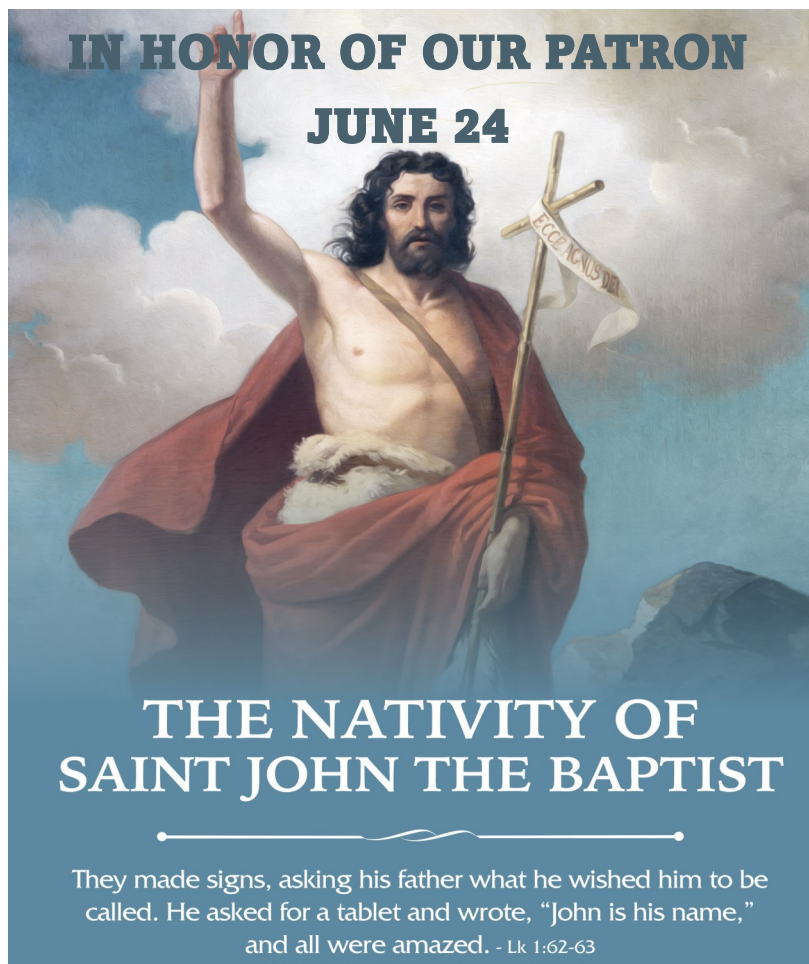

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm**. Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest. Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly **call (408) 966-4612**. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.
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Our readings today remind us that God always has our best
interests in mind. No matter what is going on in our lives, God is
with us.

In our Gospel today, Jesus and His disciples are traveling in a boat
when heavy winds and violent waves begin to overwhelm the
boat. Jesus was there sleeping in the boat in the midst of this
horrific storm.

The disciples woke Jesus and questioned Him, "Teacher, do you
not care that we are perishing?" Jesus calms the wind and the
waves, and then asks them in return, "Why are you terrified? Do
you not yet have faith?"

Think back to a time that you endured great suffering, a hard trial
or felt overwhelmed with life. How did you respond?

In moments of trial, we often live our days in a panic. We see the
water coming into our boat and we do all that we can in our power
to stay afloat. We are frantic, so we fail to stop and recognize that
our Savior is in the same boat with us. Although it might feel like
He is sleeping and His presence is lacking, He is right there
suffering with us.

God won't allow anything that we cannot handle. In a moment of
suffering, we might feel trapped. Yet, He sees the moment of
peace and still waters.

During our trials, cling to Jesus. Know that there is an end, and
whether we see the end in this life or the next, God allows it all for
our salvation.

Today, let us thank God for His presence in our lives, and ask for
the eyes of faith to see that He is right here with us always.

My dear St. John the Baptist Parish Family,

Peace and greetings in the Lord. **Happy Fiesta!**

This weekend, we celebrate our Parish Fiesta. We are anticipating this weekend the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, our patron, which falls on Monday, June 24, 2024.

Last Thursday (6/20) night at 7 p.m., we started our Triduum that was followed by a brown-bag fellowship. Friday night was our farewell liturgy for **Sr. Norie Noman, A.R.**, who is leaving today (6/23) for the Philippines, to take some needed vacation before she assumes a new position within the Augustinian Recollect Community educational ministry system in Bohol, Philippines. We wish her well in her new ministry

Today, we will hold a **mini-Festival** from 9 am to 2 pm in the parking lot between the school and the Hall. Please stop by the festival area in the hall and by the parking lot to experience the variety of vendors that include food, international delicacies, (Filipino, Vietnamese, Mexican, Indian fare) drinks and juices, cookware, candles, t-shirts, insurance, healing elements and crocheted products. Come and experience the delight and diversity of our parish community.

Next Weekend

The Solemnity of the Holy Apostles, Sts. Peter and Paul will be commemorated on Saturday, June 29. We shall include the intentions of the Holy Father, Pope Francis, at all the Masses next weekend. We will also take up a second collection, called Peter's Pence, to support the ministry and mission of the Pope, the successor of St. Peter as Bishop of Rome and head of the universal Church.

St. John the Baptist

Question:

What do we know about St. John the Baptist?

Answer:

We know quite a lot about John the Baptist from the Gospels and other historical sources. John was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth through a graced post-menopausal conception (Luke 1). John would have been raised with an intimate knowledge of Jewish doctrine and religious practice, due to his father being a Levite priest. Elizabeth is a "kinswoman" of Mary. While not in the same nuclear family, the two were close enough that Mary would journey to spend several months with Elizabeth during her pregnancy. We don't know how close John and Jesus were as children, but they certainly knew of one another as cousins.

Luke 3 tells us he began his ministry in "the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberias Caesar," roughly 29 A.D. He lived as a hermit with clear ascetic practices, such as rough clothing and a simple vegetarian diet. Despite his remoteness, John's ministry was prophetic. People came from across the region to be baptized in water as a sign of repentance. John, however, continually pointed beyond himself to the one who was to come: Jesus Christ. John the Baptist's call to repentance extended to the rules of his day. John critiqued the local rulers, Herod Antipas and his wife Herodias. Previously, Herodias had been married to Antipas' brother, Herod Philip, but had betrayed him, left him, and married his more powerful brother. John was arrested for the slight and was eventually executed (Mark 6). This martyrdom prophetically anticipates the trials that awaited Christ and his followers. In life and death, John the Baptist served as the herald of the Messiah.
