St. Joseph's 87th annual 4th of July celebration

Clarion County's oldest Independence Day celebration is being held on July 4 on the St. Joseph Parish grounds, 119 Rectory Lane, Lucinda, located off I-80, exit 60. This event will be canopy covered and handicap accessible with a parking shuttle available. It will be held from 11 a.m. – 4 p.m. There will be live entertainment, festival food, homemade pies and soup with their famous homemade noodles and a traditional all-you-can-eat chicken or ham dinner. The dining room will be serving from 11 a.m.- 3 p.m. Take-out orders from 11 a.m.- 2 p.m. Meal tickets are \$14 for adults, \$7 for children 6-12 and children under 6 are free. Games of skill and chance will be available for all ages, a bingo, over \$40,000 in cash and prizes, many homemade quilts, a \$5000 grand prize and more.
