The **SECOND COLLECTION** this weekend is the Catholic Communications Collection. Through websites, social networks, television, radio, and print, the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) helps the Church spread the Gospel message through the media locally and nationally. Half of all donations to the CCC collected in this diocese stay in our diocese to support our local communications needs, such as radio and television programming and diocesan publications.

Our Diaconate Formation Program provides support for men who feel "called" to the diaconate at all phases of their discernment. From inquiry through formation, we support and guide our candidates through four and one-half years of study, prayer, and discernment. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, those chosen to participate in the diaconate formation program, focus on the human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral dimensions of their development – all supported through gifts to the Annual Bishop's Appeal. We have fifteen men currently in the formation program with nine new applicants, who are hoping to start their formation journey in May 2026. We continue to support the newly ordained with three additional years of continuing formation focusing on Bishop Caggiano's vision of encounter and accompaniment with Jesus Christ through Truth, Goodness and Beauty. In total, we have 81 deacons in our diocese: 48 who are active and 33 retired, many who continue to serve in their parishes. "Through your donation to the Annual Bishop's Appeal, the financial burden of our formation program is minimized. This allows our deacon candidates to focus on their studies and discern their vocation in preparation for supporting our Bishop, the diocese and serving in their assigned parishes upon ordination and beyond." - Deacon John DiTaranto, Director of the Diaconate, currently serving at St. Stephen Parish, Trumbull. These **volunteer work days** bring neighbors and families of all ages together to help with ecological restoration efforts at our public preserves. This can look like native tree and shrub planting, invasive species removal, and trail maintenance. There is a task for everyone and no personal equipment is needed!

Our first Stewardship Sunday of the spring season on April 19 was a success! We partnered with Trout Unlimited to restore riverside habitat at Schenck's Island. **35 volunteers** showed up, despite the rainy forecast, and helped us clear out invasive Multiflora Rose, Winged Euonymus, and Garlic Mustard to **plant 40 native shrubs and trees!**

## ***What Does Prayer Provide? See Below***

### ***Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson***

Theology often reaches for the stars but sometimes cancels the trip because it gets lost in technical language that holds it back. To speak with any warmth about the great "Uncaused Cause" is not the language of poetry or song. So it is delightful for us to learn from Holy Scripture that our God is a loving family of Three Persons bound together by love. We hear about it and soon enough we not only long to be known by God but also to be loved by Him as well. Scripture tells us we are.

So it is that the original members of the Church had a certain confidence born from meeting and living with the risen Christ. When He promised them that He would send an Advocate, or Counselor, they automatically took Him at His word. So, what to do in the meantime? Pray.

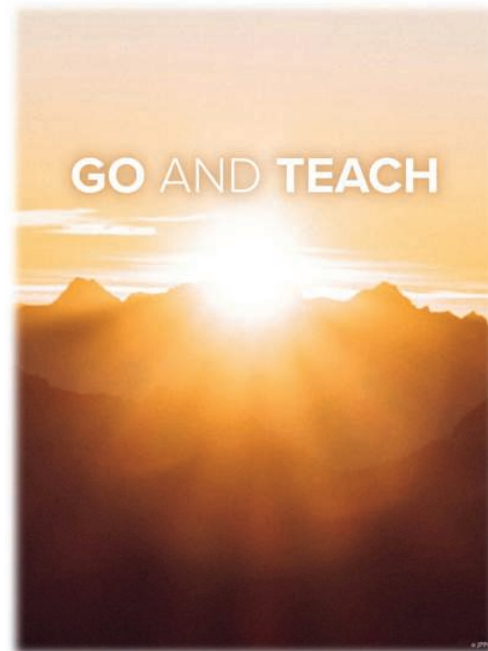
Ah, there it is, the one item we frequently forget about when we're in a difficult "place" in our lives, or when we have run out of our own resources to stay patient, hopeful, or confident.

Scholars of the Bible tell us, after reflecting on a passage like the one we hear today from John's Gospel, that to possess life is to know the living Trinity in a bond of love. But how do bonds of love form? How do friendships thrive and grow? By spending time with the other person. By experiencing all the twists and turns involved in living on this great blue ball spinning on its axis day after day with God at our center. That is the essence of prayer. We do it often with words but sometimes with our respectful silence. Considering who we are with, our very Savior, listening is more of a priority than any of our talk.

In this world of talk all around us, available "24/7/365," as they say, you might think listening is not important, or maybe a non-productive exercise in futility. What does the psalmist have God say? "Be still and know that I am God." Turn off the big turntable of distraction and the smaller one of "ego" that makes us off-center. Stop what you're doing and be "in the tent" with God as Moses was in the Exodus. Set aside perhaps 15 minutes to start and decide that in your day, "this belongs to God." Let it become a habit. It will keep you focused and calm at your center over time.

I note that our local PBS radio station offers a meditation time every day at 11:00 AM. That is the idea. Even if 11:00 AM might not be your best time, it shows that the producers of the program honor the habit of stopping the rush and being a thoughtful and loving person with God as your companion. The gathering of the Apostles with Mary and some other devoted women in that Upper Room as a unified family reflects the family oneness of the three Divine Persons. Today the Third Person comes to them with sound and power, signifying everything they need to know. And they rejoice in a rare peace through something called "prayer."

"Prayer provides power, poise, peace, and purpose."



### **THOSE WHO MOURN**

Mourning is a significant experience for teenagers, impacting their mental health and overall well-being. According to the Society of Pediatric Psychology, an estimated 1 out of 14 children in the U.S. will experience the death of a parent or sibling before they reach the age of 18. This loss can lead to emotional fluctuations, social withdrawal, and academic challenges. The second Beatitude teaches that mourning is a path to divine comfort and healing. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, mourning allows individuals to experience God's mercy and find solace in His love. No one wishes the pain of grief on anyone else. The garden is a spiritual oasis in the midst of a busy community. Benches on either side of the structure provide comfort to those who use the space as a place to reflect and pray.

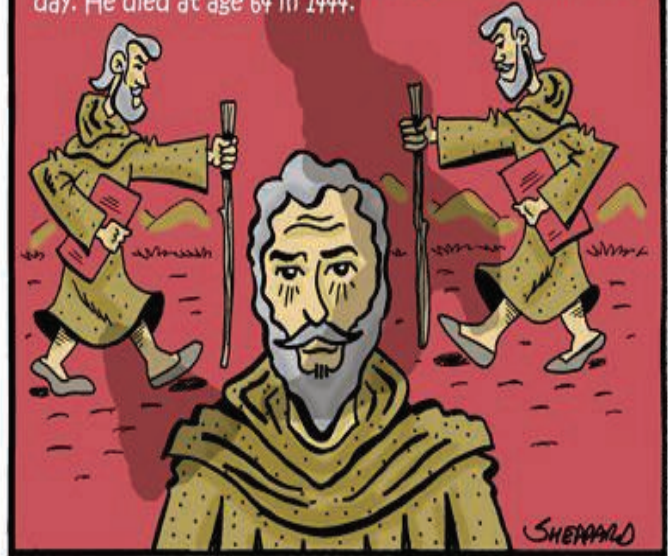

St. Bernardine worked in the largest hospital in Siena, caring for plague victims, giving his all in this task. After then caring for a sick relative, Bernardine joined the Franciscans and was ordained in 1404.

He criss crossed Italy on foot, preaching several times a day. He died at age 64 in 1444.
