Three new boys have moved into the Center since the January newsletter. Mengsor is 12 years old and was discovered by a Christian lady visiting in a remote village. She learned that he was not being cared for properly.

Kimsieng and Kimseng are brothers ages 7 and 4 who were with their grandmother living in an open hut at the base of Santuk Mountain. Her income was what she begged from visitors who went there to enjoy climbing the mountain. Their parents had divorced. The father disappeared and mother went to a distant province to work leaving the boys with their grandmother, who did not have



the means to care for them. Similar stories are extremely common in Cambodia.

Little Lydia, who was born with only three chambers in her heart, is now two and a half years old. She continues to grow and has begun taking a few steps. She has begun talking and is bilingual.
