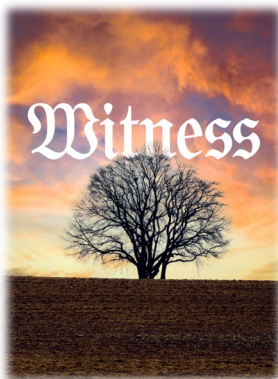

Christ Yes! Sisyphus No!

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

The Sisyphus legend is a Greek myth about a cunning king condemned to an eternal punishment: endlessly pushing a boulder up a hill, only for it to roll back down every time he nears the top. Sisyphus was punished for betraying the god Zeus by revealing the whereabouts of Zeus' kidnapped daughter, and for cheating death twice, most notably by chaining Thanatos (Death). The term "Sisyphean task" now describes any repetitive, frustrating, or impossible labor. Or any job that demands perseverance to accomplish.



Living a true Christian life can sometimes seem like a "Sisyphean task" does it not? We make good progress for a while. We are on good terms with Christ. Our attitude is positive, and life is good. Then, suddenly, we fall back and lose ground. All that takes is a thought, word, or action contrary to what Christ expects of us. One "drink too many" at a party. One lie added to the story to make it more impressive. One impure thought not dismissed because we like the picture. The confessional beckons but we let it pass. Maybe we're just too lazy or ashamed to make an appointment with the priest to be reconciled with the Lord we have

offended.

This is exactly where the difference comes in between the punishment given to King Sisyphus and the opportunity given us by Christ our King.

You see, we Christians believe ourselves to have a baptismal call to think, believe and behave in a certain way. It is not a punishment, but instead, a way to prove our love for someone who has first loved us. God Himself. He is who has created us out of nothing, believing that His Kingdom would be incomplete without us in it. One who also promises a life of unending happiness after this brief testing time here on earth.

The arrogant King Sisyphus chose to go his own way, despite what he knew to be right. He set up his fate without knowing what it would entail. He is part of a myth meant to teach. We humble Christian believers instead choose to go Christ's way, and despite our weakness in choosing occasional detours, lovingly teach it to each new generation. Our perseverance profits us from a peace this world cannot bring and lets us believe in ourselves as well.

The Vatican Dicastery for Communication has released [a new documentary titled "Leo from Chicago,"](#) which delves into the early life and priestly journey of Pope Leo XIV, born Robert Francis Prevost, and the deep family and cultural roots that shaped his vocation.

[According to Vatican News,](#) the production includes "interviews, footage, and images that trace the history and explore the roots of Robert Francis Prevost in his native United States." The film highlights the Pope's formative years growing up in Chicago and features "in-depth interviews with Louis and John Prevost,"

who offer a rare glimpse into the family life of the future pontiff.

The documentary is the result of a collaboration among Vatican journalists Deborah Castellano Lubov, Salvatore Cernuzio, and Felipe Herrera-Espaliat, who sought to show the human and spiritual foundations of the man now leading the Catholic Church.

"*Leo from Chicago*" paints a portrait of Pope Leo XIV not just as a global religious leader, but as a son of America—formed by the faith, service, and multicultural character of his Chicago upbringing. Through personal testimonies and historical reflections, the film reminds viewers that every vocation begins in a particular home and community, where love for God first takes root.

According to *Vatican News*, the Dicastery's aim with this film is to "trace the history" and share the story of how those humble beginnings shaped Pope Leo XIV's compassion, leadership, and vision for a Church rooted in dialogue and humanity.

The documentary invites Catholics around the world to see the Holy Father through the lens of his origins—a shepherd from Chicago now guiding the universal Church.



Stop and Say a Prayer Here

It's five years since Bishop Frank Caggiano came to Our Lady of Fatima parish on Aug. 15, 2020 to bless and dedicate our Philip Tai Lauria Memorial/Prayer Garden. It is inspiring to see people come by to remember in prayer family members and friends whose names have been inscribed on the granite plaques and pavers placed on and around the cruciform structure.

In his comments that day, the Bishop described the memorial as "a garden of dedication and remembrance," calling it "a great gift" to the parish.

The garden is a spiritual oasis in the midst of a busy community. Benches on either side of the structure provide comfort to those who use the space as a place to reflect and pray.

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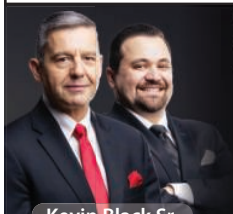
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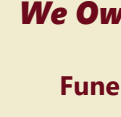
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
