The Next Step in the Arts, Culture and Heritage Strategy



A new post as a *temporary*, part-time Arts Development Officer for the Borough of Broxbourne is being advertised at a salary of £15,000 pa for 22 hours over a three day week. **Closing date for applications is December 10th.**

This is a tentative step in the right direction, but, sadly, isn't likely to be adequate to cover all the aspects of Arts, Culture and Heritage that have had a low priority for many years. Unlike so many other posts in local authorities, which require mainly competent clerical and management skills, Arts, Culture and Heritage really needs someone with in-depth knowledge and an *enthusiasm* for the Arts.. and this will be much harder to find.




