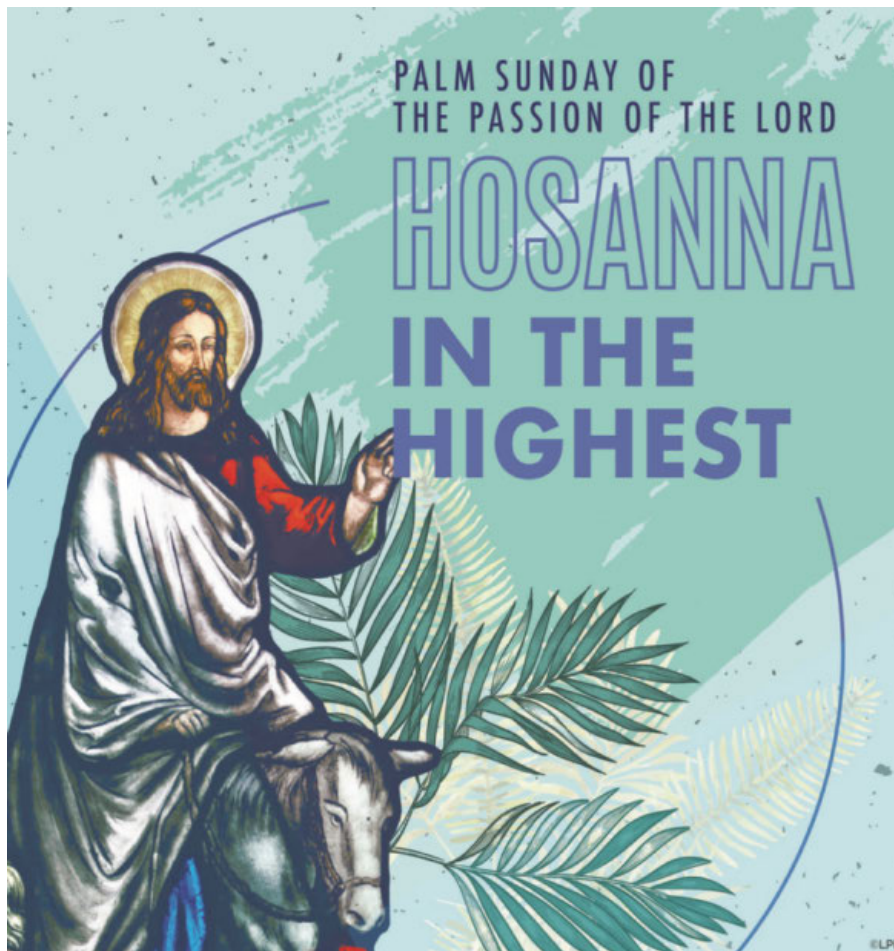

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm.** Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

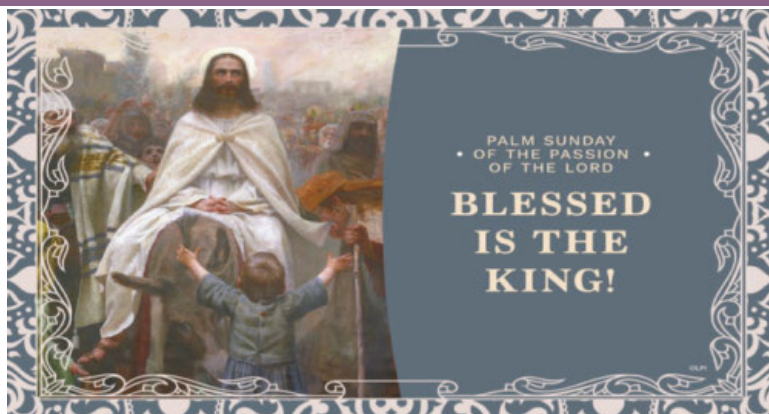

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Two very different responses to our Lord's passion are highlighted during the Gospel reading from Luke today: the response of Simon of Cyrene and the response of Jesus' acquaintances. Of Simon we are told, "They took hold of a certain Simon, a Cyrenian, who was coming in from the country; and after laying the cross on him, they made him carry it behind Jesus." Whether Simon entered willingly and compassionately into this service or whether he took up the Cross of Christ with a grudge, we don't know. What we do know is this: Simon did his part faithfully. He stayed near to Christ, carrying the Cross until our Lord reached Golgotha, the site of His crucifixion. We also know that Simon's family was among the first of the early Christians. Staying near to Christ, embracing the Cross (quite literally), transformed his life and the life of his family.

In contrast, near the end of this Gospel account, we are told of another reaction to Jesus' passion and death, namely that "all His acquaintances stood at a distance." They knew Jesus! They had heard him preaching and teaching, witnessed His signs and miracles, maybe even benefitted personally from them. Perhaps they did not participate in mocking Him or calling for His crucifixion. But they chose to stay a safe distance from Him when the going got tough. Unlike Simon, they refused to go too near to Christ.

Where will you place yourself this week? Keeping your distance from all the pain and suffering Christ endured? Or close by, staying near to Him as Simon did? It is when we go near to Christ that we can be transformed by Him. It is by embracing the crosses in our lives, stewarding them well rather than trying to run from them, that we become His true disciples.

The Rite of Election

as part of the Order of Christian Initiation

The Rite of Election is held on the First Sunday of Lent, and is a celebration of the Catechumen being recognized by their Parish as having been found ready to be sent to the Bishop of the Diocese to be selected to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, which are Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist. The Catechumen sign their name in the Book of the Elect in the presents of the Parish Community and witnessed by their Godparents stating their request to be selected to receive the Easter Sacraments. The Catechumen are presented to the Bishop of the Diocese and based on the testimony of the Parish and the God parents, the Bishop declares them to no longer be Catechumen, those who have been on their faith journey, learning about and experiencing what we as Catholic believe and being an active member of the Parish Community, to be Elect, those that will receive their Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil, welcoming them in as Fully Initiated Members of the Catholic Faith. The Bishop welcomes them and signs the Bok of the Elect thus declaiming them to now be the Elect. But this is just the first of many Rites that are held during Lent. The Elect will undergo three Scrutiny and a Retreat and participate in the Lord's Supper at the Mass on Holy Thursday. Then on Holy Saturday evening we celebrate the Easter Vigil.



The Easter Vigil Mass

The Easter Vigil Mass is held on Holy Saturday Evening and is the First Easter Mass professed after The Lord's Supper Mass held on Holy Thursday. Since there is no Concluding Rite, Blessing and Dismissal, the Holy Thursday Mass does not end until the Dismal at the Easter Vigil Mass. This is what the Church calls the Tridium, basically it is a Mass that lasts Three Days.

During the Easter Vigil everything will be new again because Jesus Rose from the dead at Easter and everything was made new. So, we start with a new fire outside the Church. From that fire the New Easter Candle is blessed and lit. Then the Community following the Priests, Deacons, and the Elect from the OCIA (Those who will receive their Easter Sacraments) go to the main entrance to the Church. The Church is dark and empty. Candles are given to the community, and they are lit from the Easter Candle when entering the Church. Once inside the Church, there are many Readings from the Old Testament and Psalms are proclaimed. The Baptismal Fount will be blessed, and we have new Holy Water. There will be the Baptism of the Elect, renewal of Baptismal vows and sprinkling of the New Holy Water on the Community. The newly baptized return in the white robes and Confirmation is given to the Newly Baptized. The Mass continues and at Communion, the Newly Baptized receive their third Sacrament of First Eucharist. The Mass continues until the Final Blessing and the Dimal. At this point, the Tridium Mass is complete.

With all the New items in the Mass, it does take much longer than a normal Mass, but it is a beautiful Mass and if you have not experienced an Easter Vigil Mass you should, you will not regret it.

Visita Iglesia on Holy Thursday night

Take along your family and friends to the Holy Thursday tradition of Visita Iglesia, also known as Seven Churches Visitation. On Holy Thursday, after the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Blessed Sacrament is solemnly processed and placed in a tabernacle on the Altar of Repose, which is open late for silent adoration. Amid the Eucharistic Revival, Visita Iglesia this year continues to take on a deeper meaning. 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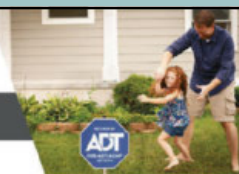
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
