- Are unafraid to grow by remembering the past, celebrating the present, and believing in the future

CELEBRATIONS OF SACRAMENT

Baptism are being celebrated every **Saturday at 10:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 2:00 pm.** Please make an appointment with the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism interview and to register for the required preparation class. The preparation class is being held every second and fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30PM.

FIRST EUCHARIST: We accept children who are at least in first grade and seven years old. We have two classes: one is every Thursday from 6:45 pm to 8:00 pm and the other is every Saturday from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Registration starts in late July or early August.

CONFIRMATION: It is a two-year program. First Year Confirmandi meet every first and third Friday while Second Year Confirmandi meet every second and fourth Friday. Both will have a mandatory Confirmation Retreat. Regular Class time is 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm. We accept children who are at least in seventh grade and up to Junior High (eleventh grade). Registration starts in late July or early August.

Marriage: Before planning your wedding, please make an appointment with one of our priest.

Marriage preparation usually takes at **least six months** period to complete.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Extra-Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist make pastoral visit to parishioners who are sick either confined in the hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, care homes, or at the convenient of their own home. Also, it is for parishioners who are homebound, i.e. their health or medical conditions could be compromised when they leave home. Pastoral visit comprise of the respectful distribution of the Holy Eucharist to the sick; and as well, as giving them emotional, social, and spiritual support through profound and thoughtful prayers.

Anointing of the Sick: In this Church's Sacrament, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or frailty of old age is sufficient. To request, please call the parish office. Outside office hours, kindly **call (408) 966-4612**. In addition, the Sacrament is also conferred during the communal celebration at the morning Mass every first Saturday of the month.

TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JUNE 9, 2024

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.
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In today's First Reading from the Book of Genesis we hear the story of Adam and Eve and their sins, defying God. However, when God was present in the garden, the man and woman hid themselves. Adam responds to God's question why in part by saying "I was afraid... so I hid myself." Did he, do any of us really think he could hide from God?

As children many of us may have hidden from a parent when we did something wrong, and it was in violation of some specific order we had received. Our efforts to hide what we did and to hide ourselves were probably no more effective than Adam's.

As humans we know the temptation of following our own plans, even if they are contrary to God's. We think we know better, and we may try to still have it our way. If what we have done is particularly shameful, we may try to hide our sins from God.

The sincere truth is that we cannot hide from God any more than Adam and Eve could. Psalm 139 declares, "Where can I hide from your spirit (God's)? From your presence where can I flee? If I ascend to the heavens, you are there; if I lie down in Sheol (the place of the dead) you are there, too. If I say, 'Surely darkness will hide me'... Darkness is not dark for you."

What are we hiding from? In recent weeks we have learned over and over how much God loves us. It is time for us to accept that and not hide.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

We are now taking applications for the new group to start the RCIA Process on 12 June 2024.

Our Next RCIA Process starts Wednesday Evening at 7 pm, 12 June 2024. **The Sessions for June and July 2024 will be held on Wednesday Evening starting at 7 pm.** Then in August we will go back to our Sunday 10 am Mass and RCIA to follow in Pavalkis Hall Room 2A.

RCIA Is a process! It is you Journeying on your Faith Life. It is not just reading a book or joining a zoom class, it is the sharing your experiences and growing in your Faith as you become closer to Jesus Christ and His Church.

What can the RCIA do for you?

*If you are not Baptized in a Christian Religion, we can help you to enter the Catholic Faith and be Baptized and receive the other Sacraments of Initiation (First Communion and Confirmation).

*If you were Baptized in another Christian Faith, we can help you become Catholic, and receive the other Sacraments of Initiation (First Communion and

Confirmation).

*What if you were Baptized Catholic but never practiced your Faith? We can help you get the other Sacraments of Initiation (First Communion and Confirmation) as well as understand what the Catholic Church Teaches and Believes.

The RCIA is a process that builds on the previous topics, so you will need to join at the beginning, you just cannot drop in in September and hope to receive your Sacraments at Easter.

To Join the RCIA Process you will need to complete the RCIA Registration forms, and you also need to have an interview with Dave Meszaros to make sure we have all the paperwork required. We would like to have the interview completed before the First RCIA Session on 12 Jun 2024.

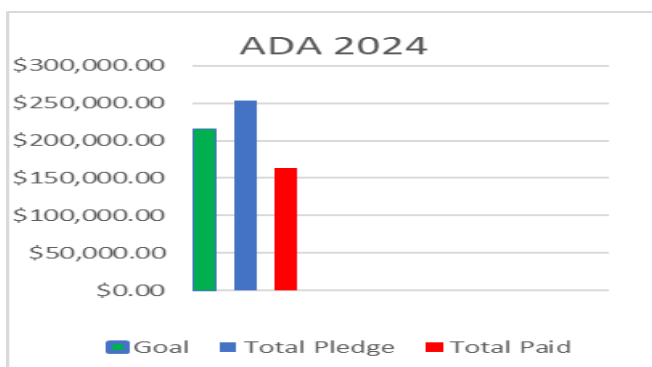
