

Mass Etiquette

Put Your Phone on Silent Mode

It is one of the most common mistakes that people forget to turn off their phones or at least activate silent or airplane mode. You don't want to feel embarrassed if your phone suddenly starts ringing during the ceremony. All people will start looking at you and it can be an unpleasant experience. That is especially important for non-Catholics since other people might find it disrespectful to their religion. Therefore, keep your phone in the pocket the whole time.

Know the Parts of the Mass

The Mass is divided into different parts, such as the entrance song, rite, opening prayer, reading, gospel, and more. Most of the time, people will sit still until it ends. However, there is one part where people will sit, stand, kneel, and repeat the process several times. If you are not sure about the proper composition of these actions, just follow other people.

There is a Dress Code

Another important thing to focus on is your dress-code. Visiting a God's house requires proper clothes. In that matter, avoid short, yoga pants, inappropriate shirts, and other casual pieces of clothes that are too open. You will have to show respect to this place, and dressing properly is very important. Therefore, avoid striking colors as well, and wear comfortable but appropriate outfits.

Avoid Speaking With People

You might feel the need to say hi to someone around you, or start talking with people next to you. Whatever the reason is for you to start a conversation at that moment, you should wait until the Mass is over. People come to pray, and the ceremony requires silence and respect. That is especially important for non-Catholics because they might be full of questions about what they see. You should wait until it ends and there will be many people interested in speaking to you about the liturgy.

Never Leave Before the Priest

Another rule is related to the moment when you can leave the Mass, and that is only after the priest finishes the whole ceremony. Even if you notice that some people are leaving after the blessing, you should wait until the end and show respect to the priest and the whole community that came here to pray. Leave the church only after the priest; leaving before that can be recognized as disrespect.



The Simple Beginning of Our Church: .Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

In these inflationary times, anyone buying gas or groceries really appreciates a “twofer”, or two for the price of one. Today's Gospel is like that kind of bargain in offering us two answers to the question “How did our beloved Church begin?” First, by the initiative of Jesus and second, by the people He chose.

The God Man was simply strolling seaside one fine day when He came upon two brothers, Simon (later Peter) and his brother Andrew. He looked into their surprised eyes and simply said “Come after Me and I will make you fishers of men.” From our perspective, we realize that not only was this meeting as described stylized somewhat by St. Matthew, but also that it was part of God's plan.

Considering all that we know and have experienced as a Church some 21 centuries later, it was a remarkably small start. But then again, we should be familiar with how God works in other aspects of that plan. The mighty oak tree begins with an acorn.



The stroll of the Savior moves along for Him to make the same invitation to two other brothers, James and John. But that's it. The Church has begun. One of the two main images in the New Testament for ministry is the idea of fishing for men. The other image is that of the shepherd. The future Apostles will be both.

This to me is encouraging, in that any small step we take to be a better disciple of Christ can be fruitful, depending on our motivation. A simple resolve to add minutes to our daily prayer time can turn out to be marvelous if not monumental. We ordinary souls can derive encouragement and know that we are not insignificant to the Lord by the life we lead. In our time we have the Little Flower St. Therese as our example “par excellence.” As we read this Gospel scene we catch the ordinariness of Peter, Andrew, James and John long ago and far away but easily reachable by prayer.

The story is told that when Jesus ascended into heaven after His mission on earth, the angels asked Him: “Did You accomplish Your task?” “Yes, all is finished,” the Lord replied.

“We have a second question”, said the angels. “Has the whole world heard of You?” “No,” said Jesus. The angels asked, “Then what is Your plan?” Jesus said, “I have left twelve men and some other followers to carry the message to the whole world.” The angels looked at Him and asked: “What is your Plan B?”

Friends, there is no Plan B. Jesus desires to reach the world through men and women like you and me. God love you and give you His peace.


SAINTS FUN FACTS
