Our diocese will inaugurate a Lenten devotional practice that has been followed in the city of Rome since Pope Saint Gregory the Great in the 4th century. It's a daily celebration of Mass in a different "stational" church each morning and evening, inviting people from all over the Diocese to come as "pilgrims" to participate. The goal is for those that can travel to make the sacrifice and attend as many of these celebrations as possible.

It begins on Ash Wednesday with the celebration of Mass and the distribution of ashes at St. Augustine Cathedral at 7 p.m. and ending with the morning Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday at the Cathedral at 10 a.m. 68 Masses in 30 churches over 38 days. Schedules can be found at the doors of the church.



"Hope does not disappoint" Romans 5:5

Building up a life of prayer for your family can develop an ever-deepening relationship with Jesus.

Pray Often

To encourage your children to enter into a true sense of prayer, urge them to pray freely and without restraint, not just at designated times such as bedtime and meals. Prayer is for asking God questions and requesting his guidance and assistance. In prayer, you can offer your thanksgiving to God and praise and express your love for God.



The readings today focus on how the children of the King are to show to the world who their Father is by acting like him. This, in fact, is the best way to accomplish the "New Evangelization," the re-announcement of the Gospel in places where, though it was once accepted, it has been eclipsed by secularism. When that happens, as Pope Benedict has said, we lose a proper understanding of the meaning of the most basic human experiences, like birth and death.

That is why it is so hard for some to perceive that abortion is always wrong. We can convince them through many arguments. But even more powerful, as Paul declares in the second reading, is "the convincing power of the Spirit." That power convinces people when they see the Spirit's effects in our own lives. We become the light of the world, as Jesus indicated. Regarding the pro-life issues, we are called to let people see that in our own lives, we not only choose life, but we sacrifice our own convenience, plans, and resources that others may live. Not only do we – as individuals and as a community – accept the gift of new life when God gives it, but we eradicate injustice from our midst.

Isaiah speaks about sheltering the oppressed and providing for the afflicted. Children in the womb are more oppressed in our day than any other segment of the population. The prophet's words, applied in our day, call us to pro-life action. Isaiah also points out that this must begin with our own flesh and blood. *"Do not turn your back on your own."* These are powerful words for our culture: parents, do not turn your back on the child you have conceived! Grandparents, do not turn your back on your daughter's unborn child. Speak up for that life, and intervene to help both your daughter and her child! Some mistakenly think that the fact that the child in the womb is "their own" is precisely what gives them the "right to choose" to kill the child by abortion. But Isaiah's words declare the opposite: when one is your own flesh and blood, your obligations to that person increase, and you are all the more obliged to do them good.

Only when God's people are actively and generously living as the "People of Life" can the words of today's readings be fulfilled.

Faith Formation students in grades 1-5 will meet today at 9:30 Mass followed by class in the school until 11:30. There are no Faith Formation classes next week, February 15.







One sure proof that the "now" is so different from the "then" is the presence of so many blue screens in our world and what you see on them. While they are small on smart phones, they grow a bit larger on various "pads." But they reach the ultimate on those like the billboard-size screens available in stadiums and even in St. Peter's Square at the Vatican.



Technology is so much with us that we must scratch our heads to remember when it was not. Watching a toddler imitate his elders fingering the keys of a phone can make you laugh at first, and then perhaps later make you ponder what technology lies ahead for that tiny human being. "AI" may be antique by then.

It becomes a necessity to think about the place of religion in all of this, and of our place in the world as believers. The changes that will inevitably come our way might scare us into thinking faith and religion will become obsolete.

No worries! Once you come back to reality you will quickly notice that an awful lot of our fellow travelers are in dire need. That not limited to luxuries. The plain truth is that, as humans, we all need more than the basics of food, clothing, and shelter. Science cannot provide love. That is precisely where God and true religion enter the scene.

Nowadays we realize that there is a type of human pain that stretches beyond the obvious. Well past material needs. Sometimes that need is no more mysterious than having a fellow human being nearby who will listen to us.
