





A Mother's Day Promise..... Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

"Sounds like a plan." We say it when we have mutual agreement on some future action. Implied is our trust in the "other" to honor the idea with more than words. So two reputations are at stake, yours and theirs. Trust is on the line. Of course, that trust is in jeopardy if one or the other party reneges. There comes trouble.

Through our Baptism, you and I lay claim to love Jesus Christ as Our Lord and God, specifically in this Easter season as our risen Lord and Redeemer. Today we hear Him tell His closest devotees that He will soon be leaving them. But He will not leave them to their own resources. He will send them an Advocate, whom we know as the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Holy Trinity. He will provide an action plan.



To preclude any breaking of the bond that they have forged between them over the past three years, Jesus tells His Apostles and disciples of His love for them. So a question arises: How will this love be manifest? How will they retain what He gives them? The answer is a plan: by their observance of His commandments. Implied here is not only the ancient Ten, but also the more recently proclaimed Eight Beatitudes. In other words, a "Christian Plan of Action."

Easy enough to understand. Tough as nails to keep. And oh how we know that to be true! Especially when we leave Sunday Mass, only to tackle a whole new week of daily life out there in the so-called "real world," beginning with the parking lot.

But listen again, everybody, to the encouragement we receive from the God Man who became like us in all things but sin: *"Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves Me. And whoever loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."*

Of course, keeping our promise takes perseverance. Who best to remind us of that than Mary our heavenly Mother, and the woman we all honor on this Mother's Day?

They might even tell us this story about perseverance and a certain frog:

Two frogs fell into a can of cream, or so I've heard it told.

The sides of the can were shiny and steep. The cream was deep and cold.

"Oh, what's the use?" croaked number one. "Tis fate, no help's around.

Good-bye, my friend! Good-bye sad world!" And weeping still, he drowned.

But frog number two, of sterner stuff, dog-paddled in surprise,

The while he wiped his creamy face and dried his creamy eyes.

"I'll swim a while, at least," he said. Or so I've heard he said.

"It really wouldn't help the world if one more frog were dead."

An hour or two he kicked and swam. Not once he stopped to mutter,

But kicked and kicked and swam and kicked. Then hopped out by way of butter!

God love you and give you His Easter peace.

Reading I: Acts 8: 5-8

Phillip preached and performed miracles that ultimately brought the Samaritans to belief in Christ. Later, Peter and John visited and conferred the Holy Spirit upon those new converts.

Reading II: I Peter 3: 15-18

This passage urges us to always be ready to explain our faith, but to do so in a kind way and matched with our good conduct. If maligned in some way, we must "turn the other cheek" and offer up our suffering to God as did Jesus.

The Gospel: John 14: 15-21

Jesus tries to prepare His disciples for His approaching departure. He also promises to send them an Advocate. He spells out for them the best way to show their ongoing love for Him with an "action plan."

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am writing to update you on a promising opportunity for Our Lady of Fatima Parish. After a long search and many meetings, we have found an education organization that seeks to lease our school building. It would be dedicated to quality education and its curriculum will respect and uphold our Catholic identity and teachings. They would begin with a K-5 program and expand. They have had great success in developing schools in the past and want to begin a school in our area. I have discussed this with our Finance Council, and we are in the negotiation process with the lease. It is not a complete deal, so I am not at liberty to discuss all the details.

I also want to inform you that you may see some marketing and recruiting efforts in our local papers and did not want you to be alarmed or hear the news second hand. I ask that you pray for the successful execution of a lease and a mutually beneficial agreement that meets the needs of all parties involved.

It was a difficult journey as we had to mourn the closing of our beloved Our Lady of Fatima Academy. We are also challenged with finding a renter who would allow our Religious Education program to continue using the school building. It is of the utmost importance that we find a solution sooner rather than later as the bills for the school have exceeded \$170,000 since the school's closing. We are also faced with a building that has an antiquated HVAC system and other deferred maintenance issues.

We firmly believe that this agreement would relieve some of the pressures on the parish finances and provide a quality education for years to come. The anticipated opening of a new school would be fall of 2024 as some upgrades and marketing would need to happen in the next year.

We thank you for your continued support and patience. Please direct all questions to me and I will do my best to answer them. God willing, I will have some good news for you shortly as we continue to work with the Diocese to make this happen.
