Let's Renew Our Love of Family

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

I suppose it's something that comes naturally when today's Feast of the Holy Family rolls around. Many people start making a "Compare and Contrast List" of their own clan with that of the Holy Trio and conclude with an obvious difference or two...that, in fact, is precisely our Church does *not* want us to do.



It brings to mind a clever joke the late wise and witty Fr. Benedict Groeschel once told a group of priests on retreat, as he was praising the humility of St. Joseph. He said, "Imagine the strain on good St. Joseph coming to the breakfast table with the Divine Redeemer and the Mediatrix of all Graces!!"

It is true that at this time of the year, beginning with Thanksgiving and continuing with Christmas, we see more of our families and perhaps interact with them more than during another time of the year. So, we see them "close up and personal." We might just see flaws not noted before. But this feast points to the profound reality of God's choice to love all of us just as we are and not as we should be.

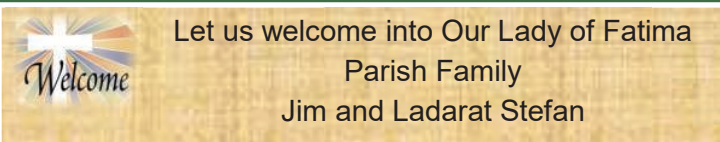
What that decision implies for me is no less than God's astounding humility. He could have said, "I'll only love you if you're perfect." Furthermore, the Gospel tells us that for the first three decades of His time on earth, our Lord subjected Himself to two imperfect creatures as parents in a dusty backwater named Nazareth. That last was no badge of honor when He came to preach to His chosen people. Yet the name of that very town was acknowledged on the sign Pilate had made to hang above our

Savior's sacred Head on the cross.

It became quite natural for the Church Jesus founded to be a family of families, but that immediately meant there would be problems and disagreements from time to time. So, it is for each of our parishes. So, it is for the universal Church. A union of hearts and souls, saints and sinners, under the successor of Peter whom we call "Papa," the "Holy Father," the pope.

This feast urges us to renew our love of family, with forgiveness of past hurts, and to celebrate present joys, and to support each other on the path to heaven. And to find humor. On that score, it seems that hubby came home from work, tired and bedraggled. As he entered the door, he moaned: "Honey, I've had a tough day. If you have any bad news, please keep it until later this evening." "O.K." she chirped. "No bad news. But I have some good news. At last count, we had three kids, remember? Well, two of them did not break their arm today."

God love you and enjoy your family.



Our minds often tend to consider Dec. 25 as the end of Christmas, but on the Church calendar, it's just starting. December 25 to January 5 is recognized as the twelve days of Christmas, ending the day before the Epiphany when we remember the Wise Men's visit to worship the Christ Child.

We can easily pass through these twelve days without much thought when the excitement and exhaustion of Christmas set in. The sometimes dreary days of winter mix with a time of reflection on the past year and the wonder of a new one. It's easy to take a bit of a break in our usual faith strengthening way and routines. Keep focused on God's words and ways.

It's five years since Bishop Frank Caggiano came to Our Lady of Fatima parish on Aug. 15, 2020 to bless and dedicate our Philip Tai Lauria Memorial/Prayer Garden. It is inspiring to see people come by to remember in prayer family members and friends whose names have been inscribed on the granite plaques and pavers placed on and around the cruciform structure.

In his comments that day, the Bishop described the memorial as "a garden of dedication and remembrance," calling it "a great gift" to the parish.

The garden is a spiritual oasis in the midst of a busy community. Benches on either side of the structure provide comfort to those who use the space as a place to reflect and pray.

SAINTS FUN FACTS

Saint Thomas Becket was born and raised in England. Involved in hunting and falconry as a youth, on one occasion he dove into the river saving his expensive falcon who had chased a duck under water. He became the Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162 and was assassinated by knights on orders from King Henry II due to a rift between the church and state.
