Look Out For BArts' New Programme!


With this issue, we are gradually creeping back to pre-pandemic days and offering a short form of our twice-a-year programme.










Hoddesdon Floral Art Society

particularly in troubled times.







Lowewood Museum Trust Holds Its First A.G.M.

September 21st was a 'red letter day' for Lowewood Museum. For the first time *ever*, all *nine* trustees were in the same room


together! Since the formation of the trust, some meetings have had to be by Zoom, others have been 'hybrid' ie part live, part Zoom, so it was good to be face to face at last.

In spite of some serious setbacks—Covid, dry rot in the building and staffing issues—Chairman, David Dent, was able to report a successful first year, with a variety of exhibitions and special interest days attracting a substantial number of visitors of all ages. Although currently open only two days a week, the shop and café's income has exceeded all expectations and several successful funding applications plus donations have enabled some long-term planning.

The enthusiasm and dedication of around fifty volunteers, together with the skilled staff and trustees and the sponsorship of Morrisons bodes well for the future.



In 1253, King Henry III granted a charter for Hoddesdon to hold a market and an annual fair. Although both have appeared in various different forms over the centuries, it is from this charter that we still enjoy our Wednesday and Friday markets today.

Love Hoddesdon has commissioned a special commemorative plaque to be installed in the town centre, and there will be a ceremony of dedication and a performance by children of St. Catherine's School . The Town Crier will be in attendance to carry out his traditional

duties; street organ music and some vintage cars will also contribute to the occasion.

Sunset Waltham Cross Studios

Outline planning permission has now been *granted* for the construction of the first expansion of the Sunset Studios platform outside of the United States. This world-class studio for film, television and digital production. will occupy a 91acre site to the west of Waltham Cross, close to the M25 junction and become a strategic employment site for the Borough of Broxbourne, with the anticipated creation of over 4,800 jobs and a contribution of more than £300million to the local economy annually. Set to become one of the 'greenest' studios in the UK, Sunset Waltham Cross Studios will have energy efficiency and biodiversity central to its design and development.

The original Sunset Studio was founded in 1911, on the corner of Sunset Boulevard in Hollywood and remains the largest independent studio in Hollywood.
