READINGS FOR THE WEEK

First Reading: Amos 8:4-7

When will the new moon be over so that we will buy the lowly for silver and the poor for a pair of sandals?

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and all in authority, so that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity.

Gospel Reading: Luke 16:1-13

No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other or be devoted to one and despise the other.



GOSPEL MEDITATION: YOUR HEART IS ALWAYS WITH YOUR TREASURE

During my time as a young seminarian, I had the opportunity to assist my brother at his shop during the holidays, right in the bustling heart of the market near the motor park. This location attracted traders from all over

Nigeria, bringing with them fascinating stories—some spoke of individuals with magical abilities capable of making money mysteriously vanish. Instantly, I dismissed these tales as mere superstition.

One day, as we were chatting, a middle-aged man passed by who seemed a bit out of place. Someone in our group speculated that he might be one of the so-called magicians, prompting a light-hearted check to see if we all had our money safe. I chuckled and brushed off the concern, thinking it silly. However, as the man walked away, I instinctively checked my pocket to reassure myself that my money was still there. Unrecognized to me, one of my friends noticed this gesture and playfully called me out, and they laughed at me, suggesting I was being hypocritical.

This incident taught me a valuable lesson about consistency in our beliefs and actions. It is important to recognize that even when we consider something far-fetched, our instincts might still drive us to take precautionary measures. In our growth journey, it is beneficial to remain open-minded and reflective, understanding that our experiences shape our perceptions.

In the Gospel, Christ reminds us: no servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money. This is not a matter to be taken lightly. It is time to make an urgent decision and take decisive action. How secure is your future? Store up treasures that will last in all seasons—wealth that can bring peace and eternal joy.

Where your true values lie, there too will be your heart.

While we may attempt to conceal our motivations, the truth has a way of coming to light. What drives us—our aspirations and priorities—can often be seen through our actions, much like trees are known by their fruits. It is crucial to recognize when we align ourselves with higher principles over material desires. Although we might hide our intentions temporarily, ultimately, authenticity is paramount. Let us encourage openness and accountability as we navigate our spiritual journey together.

When facing challenges, such as losing a job or something of value, it is natural for a wide range of thoughts to arise. Such situations can serve as powerful catalysts for creativity; after all, necessity is the mother of invention. It is important to focus on the opportunities these challenges present, as they can lead to positive initiatives and personal growth. Let us remain hopeful and optimistic, knowing that every challenge is an opportunity for growth.

However, it is also essential to be mindful of decisions made during difficult times, as they can have lasting impacts. Our choices should align with our true desires and ambitions, guiding us toward a brighter future. By approaching these challenges responsibly and carefully, we can ensure our decisions reflect what we genuinely value and lead us to new opportunities. Let us remain proactive, using these moments as stepping stones to greater achievements.

The wise servant mentioned in the Gospel of Luke found himself at risk of losing his position, yet he took proactive steps that earned him his master's praise. This example encourages us to focus our hearts on pursuits that bring glory to God and lead to lasting joy. It is essential to pray consistently for ourselves and for the world, seeking to live a life marked by peace, devotion, and dignity.

The Prophet Amos reminds us of the dangers of using material wealth to oppress the vulnerable. Rather than fighting for money, we should recognize that true wealth comes from God. Instead of resorting to slander and persecution in our quest for superiority, we can follow Christ's teachings by using our resources and influence to demonstrate love and compassion. Let love and compassion be our guiding principles in all our actions.

Even with limited means, we can spread kindness and love in our communities. Our intentions and actions shape our spirituality, and we must awaken from any spiritual complacency to actively establish our spiritual presence. We must recognize the urgency of our calling to act decisively and positively in the world.
