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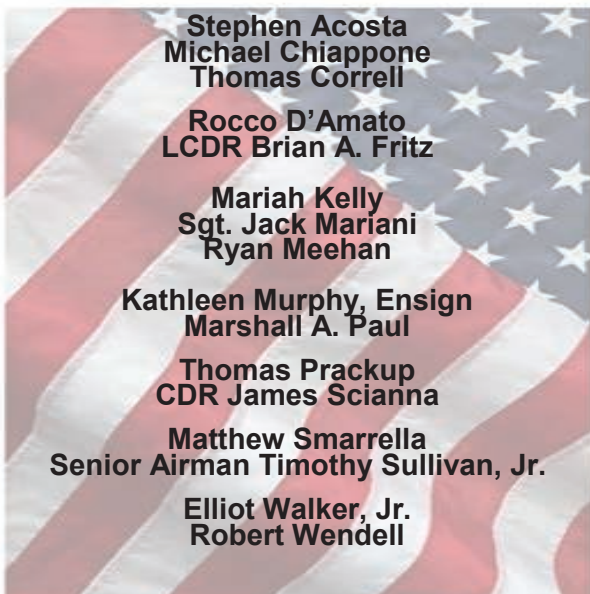

Feast of St. Blaise

St. Blaise was an early-fourth-century physician. After the death of the local bishop, Blaise was chosen to succeed him. He didn't want to live in the mansion of the bishop but instead chose to live in a cave. He tended to the spiritual needs of the faithful and because he was a physician, he took care of their medical needs as well.

In 316, the governor arrived at Blaise's cave and arrested him for being Christian. While being escorted out, a distraught woman ran up to him, carrying her young son who was choking on a fishbone. She laid her son at his feet and he was immediately healed. The governor, unmoved, beheaded St. Blaise. The martyr is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers. St. Blaise's intercession is now invoked against choking and other ailments of the throat.



After Mass on **Tuesday, Feb. 3**, Fr. will bless the throats. He will call each side up and you will line up as we do for Communion.

When Jesus begins to preach, he starts by saying "Repent" (today's Gospel). When John the Baptist began to preach, he said, "Repent" (see Mt. 3:1-2). When Peter began to preach on the day of Pentecost, he said, "Repent" (see Acts 2:38). The readings talk today about light breaking into darkness. Repentance, whose Greek words means a change of the mind, is enlightenment that what one may have thought was right is actually wrong, and what one thought led to happiness and fulfillment actually does not.

The imperative to repent, furthermore, comes about precisely because light has broken into darkness. Jesus says in today's Gospel passage that the reason, motive, and basis for repentance is that "the Kingdom of heaven is at hand." A kingdom has broken into the world; therefore, we see its light, are attracted by it, and begin to move in its direction. This means breaking from sin and from all that leads us away from the light.

The great darkness of our day is the myth that some human lives, particularly those in the womb, just don't count. To so many, these lives are not worthy of constitutional protection, not worthy of our public witness, and not even worthy of discussion.

Often, this is because of the very phenomenon Paul describes in the second reading. "I belong to this political party." "I belong to that organization." "I follow this particular philosophy or theology." Based on many of these false divisions among us, some try to justify "the right to choose" abortion.

Yet Christ breaks through these false divisions. If all are one in Christ Jesus, it is because he has united all human life to himself and given us all an equal call to salvation and eternal life. Raising human life to the heights of heaven, he has raised men and women, born and unborn. There is only one human nature, and by the Incarnation and the Paschal Mystery, everyone who shares that human nature now also shares access to the very life of God. Because of that, we uphold the dignity of every person. This indeed is the light that has broken into our darkness, the Kingdom of God that ushers us to repentance.

With one month until Ash Wednesday, the Church gently invites us to begin preparing—not just our calendars, but our hearts. Lent does not arrive suddenly; it is meant to be entered thoughtfully, prayerfully, and with intention. These next weeks are a gift: a quiet threshold before the holy season of repentance, renewal, and deeper conversion.

Ash Wednesday will soon remind us of a sobering truth we often try to forget: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Yet this reminder is not meant to discourage us. Instead, it opens the door to hope—a call to turn away from sin and return to the Gospel.

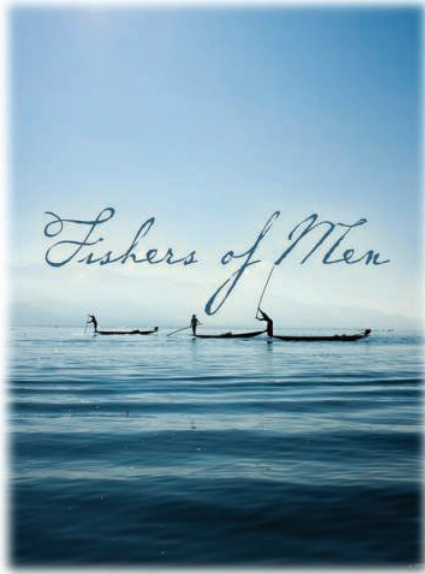

Don't Take God Out of the Human Story

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

As a "late to the table" lover of history, I realize that I must choose a topic. So, I can join the tots who can rattle off the names of prehistoric lizards like Tyrannosaurus Rex and Triceratops. Or I can join the ranks of those who rate Ken Burns' treatment of the Civil War as a masterpiece. Or I can take an interest

in the record of NASA. But with my calling as a priest factored in, I know I will always revert to the story of God's involvement in human history as the best historical topic of all. Today's Gospel passage reminds me of that wonderful, recorded walk along the shore of Jesus Christ, God's Son.



St. Matthew chronicles the event in somewhat stark terms in today's Gospel passage. We yearn for some details, like facial expressions or voiced responses. But Matthew's interest is how quick and unreserved the two sets of brothers give Our Lord in response. Little do they know what is ahead.

Surely the Holy Spirit has a message here for all of us who hear or read about this incident. What response would you or I have given Jesus that day? What response do we give Him this day? How would we write our personal history?

I came across a respected scholar who calls what Matthew is describing this way: "Covenant grace builds upon, perfects and elevates our human nature." The bond we have with God sets the stage. Sadly, it is a bond largely forgotten by our secular culture. So, events get recorded with not even a nod to God's part. Take God out of the human story and it is a dull one all around.

So, we can perk up with Isaiah's timeless announcement of a new day. We can join St. Paul's unity campaign. Why? Because despite the downward pull the world around us seems to exert, goodness and light always break through. You will notice it in every good person you know. Especially if they are authentic Christians. What a good feeling it is to know that Our Lord Jesus Christ notices us; He loves us and wants our personal history to be bound up with His. That is what happens every time we go to Mass. Never let any obstacle get in your way and remember that He calls us by name to join Him. He guarantees that: "The task ahead of us is never as great as the Power behind us."

In his comments that day, the Bishop described the memorial as "a garden of dedication and remembrance," calling it "a great gift" to the parish.

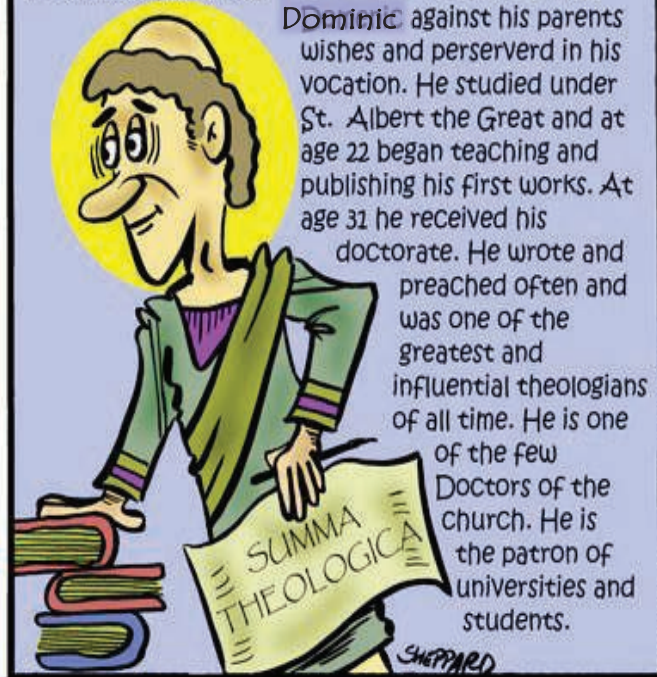
The garden is a spiritual oasis in the midst of a busy community. Benches on either side of the structure provide comfort to those who use the space as a place to reflect and pray.
