CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm.** Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest.

Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly **call (408) 966-4612**. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

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GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

In St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, it states "If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is there are many parts, yet one body" (1 COR 12:18-20).

What does this teach us as Christian stewards? It shows us that we all have equal dignity and worth in God's sight, and that if God sees us as equally precious, we should view each other in this same light. It teaches us to humbly recognize our own gifts as well as the giftedness of every member of our parish family. And, while God designed us to be ultimately dependent on Him, it seems He has also designed us to need each other!

This is part of the beauty and richness of a stewardship way of life. No one person can "do it all" in life — whether in family life or parish life. But God does not ask us to do it all. He simply asks us to share the gifts and talents we do have in the season of life we find ourselves right now.

It might feel uncomfortable at first. But the good news is you don't have to do it all. Do your part, let your brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ do theirs, and know that the Spirit of the Lord is upon us all as we live out this stewardship way of life.

From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear St. John the Baptist Parishioners:

The New Year has dawned upon us and we give thanks to God for a year of anticipated grace-filled HOPE. The Diocese of San Jose has gone full-blast in the implementation of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan, ***Renewed in Christ, Together in Mission***, I feel incredibly blessed to see how so many of you are growing in your relationship with Christ and sharing His presence and love daily in our parish family. Next weekend, February 1-2, 2025, the Diocese will launch the **Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA)**.

In this Jubilee Year of Hope declared by Pope Francis, I invite you to reflect on the ways you can contribute to the spiritual renewal of our parish family and our wider community through the **ADA** this year working on **spiritual renewal** individually and as a faith community. **"Supporting Our Mission Together"** through our generosity to the ADA, we support vital diocesan ministries that bring hope and healing to those in need in Santa Clara Valley, and by strengthening families, religious vocations, and formation for future generations as we grow in faith, love, and service in ways that are not possible for our parish on its own.

In addition to this, your gift provides essential support for our parish needs, as all funds collected above our parish goal of \$250,000 will be rebated directly back to our parish to strengthen and build our Parish and our different ministries. In 2024, through your collective generosity, our Parish received a rebate of \$143,129. It was a great help to augment our parish operating budget, given our shortfall during the pandemic years. This year, the ADA rebate will be used to support various important ministries of the parish, including funding programs that implement the Diocesan Pastoral Plan (*Worship, Outreach, Formation, Youth and Young Adults, Family Ministry, and Structural Renewal*) and maintaining the upkeep of our Church. These efforts, I hope, will bring spiritual renewal and strengthen the faith of all our parishioners. We pledge to continue to be wise stewards of the resources you entrust to us.

My sincere thanks to each of you who have already made your commitment to this year's appeal. If you have not had the opportunity to do so, please prayerfully consider how you can support Christ's mission in the Church by making a gift to the Annual Diocesan Appeal in love and gratitude for all the ways that God has blessed you. Your gift, no matter the size, helps us build up the Body of Christ both here in our parish and throughout the diocese.

I am deeply grateful for your witness and generosity. Be assured of my prayers for you and your family.

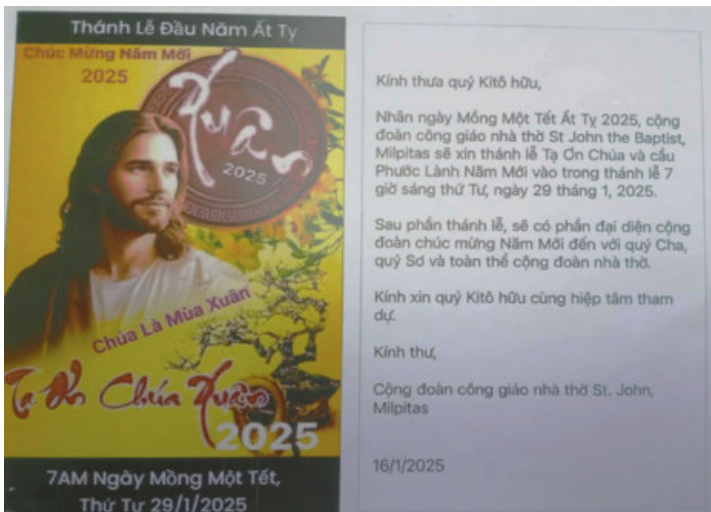
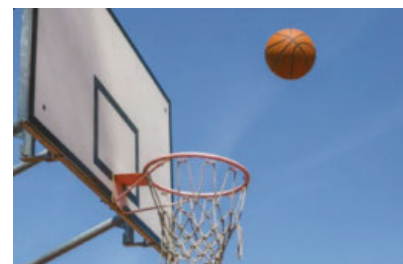


Knights of Columbus sponsors a
