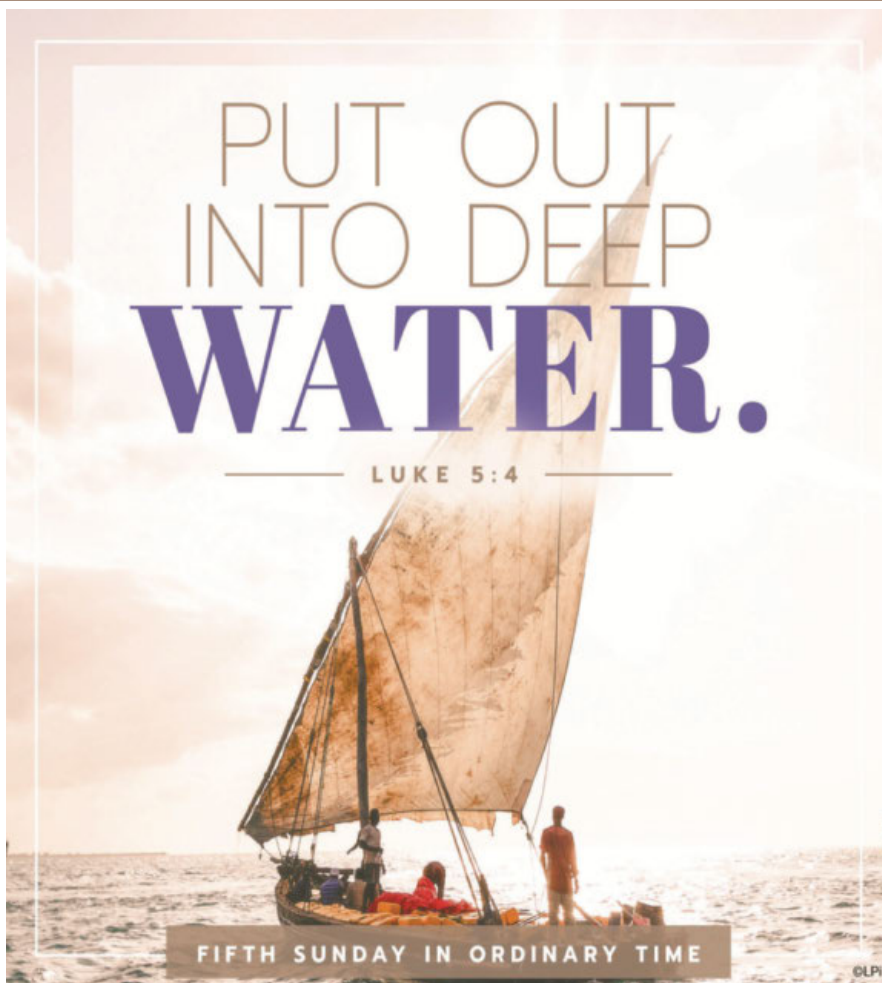

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm**. Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest.

Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly **call (408) 966-4612**. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

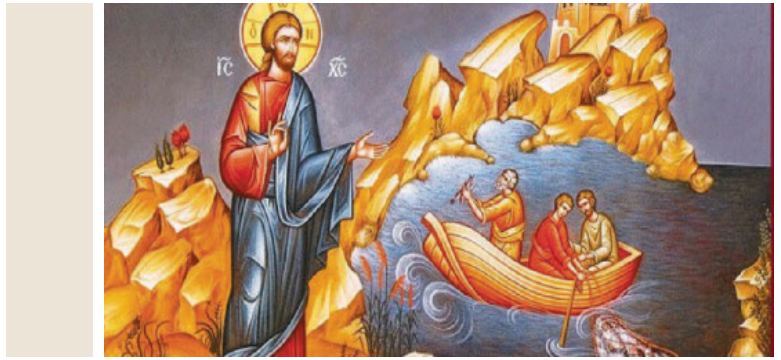

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Our readings today remind us of the great privilege we have
in calling ourselves both children and disciples of the Most
High God.

The First Reading from Isaiah describes a vision of the
prophet in which angels surround the Lord proclaiming,
"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled
with his glory!" Our God invites us to such deep intimacy
and friendship with Him that sometimes we can forget just
how majestic and unspeakably holy He truly is.

In the Gospel passage, from Luke, Jesus instructs Simon to
lower his nets for a catch despite an unsuccessful night of
fishing. Peter is skeptical but obeys and is amazed at the
catch of fish that he makes. He kneels down before Jesus in
astonishment.

This sense of awe and reverence before God should motivate
us to deepen our stewardship way of life. As we contemplate
the holiness of God, we come to a heightened awareness of
what a privilege it is that He has chosen to include us in His
work of spreading the Gospel to others through the grateful
sharing of the gifts He has given us. Aware of this privilege,
we will then make the words of Isaiah our own: "Here I am
Lord, send me!"

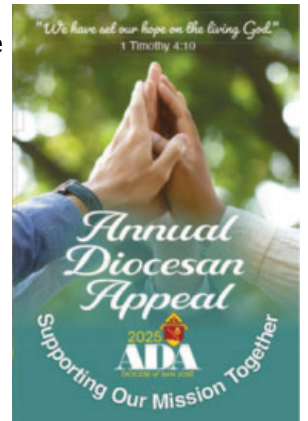
