CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm.** Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly **call (408) 966-4612**. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

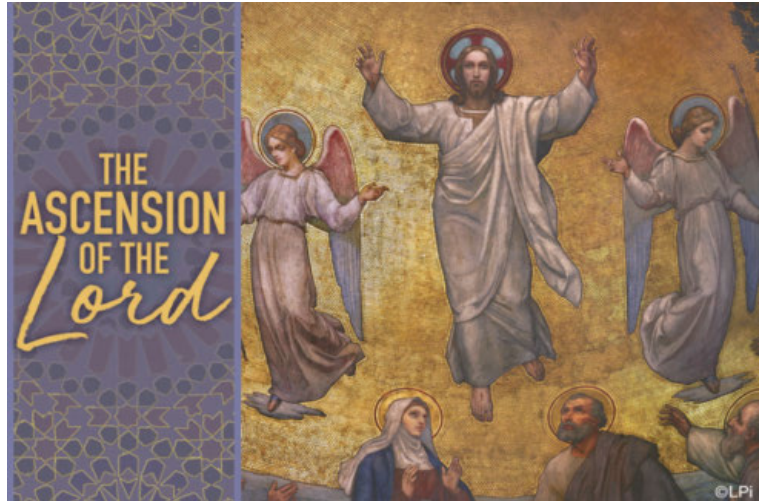

GOSPEL MEDITATION — ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

On this Feast of the Ascension, we celebrate Christ's
triumphant return to the Father after perfectly accomplishing
His mission on earth. But we also can also view this Feast as a
celebration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as
Christ's disciples.

Today's Gospel draws our attention to the clear instructions
that Jesus gave His disciples (and to us) just before ascending
to the Father: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer
and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance,
for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to
all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses
of these things."

Embracing a stewardship way of life, with its emphasis on the
use of time, talent and treasure, helps us to live in such a way
that our very lives speak as a witness of the Good News of the
Gospel. While we take time to reflect and renew our
commitments in these three areas annually as a parish family,
it is of great benefit to take some time individually throughout
the year to take stock of the commitments we have made —
looking at both our strengths and our need for continued
growth in each area.

On this Feast of our "launch day," take some time to celebrate
your victories as Christ's disciples and renew your
commitment to remain faithful to Him and the unique mission
He has entrusted to you!

EUCCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE

The Eucharistic pilgrimage called Camino de California aims to continue the fruits of the National Eucharistic Congress held in Indianapolis last year. Everyone is invited to join this Eucharistic Procession as it travels thru the DSJ, on **Pentecost Sunday, June 8, 2025.**

Led by Bishop Oscar Cantú, the procession will depart Mission Santa Clara at 11am walking less than 5 miles with our Eucharistic Lord to Our Lady of Peace Shrine in Santa Clara where lunch will be provided at 1pm by the Knights of Columbus. This procession, which is Day 3 of the first-ever Eucharistic Pilgrimage in California, visits all 21 California Missions.

The procession culminates at the Los Angeles Cathedral to converge with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage already en route from Indianapolis for the closing Mass of the National Eucharistic Revival on Corpus Christi Sunday on June 22, 2025. . Visit

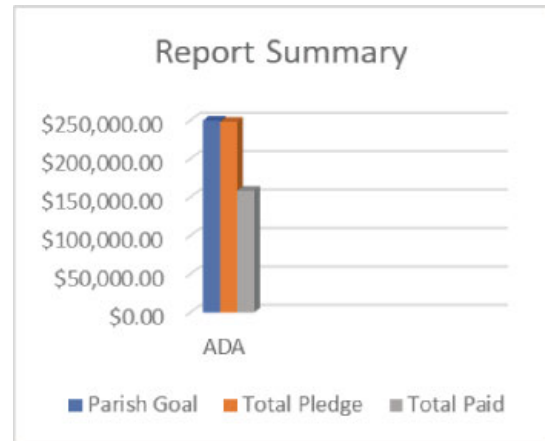
