Services for children and especially primary age children have reduced or are overstretched and difficult to access. To help with this we reached out to a charity called Transforming Lives for Good and to our local churches. This has led to a new partnership where some parishioners have been trained to provide coaching support for some of our deserving young people. We are looking forward to this beginning in the Spring term and are so grateful to the members of the local parishes for taking the time to both train and work with selected children. We will continue to seek new avenues to provide the help our families deserve.

Fundraising

The spotty Children in Need day raised £381 which was 108% of our £350 target. It was a lovely day here in school – very colourful.
