We all know Padre Pio's famous quote, "Pray, hope and don't worry." But do you know where it came from? Padre Pio learned these words from his friend Fr. Dolindo Ruotolo - a man Padre Pio called a living saint - and he said them often. It was his total surrender to the will of God that was the source of Padre Pio's spiritual strength.

Jesus gave Fr. Dolindo a novena for those who carry heavy burdens. He said, "Leave the care of your affairs to me and everything will be peaceful... I perform miracles in proportion to your full surrender to me... I sow treasure troves of graces when you are in the deepest poverty."

The surrender novena is nine days of prayer meditating on the words of Jesus to Fr. Dolindo, where we then pray "O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything," ten times.

Lent is the perfect time to surrender ourselves fully to God.

'Don't Be Written Off

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

The phrase "Mirror, Mirror on the Wall" is arguably one of the most recognizable lines in the English language, instantly conjuring images of the classic fairy tale, Snow White, but beyond its fairy tale origins, the phrase has permeated our culture, becoming a symbolic representation of vanity, self-perception, and the elusive search for objective truth.

We remember how the evil Queen asks the mirror who is the fairest in the kingdom. She reveals both her vanity and insecurity. The mirror's response dictates her emotional state, highlighting the dangerous dependence on external validation that many people experience. There is something of the queen in the main character Jesus met that day at Jacob's well when He stopped there for a rest. The unnamed Samaritan woman. She meets more than a mirror, but the very embodiment of all Truth in Jesus.

The dialogue between them makes for good drama. She plays little games with Jesus in her responses, but He will not allow it to go on before He confronts her with the whole truth of her present existence. But He does so with loving purpose. He wants to offer her a whole new way of being free from shame and half-truth about herself. She ultimately responds with the comfort and joy of knowing that Jesus is indeed a special Person, and one who loves her into being more of a person herself.

Allow me to choose just one conclusion from this story, namely that our Loving Lord always sees the possibilities in us, and never "writes us off" unless we choose to walk away. In that way, He is like water in the desert to slake our thirst for truth and a sense of purpose in our lives.

We do ourselves no favor if we insist on gripping about the trials of our lives, or blame God for their occurrence instead of either on sin in the world or our own failure to call on the grace of God readily available through prayer and the sacraments, especially in the Holy Mass.

God never holds up a magic mirror calculating how best to salve our occasional insecurity. Rather does He let us see the scars left behind on His loving Face from thorns that once dug into His skin. Or those left by nails and sword on His hands, feet, and side. Then we can note our part in His pain at the same time we experience His loving forgiveness.

Meanwhile, so live that when the priest has ended his remarks over your grave, those present will not think they have attended the wrong funeral. God love you and give you an honest self-perception.

Pick-up time is after 9:00 AM, with deliveries within the morning hours. We are currently in need of substitute drivers.

It is inspiring to see people come by to remember in prayer family members and friends whose names have been inscribed on the granite plaques and pavers placed on and around the cruciform structure.

In his comments that day, the Bishop described the memorial as "a garden of dedication and remembrance," calling it "a great gift" to the parish.

The garden is a spiritual oasis in the midst of a busy community. Benches on either side of the structure provide comfort to those who use the space as a place to reflect and pray.

SAINTS FUN FACTS

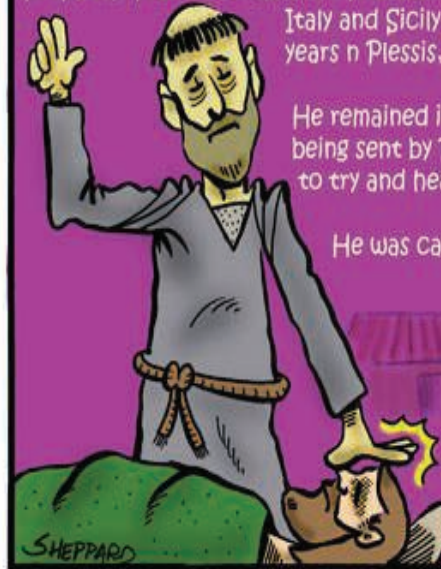
