

Feast of St. Blaise

St. Blaise was an early-fourth-century physician. After the death of the local bishop, Blaise was chosen to succeed him. He didn't want to live in the mansion of the bishop but instead chose to live in a cave. He tended to the spiritual needs of the faithful and because he was a physician, he took care of their medical needs as well.

In 316, the governor arrived at Blaise's cave and arrested him for being Christian. While being escorted out, a distraught woman ran up to him, carrying her young son who was choking on a fishbone. She laid her son at his feet and he was immediately healed. The governor, unmoved, beheaded St. Blaise. The martyr is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers. St. Blaise's intercession is now invoked against choking and other ailments of the throat.

After Mass on **Friday, Feb. 3**, Fr. Reggie will bless the throats. He will call each side up and you will line up as we do for Communion.

The Beatitudes Offer No Options: .Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Slackers in any endeavor, but particularly in the world of business, are forthrightly told by their bosses to "get with the program." There is an implied "or else" in their directive. Immediate compliance is the only alternative. No time for a listing of offenses. The slacker now knows that he has been watched; his behavior noted; this reform essential to the overall success of the operation.

In today's Scriptures, particularly the well-known Gospel passage about the Beatitudes, Jesus gives notice to the world, and also His Church, of His program for salvation. It is a way of life. Without being explicit, Our Lord's beatitudes leave up to our discernment what refusal to comply will yield us.

The first few of the eight are special components of Jesus' mission to Israel. They are essential, and free of any later add-on by the nascent Church. Do you see why the Church in our time claims "a preferential option for the poor"? And that the option is basic?



Poverty in all its dimensions is an evil. The financial aspect of course comes to our minds first, perhaps because we are part of a culture of consumers. Consuming costs money. Amazon sends a bill. But there is also a poverty of education, of proper life goals and behaviors, and of generosity of heart.

Hunger stalks this land of plenty we live on, but it haunts our overfed routine. Mourning grows more widespread in the way elements of our society have cheapened life itself. It is a violent world we live in now, as people use weapons to express anger, jealousy, hate and revenge. We have managed to create almost a "sub-society" of mourners in our midst. These three negatives obviously get the bulk of divine attention. The Scriptures urge you and me today to do the same. How? In genuine, consistent outreach in both prayer and practical decisions of assistance. No slackers allowed.

A bold commentator wrote this about the Apostles' reaction to hearing the beatitudes:

Then Simon Peter said, "Are we supposed to know this?"

And Andrew said, "Do we have to write this down?"

And James said, "Will we get a test on this?"

And Philip said, "I don't have any paper."

And Bartholomew said, "Do we have to turn it in?"

And John said, "The other disciples don't have to learn this."

And Matthew said, "I have to go to the bathroom."

And Judas said, "What does this have to do with real life?"

And one of the Pharisees present asked to see Jesus' lesson plans, and inquired of Jesus, "What is your terminal objective? Have you completed a task analysis? What about a diagnostic survey?"

And Jesus wept.

God love you and give you His peace.

In his comments that day, the Bishop described the memorial as "a garden of dedication and remembrance," calling it "a great gift" to the parish.


The garden is a spiritual oasis in the midst of a busy community. Benches on either side of the structure provide comfort to those who use the space as a place to reflect and pray.


