Life: An "Epiphany" of God

"Life is always a good. ... Why is life a good? This question is found everywhere in the Bible, and from the very first pages it receives a powerful and amazing answer. The life which God gives man is quite different from the life of all other living creatures, inasmuch as man, although formed from the dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7, 3:19; Job 34:15; Ps 103:14; 104:29), is a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory (cf. Gen 1:26-27; Ps 8:6). This is what Saint Irenaeus of Lyons wanted to emphasize in his celebrated definition: 'Man, living man, is the glory of God'. Man has been given a sublime dignity, based on the intimate bond which unites him to his Creator: in man there shines forth a reflection of God himself" (The Gospel of Life, n. 34).

As you know, Parishes in the Diocese of Bridgeport depend on Offertory donations for on-going expenses related to ministry, maintenance, staff and other pressing needs. Those donations are collected either at Mass or online through our website and clicking on the online giving button. **Our parish keeps Sunday and Monthly collections.**

Today's Feast conveys powerfully the message of the sanctity of life. Epiphany is about "revelation" and "manifestation," and that, of course is what Christ does. Not only does he reveal the Father to us, but he reveals us to ourselves. He shows us that this human nature of ours, that can be so troublesome and burdened, has in fact been renewed in the immortal image of God. That, indeed is "the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel" that Paul proclaims to the Ephesians in the second reading. It is a promise that God will draw us into the life of His Spirit, where life itself reaches its total fulfillment. Death is no longer the final word for the human family, and this gift is shared not only by one nation or one people, but by all humanity.

The universal offer of God's salvation extends to those still in the womb. Epiphany not only tells us that there are no national or ethnic boundaries to God's call, but that there are no artificial boundaries between "born" and "unborn," "wanted" or "unwanted," "convenient" or "inconvenient."

Moreover, the "epiphany" most needed in our time is the ability to see beyond the appearances of those who are smaller and weaker, and beyond the illusion created when some are declared "non-persons" under the law. Breaking through all this darkness and blurriness is the clear light of Christ, which shines on every human life without exception, bringing those lives God's love and giving us the sacred obligation to love them as well.

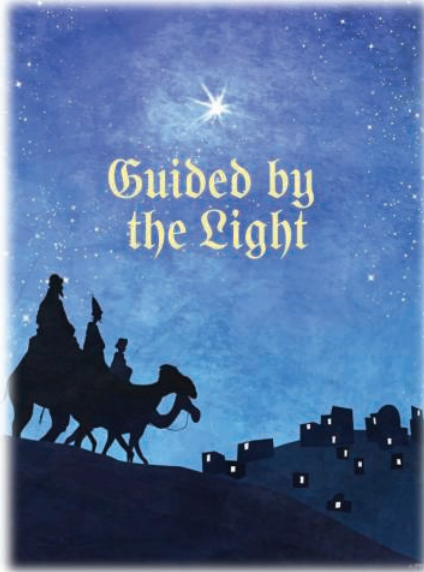

Why the Epiphany is Important

The designers of our Church's liturgical, or worship calendar we can presume to work from the best of motives and only after prayer and consultation. And so it is that this Feast of the Epiphany, long celebrated on January 6th, was moved back in 1970 to this Sunday. That is a good thing, I suppose, because the event is most worthy of a celebration on a day when the most faithful Catholics can do it. Sunday, after all, is the Lord's Day.



But sometimes such changes affect the humblest of God's creatures in a hurtful way. I count my own Mom among them. You see, she was a humble person all her life, but she was at the same time proud that her birthday was January 6, and that for a good portion of her life she just happened to live in Epiphany Parish in South Philadelphia. I have no memory of her ever having complained, but I am sure the change was at least a pin prick of her ego.

The Epiphany in its older setting also marked the last of the "Twelve Days of Christmas," memorialized in a Christmas carol that demands explanation of its medieval references.

But the chief importance of this feast is that it celebrates the coming of Christ to the wide world of the Gentiles, apart from the narrower confines of the Jewish world. The Jews were then, and remain to this day, God's chosen people. Our Lord came among us as a Jewish man. Our

Lady, His Mother and ours was a Jew by birth. So was her beloved spouse, the obedient, brave, and humble St. Joseph. Add in the Twelve Apostles. This fact underlines the awful scandal of antisemitism among some Christians.

The Bible clearly tells us that God became man in Jesus to save the entire world. Nobody is left out of His love. Nobody is exempt from giving Him praise, honor and reciprocal love. Least of all, we sinners. That in itself is always worth celebrating, no matter what the date.

I believe that the words of Edna St. Vincent Millay (d.1950) convey the breadth of the Epiphany event.

"The world stands out on either side |
no wider than the heart is wide;
above the world is stretched the sky
no higher than the soul is high.

The heart can push the sea and land
so far away on either hand;
The soul can split the sky in two

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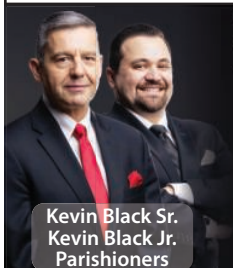
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
