Abstract

The Reverend David K. Pangborn Dairies, dated from 1871 to 1882, consist of entries of weather, work, travels, errands, deaths, burials, meetings, religious gatherings, preaching, health, church repair, marriages, elections, and more, while a minister at the Congregational Church in Crary Mills, N.Y.

Scope and Content

This collection consists of two leather notebooks kept as diaries and accounts recorded by Reverend David K. Pangborn (1831-1904) from 1871-1882. He is credited with remodeling the church in 1873. The Church was changed to a Presbyterian Church in 1903. Pangborn was born in Vermont and died in Wadhams Mills, NY.

Language

The material is in English.
