On **Friday, March 18th**, the Spotlight hosted the **Borough of Broxbourne Community Awards**. Invited guests enjoyed a 3-course meal, with free wine before the presentation of the awards, and a lively, local band, 'The Travelling Ding-Dangs', entertained throughout the rest of the evening.

Among the award winners was **Tony Cox, Secretary of Love Hoddesdon,** who has made an outstanding contribution to the community in Hoddesdon during the two years of the Covid restrictions, producing daily bulletins at the peak of the pandemic and co-ordinating information and advice for local businesses. The nine **Trustees of Lowewood Museum** also received an award for their intensive work in setting up the Trust and re-opening the museum.

**On Sunday, March 20th, Mayhem Theatre Arts** took over the Spotlight for one of its annual Drama and Musical Theatre shows '**From Page To Stage**', which showcased a cast of more than eighty young performers, aged from four to teens, in excerpts from some of the great musicals, including 42nd St, Fame, Matilda and Les Mis.

# What's Different at the Spotlight?

Much of the old, mellow brickwork has been boarded over and painted in minimalist, fashionable grey, which looks very bright and clean, if a little cold and lacking in atmosphere. There's a new, slightly *smaller* box office and some wall-mounted

screens for digital, roll-over advertising, to replace much of the hard-copy posters and flyers.

An odd sofa or two, contemporary chairs, stools and a booth have replaced the old, fixed bench seating in the foyer. The Dinant room has been redecorated (in grey) and the auditorium now has a black ceiling and some new carpet at the edges of the seating area. There's a new projector screen up-stage, but the *main* cine-screen is still awaiting repair. A projector screen is available for the Bar and Dinant room.

One of the key, new members of staff has a 'theatre' background, so, perhaps, a better understanding of the realities of presenting live events and attracting audiences!

Major events in history are usually recorded 'officially' to put a country and its leaders in an appropriately *favourable* perspective, but the ordinary people who live through them may have a very different view. "*History is a set of lies that people have agreed upon*," Napoleon.

Letters, diaries, poetry, pictures and all kinds of memorabilia may cover other events, too, and present a more rounded view of an era that becomes increasingly significant over time, but such items from ordinary people are often poorly represented in collections.

What can *you* remember of the years from 1952? Some items of food were still *rationed* then....a loaf of bread was 4d, wages for a man averaged at £8 a week and just £4 for females ....TV was a novelty in black and white.

In the 1960s 'Tiny Tears' dolls were all the rage, people were still living in pre-fabs, there was a shortage of teachers, England won the World Cup... a man first walked on the moon... .Music and fashion could somehow encapsulate the mood of a time... Remember Rock and Roll, Teddy boys, the Twist, miniskirts, maxi-skirts, flower-power and platform soles?


