

Ash Wednesday is Feb. 22. Masses are 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. Scripture services are at 12:15 p.m. and 4 p.m. Ashes will be distributed at all. Fr. Reggie will also be at the Wilton train station to give out ashes at 7 a.m. Wearing ashes on one's forehead until they wear off of their own accord echoes ancient practice of penance. Just think of all the brand names you wear so proudly on your shirt that allow you to be defined—walk proudly with the cross of ashes as a reminder of a deeper identity. Look inward and take stock!



Stations of the Cross will begin on Friday, February 24th. Stations are a spiritual devotion that dates back to the 15th century. They are a spiritual pilgrimage of prayers and meditations on the chief scenes of Christ's suffering and death. They are prayed in the spirit of reparation for the sufferings and insults Jesus endured during His passion. The Stations have remained universally throughout the ages not because they concentrate on suffering, but because they give us a model of how to live life when our suffering is unavoidable & life seems most impossible. During Lent, we are encouraged to join together in community to pray the Stations: beginning **Friday, February, 24, at 7 p.m. and Friday, March 3 at 3 p.m.** They will continue to alternate through Lent offering everyone a chance to attend.



Douglass escaped from American slavery in 1838. He became a renowned abolitionist, speaker, and writer. He wrote several books, including A Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass, an American Slave.

### Lenten Norms

**FAST AND ABSTINENCE:** Catholics over the age of 14 years are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and every Friday. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required by Church law to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is permitted to persons in this age group on those two days, plus two lighter meals. In the case of children, under the age of 14, the Church recommends that parents encourage them to perform some kind of voluntary penance suitable for their age. **Here are some outside of the box ideas to consider taking up or giving up during Lent**

Don't take the best spot in the parking lot

Make your bed every day or before you leave your room or make someone else's bed!

Don't leave dishes in the sink overnight

Go to Mass once per week in addition to Sunday



## ***What Does Love Really Mean? .Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson***

Astronomers tell us the universe is expanding. Economists tell us the marketplace is expanding. Often enough, our pants tell us that our waistline is expanding. Expansion seems to be everywhere. What we don't often advert to is the same applies to language, especially our own English tongue.

One area of language where expansion is obvious is found in our slang. Slang adds to the dictionary quite often. Here we see words take on an expanded meaning that eventually becomes a complete alteration of the original. Remember how years ago "bread" became money? Or "lame" became weak, as in a "lame" joke? Or how "solid" lost its connection with density, and became the measure of a favor or good deed? These confusing days we note how "woke" has little to do with being awakened, but is used rather to denigrate verities of the recent past.



One slang word with a longer history of expansion that breaks the mold is the word "cool." Even so-called educated people will pronounce a happening, or a brand of car, or a pair of sunglasses as being "cool" and when they do so they are not thinking of the air temperature. All of these references are meant to make you think about "expansion" as either a good or bad thing in dictionary terms.

Jesus, we know and believe is the Word of God. The final statement of the Father and Holy Spirit about what is really the Truth and the Life. We certainly relearn this weekend about the expanded meaning Jesus gave to the word "love." He certainly ought to know it. St. John wrote centuries ago that GOD IS LOVE. (underlined and in upper case). So when He orders us to "love our neighbor as ourselves," He is certainly speaking about something beyond affection for vacation days, or favorite foods, or romantic love or patriotic love or other meanings of the word.

Unfortunately, our beloved English language only offers one little word to express a veritable truckload of meanings. Here Our Lord is actually saying love is an act of the will in which we will the good for our neighbor. At the same time He expanded the meaning of "neighbor." Such means I harbor no grievances against him or her. Certainly no rash judgment of his or her, generating gossip. In short, doing nothing that we would not like directed our way.

I daresay the disregard of this particular command is a popular cause of our disobedience to the Lord, as evidenced by sins heard in the confessional. So, this early in 2023, and a few days before Lent begins, the Gospel today provides advice about a possible resolution most of us could make for the upcoming season. We have the power to bring expansion to the list of the saints. By the way, be encouraged by this, one of the clearest definitions of a saint that I have seen: *"A saint is a dead sinner, revised and edited."*



**Bishop: Memorial Garden 'a great gift'**

August 15, 2020 marked two years since Bishop Frank Caggiano came to Our Lady of Fatima parish to bless and dedicate our Philip Tai Lauria Memorial/Prayer Garden. It is inspiring to see people come by to remember in prayer family members and friends whose names have been inscribed on the granite plaques and pavers placed on and around the cruciform structure.

In his comments that day, the Bishop described the memorial as "a garden of dedication and remembrance," calling it "a great gift" to the parish.

The garden is a spiritual oasis in the midst of a busy community. Benches on either side of the structure provide comfort to those who use the space as a place to reflect and pray.


