began his training at UCLA, where his roles included Don Alfonso, Escamillo and Leporello. He graduated in 2016 and then undertook a further year's study at the Music Academy of the West, where he performed: Dulcamara and Bonobo (*Second Nature*).

In 2017, he made his New York debut, with the American Repertory Theater, as Soldier/Bass No.5 in Aucoin's *Crossing*. That same season, he also performed: Sergeant-Major Morris in De Rosa's *The Monkey's Paw* for the Pacific Opera Project, and Zuniga for Opera Buffs.

His debut professional season (2018) saw the addition of a lyric baritone role, Marcello, to his repertoire, firstly opposite Joshua Guerrero and Julianna Di Giacomo at The Colburn School of Music (for Opera Buffs), and then with the Pacific Opera Project. In addition, he sang Dulcamara with Center Stage Opera and joined the roster of LA Opera to workshop a new, one-act commission.

In 2019, he made his debut in recital at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion before becoming a Young Artist at Opera Delaware, where his roles included: Don Alfonso; Owen Hart (*Dead Man Walking*) and The Learned Judge (*Trial by Jury*).

In competition, he was a finalist in both the Palm Springs Opera Guild and The Loren L. Zachary Society competitions, and was the winner of the Marilyn Horne Song Competition.

He currently studies with Vladimir Chernov and Tim Mussard.

In 2021, he sang the eponymous hero of Bizet's *Don Procopio* for Pacific Opera project, to critical acclaim, Talpa in *Il tabarro* for Opera Santa Barbara, and Enrico Ashton for Opera Buffs.

Season 2022-2023 roles include: returns to Opera Santa Barbara (as the Sacristan, and as Jim in Jack Perla's *An American Dream*) and to Opera Delaware as Baron Duphol (cover Pere Germont), and in a performance of his recently recorded *Winterreise*, and outreach work for Los Angeles Opera.

Season 2023-2024 roles include: a return to Pacific Opera Project as Figaro (cover) in *Il barbiere di Siviglia*, and Tonio (*I Pagliacci*) with the Concert Opera of Los Angeles.
