite thing, which is to have mercy. In Confession, the devil, who would like to keep you hiding in fear and shame, is defeated and humiliated, and you are made holy again in God's grace. You will find Examinations of Conscience in the back of the church to help you.
