## DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

Events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program, individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number, dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Spayed and neutered dogs are eligible to participate in CAT and Fast CAT. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate. Dogs that are physically challenged due to loss of limbs are eligible to enter and should be given the same consideration by the inspection committee as four-legged dogs. A dog that exhibits a state of well-being at the time of inspection, shows no signs of physical discomfort, and in the opinion of the inspection committee appears to physically have the potential to safely complete the course, is to be considered fit to participate. For safety purposes, any dog requiring an assistance apparatus, such as a wheeled cart will not be allowed to participate. Bitches in season may not participate. A dog may enter only once per event. (An event is defined by an event number.)

Dogs may be excused from the course by the Huntmaster in a Fast CAT event for excessively delaying the course, being found unfit to compete, interference with the course in progress by the owner or handler, or not being ready to run when called to the line. Dogs must be given 5 minutes grace time to arrive to the line when called. When a dog is excused during a CAT event, the judge shall immediately inform the Huntmaster. Dogs excused shall be considered as a scratch.

The Event Committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive dogs. The Event Committee reserves the right to alter the track as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the event.

#### **ENTRY FEES PER DAY** (includes a \$3.50 AKC recording Fee)

**No entries will be accepted by phone, email, or fax, and no hand delivery please.** Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

**Illegible entries** will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. **Returned checks** do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each invalid check.

**Refunds:** No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. However, the club reserves the right to alter this policy due to current events. If the trial is cancelled due to public health guidelines, you will receive a full refund.

Dogs determined to be lame or unfit to participate by the Inspection Committee, owner or agent at the time of roll call or upon previous notification by the owner or agent. These dogs shall be barred from participating and their entry fees shall be refunded in full.

Bitches in season may not participate, or bitches which come in season after the close of entries, shall be barred from participating in the test and their entry fees shall be refunded in full. Notification to the Secretary of bitches in season, must be made before or during the roll call. A note from a veterinarian is not required.

#### **RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES**

Fast CAT is a pass/fail event. In order to pass, the dog must complete the course without interruption. A dog is considered to have failed the test if it relieves itself prior to the finish line. The time ends when the dog crosses the finish line.

After a dog completes the course, the time is recorded then is converted to MPH. A dog's 100-yard dash time must be converted into MPH using the formula below, rounded to the nearest hundredth of a mile:



$\frac{204.545}{\text{dog's time}} = \text{MPH}$
--

Example: The dog's time is 8.14 seconds.

$$204.545 / 8.14 = 25.13 \text{ MPH}$$

$\frac{204.545}{8.14} = 25.13$

A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:

- 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0.
- 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5.
- Below 12" = handicap is 2.0.

MPH multiplied by a dog's handicap = Points

Example:

A dog taller than 18" runs 9.09 seconds, the MPH = 22.50 so this dog earned 22.50 points.  $22.50 \text{ MPH} \times 1 = \mathbf{22.50 \text{ POINTS}}$

Each dog that completes the 100-yard dash will receive a qualifying run ribbon. Ribbons shall be light blue in color.

A New Title rosette will be available to all dog and handler teams finishing a title at these trials. You may pick up titling ribbons immediately upon completion.

Titles are earned by accumulating points. The following titles will be awarded:

BCAT = 150 points; DCAT = 500 points; FCAT = 1,000 points

FCAT# = for every additional 500 points earned after earning an FCAT title a number will follow. (e.g. FCAT<sub>2</sub>)

## NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

A **preliminary confirmation** will be sent once your entry is received. A final confirmation with trial details will be sent out at the beginning of the week before the trial.

Two separate events are being offered each day and will run concurrently.

You must provide two leashes for your dog: one to hold your dog and one to catch your dog. Please arrange for someone to either release or catch your dog, since you cannot be in two different places 100 yards apart. There will be dog holders/releasers, known as slippers at the staging area. Be sure your dog can be caught at the end of the course. Exhibitors should be familiar with all AKC Fast CAT rules prior to running. The Event Chairperson will have a complete copy of the rules available at the event site. Toys and treats may be in the catch area, out of sight, until the dog crosses the line.

## SAFETY, BEHAVIOR, AND LIABILITY

The **safety of the dog** is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The South Coast Vizsla Club ("the club") and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The club



reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the club or any official thereof.

**Collars, Leashes and Harnesses:** Dogs may wear any collar except a choker collar, a collar with prongs or an electronic training collar. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung up on something during the run. The event committee at its discretion may require tags hanging from the collar to be secured to ensure the dog's safety. Owners should be aware that there is a chance that tags hanging from the collar could become entangled on something during the run. If owners are concerned, tags may be taped to the collar. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog with regard to the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog. Head halters, such as the Gentle Leader or Halti, may be used on the grounds but must not be worn while running the course. Dogs may be muzzled at the owner's discretion. Muzzles must not have sharp, hard edges and must allow the dog to breathe.

**Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s).** Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

**Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.**

**Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.**

# AKC® Code of Sportsmanship and Civility

Preface: The tradition of competitive purebred dog events predates 1884—the year the American Kennel Club (AKC®) was founded. Those involved in these sports share core values, including a strong commitment to sportsmanship and a welcoming, respectful culture that embraces the diverse community united by a love of dogs.

These values are evident across all aspects of the sport: conformation, performance, companion, and family dog activities. Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.
