CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm.** Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest.

Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly **call (408) 966-4612**. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

Our readings today remind us to live our lives in total surrender to God's care.

The Gospel recounts when Jesus instructs His twelve apostles to begin their missionary work two by two. He encouraged them to take very little — a walking stick and sandals.

If you can recall a time you packed for a trip, or even left the house for a day's travel, you might remember making a list or packing days in advance. We tend to pack so we know we will be comfortable.

If we extend this concept of "comfort" into other areas of our lives, we will most likely find a few instances where we ensure life is comfortable. It could be buying extra food at the grocery store, making sure we have the most updated technology, or even feeling safe in our bank accounts.

It is not bad to have extra food in the pantry or a new phone. And it isn't bad to save money. These things can be good when used properly.

But what if we are looking to these things for comfort, security or even happiness?

Imagine if Jesus approached you and said, "Go out and do my work, but you can only bring a walking stick and shoes." Would you be willing to surrender all the rest?

A key component of living out our call as Christian stewards is total surrender. It is trusting in God during our best moments and our hardest. It is looking to Him for security, comfort and happiness.

Reflect on the ways you might be looking for comfort in the things of this world. Tangibly find a way to become independent from that "thing" so that you can become more dependent on God. ©Catholic Stewardship Consultants

From the Desk of the Pastor

This weekend, our Parish participates in the Missionary Cooperative Plan of the Diocese of San Jose by welcoming a priest from the Diocese of San Fernando, La Union in northern Philippines. His name is Fr. Andres F. Nuesca, Jr. He was ordained to the priesthood on April 25, 2013 at St. Catherine of Alexandria Parish, Shrine of Our Lady of Namacpacan in Luna, La Union. His first assignment was at St. Christopher Parish, Bangar, La Union as a Parochial Vicar from 2013-2015. From 2015 to 2019, he was assigned as a Formator and Spiritual Director at Immaculate Conception School of Theology, a Regional Seminary for Northern Luzon located in Vigan City, Ilocos Sur.

In the same years, he also served as the Director of John Paul I Biblical Center. Upon the recommendation of the Northern Luzon Bishops and Seminary Fathers, he was sent for further studies in Rome, Italy. He took up Licentiate in Spiritual Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University. After his further studies, he was sent back to the Regional Seminary as a Spiritual Director in the Spiritual Formation Year in 2023. This school year 2023-2024, he had been given an opportunity to undergo programs on Clinical Pastoral Education at the Makati Medical Center, and a Seminar on Spiritual Direction in the Formation Context which will be of great help in seminary formation.

For more than 200 years now, the IMMACULATE CONCEPTION SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY (ICST) is the Regional Theology Seminary for the local churches in the Northern Philippines. ICST serves the 13 archdioceses and dioceses of the ecclesiastical provinces in the region. Since its foundation, ICST has been a home for thousands of seminarians many of whom have become priests and bishops serving the northern part of the archipelago. It is the heart of the of the Northern Luzon Church that caters integral seminary formation for future priests.

ICST currently serves seminarians from Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Abra, La Union, Benguet, Ifugao, Kalinga-Apayao, Mountain Province, Cagayan, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, and from Alaminos and Urdaneta Dioceses in Pangasinan. Thus, ICST forms these young men according to the tradition of integral priestly formation that caters to their human, spiritual, intellectual and pastoral life - geared towards renewed integral evangelization, building of Basic Ecclesial Communities, empowerment of the laity, inculturation of the Gospel message, and promotion of charity, truth, social justice and peace.

Like many institutions in the Catholic Church, the Seminary also faces challenges. Among them are the continuing retooling of formators and professors and the formation needs of the seminarians. For them, these are overwhelming tasks, but through the years, the Lord has manifested his help through selfless people who have supported the seminary. They believe that you would be one with them in this noble endeavor of training future ministers of the Gospel. Our help in this appeal is crucial to their ministry.

I ask that you please be generous to this appeal in solidarity with the wider Church. In their name, I thank you.

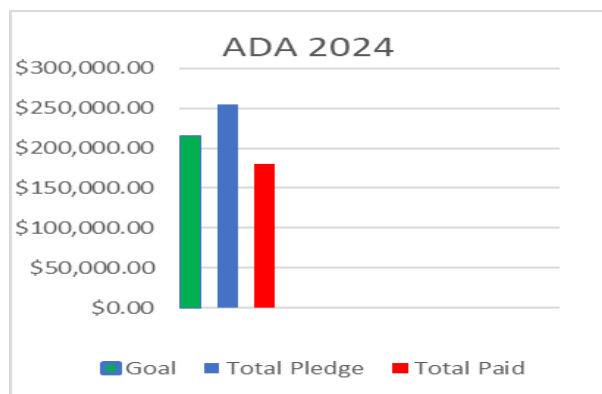
