
BArts presents The Lord Chamberlain's Men in "Romeo and Juliet" by William Shakespeare, Outdoor Theatre in The Spotlight Gardens The Lord Chamberlain's Men invite you to join them this summer for the timeless and classic love story, *Romeo and Juliet*. With a history stretching back to William Shakespeare himself they present this great play as it was first seen, in

the open air, with an all male cast and Elizabethan costumes, music and dance.

In the last three years of the C16, the Lord Chamberlain's Men became Shakespeare's most important company. He was their foremost dramatist and performed numerous parts on stage, too. The company's main theatre was the Globe, but they performed for Queen Elizabeth at court

and also went on tour. Women were not allowed to appear on stage at this time, so all parts were played by men; young boys whose voices hadn't yet broken played the young women.






