*It begins on Ash Wednesday with the celebration of Mass and the distribution of ashes at St. Augustine Cathedral at 7 p.m. and ending with the morning Chism Mass on Holy Thursday at the Cathedral at 10 a.m. 68 Masses in 30 churches over 38 days. Schedules can be found at the doors of the church.*





"What are the basic rules for Catholics?"

1. Attend Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. Missing without a valid reason is a grave sin.
2. Receive the Sacraments. Go to Confession at least once a year and receive Holy Communion in a state of grace, especially during Easter.
3. Observe fasting and abstinence. Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday; abstain from meat on Fridays in Lent.
4. Follow moral teachings. Obey the Ten Commandments, respect life, practice chastity, and avoid sin and scandal.
5. Support the Church. Contribute financially and serve according to your ability.
6. Pray daily. Maintain a personal prayer life, including Scripture reading and devotions.
7. Honor marriage and family. Be faithful in marriage, remain open to life, and raise children in the faith.
8. Defend the faith. Learn & share Catholic teachings with others charitably.
9. Avoid superstition and false teachings. Reject practices contrary to the faith, such as fortune-telling or non-Christian rituals.



# SAVE THE DATE

Stations are a spiritual devotion that date back to the 15th century. They are a spiritual pilgrimage of prayers and meditations on the chief scenes of Christ's suffering and death. They are prayed in the spirit of reparation for the sufferings and insults Jesus endured during His passion. The Stations have remained universally throughout the ages not because they concentrate on suffering, but because they give us a model of how to live life when our suffering is unavoidable & life seems most impossible. During Lent, we are encouraged to join together in community to pray the Stations: Stations are **Friday, February 20, at 7 p.m. and Friday, February 27 at 3 p.m.** They will continue to alternate through Lent offering everyone a chance to attend.




## *Let's Go Back to Basics Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson*

The pleasant lady parishioner checking out my supermarket order decides to share her nervous entry into "New Car World." She admits being baffled by the new car she just bought. After all she had kept the "old buggy" for 14 years! Another example comes from my priest friend, now gone to God who admitted that he had arranged for two Saturday morning "dashboard lessons" from the very salesman who sold and touted the car's virtues.

I detect a certain parallel here with how one is to handle a whole new outlook both on life and on one's relationship with God. Of course, God's ways are not as well-known as they once were.

Gone are the days when whole generations automatically attended a Catholic elementary school, followed by Catholic high school and even college. So, the whole Catholic way of life, including Christ's particular teaching on specifics, is as strange and alien as the tech in a new car.

This is not to forget the tremendous effort put forth by many dedicated souls' work to educate and inspire the minds of young people and searchers for the truth of any age.



The "Sermon on the Mount" is at the heart of Matthew's gospel. Its length means that it must not have been preached by Jesus at one time. Both He and His audience would have long since either fainted or walked away. Fortunately, we are blessed to have it easily accessible in book form or online. A good Catholic bible has many helpful footnotes to help us appreciate the text.

We are now only a few days out from the great penitential season of Lent. But that dominant characteristic does not preclude us from going back to basics about the faith or expanding our knowledge as a Lenten project. And with no worries about strange blinking dashboard lights and odd icons on your car's touch screen! Just get started. Why? Because "Procrastination is the assassination of motivation."
