Dear Friends,

Greetings in the Lord! Congratulations on being asked to be a godparent or sponsor!

In the Catholic Church, godparents and sponsors witness the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.¹ More importantly, they help the newly baptized or newly confirmed to live the Christian life well by: (1) worshiping God at Mass every Sunday and on holy days of obligation and through prayer, (2) living and sharing the Good News of his love and salvation in Christ by growing in knowledge of the faith and following the teachings of Christ and his Church, and (3) caring for those in need.

Given this great privilege and responsibility, being a godparent or sponsor in the Catholic Church means taking on an official ecclesiastical office; in other words, a special function within the Church. In order to take on this office, there are certain requirements that one must fulfill. Neither the father nor mother of the one to be baptized may serve as a godparent or sponsor. For Baptism, only one godparent is required. Nevertheless, there may be two godparents: one male and one female.

The following are other qualifications to be a godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation:

- (1) the requisite maturity to fulfill this responsibility (i.e., sixteen years old and older)
- (2) reception of the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist
- (3) a life consistent with faith and the responsibility of a godparent (e.g., attendance at and participation in the Eucharist on Sundays and holy days of obligation, if married, in a marriage recognized by the Church, etc.),
- (4) not prohibited by the law of the Church.

A baptized person who belongs to a non-Catholic ecclesial community (e.g., Anglican, Lutheran, etc.) may act as a witness of Baptism provided that there is a Catholic godparent. A Catholic who is not qualified to be a godparent may not act as a Christian witness.

It is the responsibility of the pastor to determine whether one is qualified to be a godparent or sponsor. Please fill out the attached form and submit it with your sacramental certificates for approval. The pastor of the parish where you go to Mass is to sign it. If you do not currently meet all the requirements to be a godparent or sponsor, it may be possible to fulfill them in time for the celebration of Baptism or Confirmation. Please do not hesitate to ask for assistance in doing so. This is a great opportunity to return to the practice of the Catholic faith!

¹ Note: godparents are not *de facto* the legal guardians of a child should something happen to the child's parents. Legal guardians need to be appointed by parents using the required process and paperwork for doing so. Parents may ask godparents to be legal guardians. However, this is not automatically part of their role as godparents.
