Sowing Seeds of Faith:
A Moment of Grace for Spiritual Renewal



My dear St. John the Baptist Parish Family:

This is the first Sunday of the New Year of Grace 2026. Even as the Jubilee Year of Hope ends officially this Tuesday, January 6, we shall continue to be people of hope. For as St. Paul writes: "Hope does not disappoint." Hope is salvific, as the late Pope Benedict XVI wrote. We welcome the new year with hope and continued reliance on the love and compassion of God towards His people. With God's help we shall face this new year with the help of His grace and divine providence.

The Diocese of San Jose is embarking on a significant and sacred endeavor for our local Church with the launch of upcoming Capital Campaign for Spiritual Renewal titled "Sowing Seeds of Faith." This campaign is a cornerstone initiative to support the implementation of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan, which seeks to revitalize the Church's mission across all 54 parishes and missions in the Diocese of San Jose.

On the surface, people might expect this to be simply a fundraising effort. However, while money will be raised, the main goal much more than that. It is a moment of grace, a spiritual renewal that invites each of us to reconnect with the heart of our faith, to reflect on our personal journey with the Lord, and to consider how we can make a lasting impact on the future of our Church. It is a holy opportunity for all of us—clergy and laity alike—to walk more closely with one another, listen to each other's stories, pray together, and grow deeper in our encounter with Christ.

I have started talking to people and personally invited a group of trusted and dedicated parishioners to form our Parish Capital Campaign Advisory Committee. This team will assist me and Fr. Victor in planning and implementing the campaign over the next several months. Their role will be to offer wisdom and guidance, help in outreach, and ensure that our efforts remain deeply rooted in the mission and values of Saint John the Baptist Parish. There will be others who will receive invitation from your priests.

This will be a beautiful and strategic preparation for the 150th anniversary of the Parish in 2027.

One of the encouraging elements of this Campaign for Spiritual Renewal is the fact that fifty percent (50%) of all funds raised at our parish will remain here at Saint John. These funds will be earmarked specifically for the implementation of our own key parish initiatives aligned with the six key priorities of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan. In the coming weeks, we will be discussing how this can directly benefit our parish in areas such as liturgy and worship, hospitality, family ministry, faith formation, youth and young adult ministry, evangelization, pastoral care and outreach, development of lay leaders and the future sustainability of our Parish.

Time is of the essence, and we will need everyone's participation, commitment, and prayers. With the Lord as our guide, and with unity as our strength, we can build a solid foundation for a flourishing future—not just for ourselves, but for the generations of Catholics to come.

As part of this effort, the Bishop has invited the priests of the Diocese to lead by example by making a personal commitment to the Campaign. We have pledged generously and sacrificially - gifts that we will fulfill over the course of five years. We do this not out of obligation, but out of love for the Church and with the conviction that we must model what it means to be faithful stewards of God's blessings. If we, your priests, can do this with joy, I am confident that many of you will be able to do the same.

In the weeks ahead, I and the members of the Campaign Advisory Team will be reaching out to each of you to invite you to join us on this journey. I ask you to prayerfully consider making a sacrificial and generous gift to the Capital Campaign. No gift is too small when given with love. What matters most is that each of us participates and does our part to build up the Church.

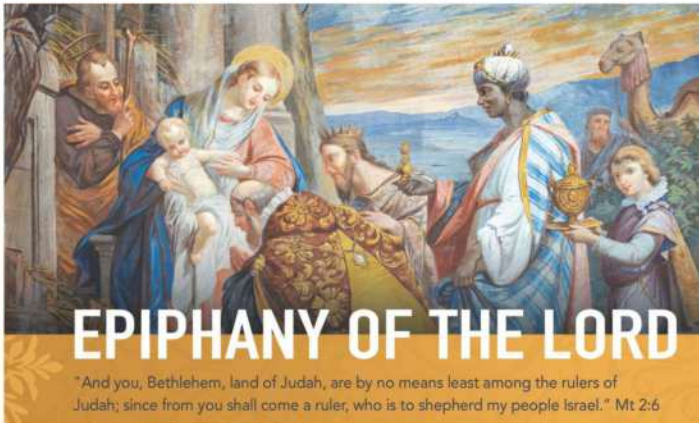
I invite you all, my dear Parishioners, to join us in this great task of investing in our spiritual renewal by sowing seeds of faith for the future of our Parish and Diocese.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

As our celebration of Christmas continues, today we observe the great feast of The Epiphany of the Lord. The word "epiphany" comes from Greek and means manifestation or appearance. The stewardship way of life is one in which we live in grateful response to God's countless manifestations in our lives.

Our Gospel passage, from Matthew, has much to teach us about stewardship, through the actions of the magi.

As good stewards, the magi were watching for manifestations of God's presence in their lives. "We have seen the star at its rising," they say. Good stewards are keenly aware of the "star" of God's presence and His gifts in their lives. It is this awareness that fills them with gratitude and the desire to both worship God and share His gifts with others.

The magi, upon seeing the manifestation of God's presence in their lives, "were overjoyed." Good stewards, who live with the awareness of God's presence and gifts to them, simply can't help but be filled with joy. Not necessarily the fleeting and superficial kind of joy the world promises through wealth or power, but rather the deep, unalterable joy only God can give.

Finally, the magi were so filled with awe upon encountering the newborn Jesus, they prostrated themselves before him and "opened their treasures and offered him gifts." This is precisely why good stewards generously share their material gifts — as a loving act of worship to an extravagantly loving God.

Let us rejoice in God's manifestations in our lives and be watchful for the new ways He is calling us to share ourselves and our gifts in gratitude to our King in the year ahead.

FAITH FORMATION

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm. Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30 PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST

We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION

It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

MARRIAGE

Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at least six months period to complete.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly call (408) 966-4612. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

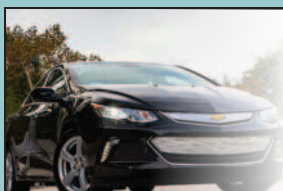

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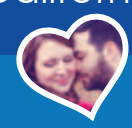
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
