Managing and guiding all the sections is the Group Leader, Clare Newby (Chipmunk).



First Meeting

Note: New Youth are requested to start week 1 or 6 of term.

What to bring—A drink bottle filled with water (the younger members can get quite hot and thirsty running around).

Find the section leader and introduce yourself, they will then speak to your child, introducing themselves and buddy them up with another youth member for the night.

All leaders have undertaken thorough training, and give freely their time and efforts. This enables them to deliver the scouting program and work in partnership with you, to help your child develop to their full potential.

UNIFORM

At the beginning, your child can wear comfortable appropriate clothing, such as shorts/track pants, t-shirt and closed in shoes. Closed in shoes are mandatory for all scout events.

When they are ready to join, your child will need a uniform. More information is available in the Welcome Pack on where to purchase and what is needed.
