For the 2024-2025 academic year, all nine high school seniors graduated. Eight entered university, and one chose to pursue education independently. Every House of Grace girl is continuing her education through university, vocation, or independent study.

Thirty girls from House of Grace–Thailand and Ghana are studying at universities, technical colleges, and senior high schools, while living off campus. This milestone reflects their growing independence, resilience, and commitment to building brighter futures.

Led by alumnae who work with Ezekiel Rain, the training equipped them to recognize hidden emotional wounds in themselves and to respond to children with deeper empathy and understanding.

Global Servants believes in providing resources for the ongoing success of the people and communities we serve. For nearly 50 years, Global Servants has resourced pastors, churches, schools, at-risk girls, rural villages, and even local government agencies with tools to succeed and flourish in their communities.

FAMILIES REACHED WITH EMERGENCY RELIEF IN FLOOD-AFFECTED AREAS.

During monsoon flooding from August to October 2024, House of Grace—Thailand staff and older girls delivered emergency supplies and helped clean homes and community spaces, bringing hope and relief to more than 240 families in Thailand and Myanmar.

Health professionals provided screenings, disease-prevention education, nutrition guidance, and personal care. These vital services strengthened community health, relieved financial burdens, and showed God’s love in practical ways to those who could not otherwise afford care.

After advocating for better conditions, the House of Grace-Ghana girls prompted action. Mrs. Comfort Odarno coordinated with a welder to install as many clothes lines as the allocated budget allowed. All dorm students now have a hygienic, reliable place to dry laundry.

Impacting Ofosu, Dambai, and Larabanga*—site of West Africa’s oldest mosque, these wells provide access to clean drinking water for *all* people in these communities and improve daily health and hygiene practices.

**The Larabanga well is currently operational by generator and will be fully commissioned once permanent power is connected.*

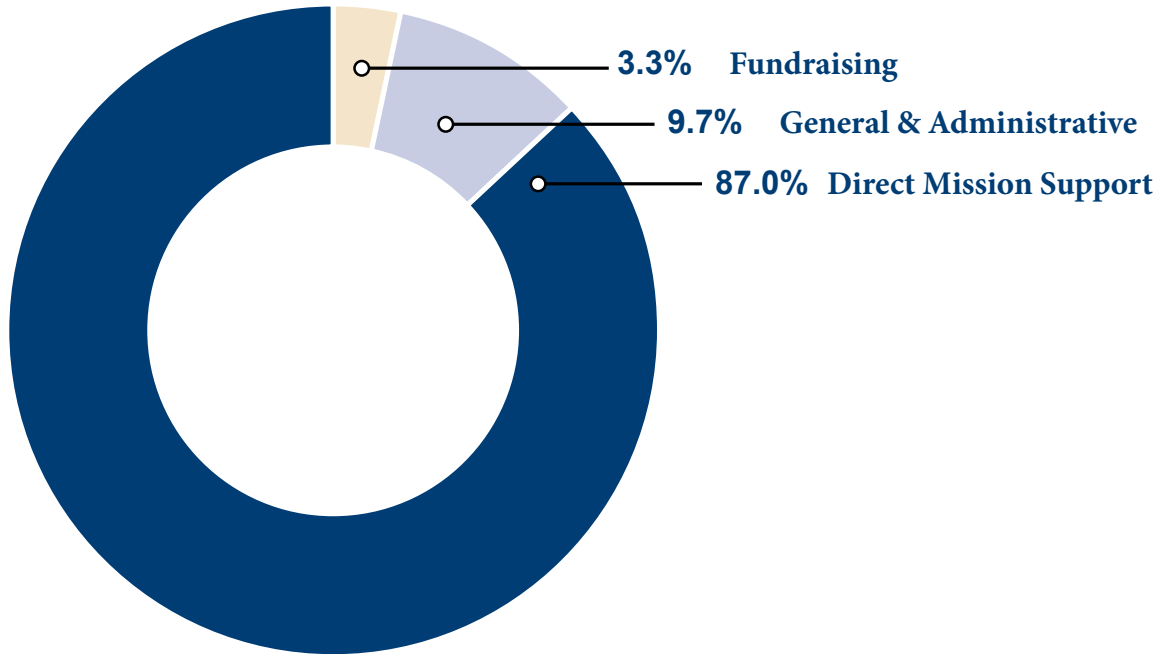

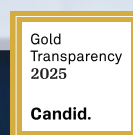
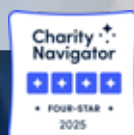
