## TO OUR PARTNERS

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

As I reflect on 2025, I'm grateful for what this year has taught us about partnership, both its promise and its challenges.

We celebrated significant milestones. In September, we passed the most challenging step in our accreditation journey when ARTS approved our Self-Study Report. We formed a Partnership Council, gathering representatives from ten churches to envision together how we can multiply leaders for God's mission. We established eight residency partnerships, creating pathways for emerging leaders to be formed in local church contexts while pursuing theological education. We launched our Certificate in Missional Theology program, which grew to more than twenty students in its first year. And we graduated our second MDiv cohort, bringing our alumni total to fifteen faithful servants now serving in pastoral ministry and parachurch leadership.

Yet 2025 also confronted us with challenges. Our MDiv enrollment declined, fundraising moved more slowly than we hoped, and we discovered that many people in our community are unaware that CORS exists.

This year brings to light something critical to CORS's calling and role in our community. From the beginning, CORS has existed as a partnership. It is not a separate institution with which individuals, churches, and ministries partner. Rather, it is a nexus of trust, a conduit for relationships, a means for partnership, and an infrastructure for collaboration around the shared goal of equipping the leaders God is calling from among us. More significantly, we hope it is a sign, instrument, and foretaste in our community of the unity we share in Christ Jesus. There is so much potential in our community to multiply leaders and send them to the world. How much of that potential we see realized depends upon how well we collaborate.

As we enter 2026, my prayer is simple: that CORS would be a sign that partnership has become integral to the life of the church here. The question is not “How can we grow as a seminary?” but “How can we, together, equip more Christlike leaders for God's global mission?”

## EQUIPPING CHRISTLIKE LEADERS FOR GOD'S GLOBAL MISSION

Emerging from a gathering of leaders in February 2021, Christ Our Redeemer Seminary began as a partnership of local churches committed to equipping Christlike leaders for God's global mission. We officially launched in August of that year with our first cohort of 11 MDiv students. Since then, we have graduated two cohorts from our MDiv program, added other programs to serve the church in our community, and matured as an institution. Thanks be to God!

# 2025 A YEAR OF GROWTH & CHALLENGE

In response to your prayers and support, by God’s grace, we were able to:



## GRADUATE OUR SECOND COHORT

We graduated our second MDiv cohort in May, bringing our total alumni to fifteen, all serving in ministry. Our 100% placement rate witnesses to the Spirit’s faithfulness in calling and deploying workers for his harvest.

## ESTABLISH A PARTNERSHIP COUNCIL

On June 25, representatives from ten churches gathered for the inaugural Partnership Council meeting. This isn’t simply another advisory board; it is the structural embodiment of our conviction that CORS exists as a partnership for collaborative mission.

## ACHIEVE CANDIDATE STATUS

In September, the Association of Reformed Theological Seminaries—our accrediting agency—approved our Self-Study Report, a major piece of the accreditation process. We have now achieved candidate status and have a site visit in March. We anticipate full accreditation sometime later this year.

## ESTABLISH RESIDENCY PARTNERSHIPS

We established eight formal residency partnerships: five with churches and three with ministries, with several others in the works. These help churches apply Luke 10:2 and 2 Timothy 2:2 by providing development pathways for emerging leaders.

## BETTER SERVE OUR FACULTY

Learning from the accreditation process, we were able to implement and modestly fund a faculty development process as well as establish a Faculty Advisory Committee, chaired by Dr. Brett Coppenger.



## GROW OUR STAFF TEAM

This past summer, we welcomed two new members to our growing staff team! Dr. Erik Lundeen (PhD, Baylor University) and his family moved to the area from Illinois, where he had been serving serving as a pastor. Dr. Lundeen is serving full time at CORS as the Assistant Academic Dean. He is also the author of *The Reformation of the Literal* (T&T Clark, 2025). We also welcomed Sawyer McGonagill, who is a recent graduate of Auburn University and a member of Vineyard Church Auburn. Sawyer is serving at CORS as the Executive Assistant.

## GROW OUR CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

The Certificate in Missional Theology served more than forty students. We also introduced a Certificate in Greek and are exploring other certificate options.

## PROVIDE EQUIPPING SEMINARS

In November we hosted Dr. Thomas Messick for a seminar entitled “Rethinking the Church’s Mission to Muslims.”

## INCREASE AWARENESS ABOUT CORS

We spent significant effort this year in increasing awareness. Our team spoke at partner churches and ministries, increased our digital media efforts, and reached out to pastors in Montgomery and Columbus.



## WHAT WE LEARNED

In a context with incredible potential to train and send Christlike leaders to the world, the challenges we faced this year clarified four crucial insights:


1. Partnership and awareness building require consistent communication.
2. Leadership development must move from adjacent to integral to life of the church locally.
3. Collaboration within the body of Christ makes the multiplying and sending of leaders an attainable goal.
4. CORS is positioned to provide essential infrastructure and the Partnership Council exists to facilitate this shift.


With this graduating class, CORS now has 15 MDiv alumni serving in ministry and we continue to celebrate a 100% placement rate. Here's where they are now:

## DIVERSE PATHWAYS FOR DIVERSE CALLINGS

### MASTER OF DIVINITY

Our three-year, full-time MDiv (98 credit hours) equips Christlike leaders for God’s global mission through thorough training in the Bible, theology, and missiology—ideal for pastors, church planters, and missionaries.



### MA IN MISSIONAL THEOLOGY

Our three-year MAMT (73 credit hours) equips graduates for Christlike leadership in God’s mission — ideal for vocational or bi-vocational service in churches, parachurch ministries, missions, or the marketplace.



### MISSIONAL THEOLOGY CERTIFICATE

What is God’s mission, and what’s our role in it? Over two semesters of weekly meetings, readings and assignments, we explore these questions and learn to participate more meaningfully in God’s global mission.



### GREEK CERTIFICATE

This two-semester program equips you to read the New Testament in its original language. Together with your cohort, you’ll develop a basic fluency in reading biblical Greek while having more fun as you study God’s Word.



### MINISTRY RESIDENCY

As a partnership with local churches and ministries, this residency sets our MDiv or MAMT within an apprenticeship model – an ideal training pathway for aspiring pastors, church planters, and vocational ministry leaders.



### MISSIONARY RESIDENCY

Designed specifically for missionaries, this three-year, full-time program weaves together theological formation, cross-cultural ministry, and communal life. Residents complete the MDiv while being equipped to plant churches among the unreached.



### STUDY ABROAD

We offer a nine-day study tour in Greece exploring the missional practices of Paul and implications for mission today. We offer a ten-day study tour to Israel to increase our understanding of the biblical text and the complexity of the Middle East today.



### SEMINARS

CORS regularly offers seminars on a variety of relevant topics. These are open to anyone in the community who wants to learn how to participate more intentionally in God’s mission in light of our missional context.

# PARTNERSHIP COUNCIL: CHURCHES COLLABORATING FOR MISSION



“I WAS AMAZED AT THE DIVERSITY OF TEACHERS FROM DIFFERENT CHURCHES AND THEOLOGICAL BACKGROUNDS WHO SHARED A COMMON LOVE FOR GOD, EACH OTHER & THE ABSOLUTE TRUTH OF SCRIPTURE. THIS CONTEXT CONTINUALLY REMINDED ME THAT DESPITE THEOLOGICAL DIFFERENCES, WE ARE ONE IN CHRIST JESUS OUR LORD.”

On June 25, 2025, representatives from ten churches gathered for the inaugural Partnership Council meeting, not simply to discuss how to support a seminary, but to ask deeper questions: How healthy is the church in Auburn and Opelika? How can we collaborate more effectively across congregational lines? How can we increase the number of well-trained leaders sent from this community to the nations?

The council embodies a theological conviction that unity in diversity isn't optional. As Herman Bavinck teaches us, unity in diversity is not merely pragmatic or optional; it is grounded in the very nature of our triune God, it is reflected in the structure of creation, it is essential to the meaning of the *imago dei*, it is essential to the gospel message and fruit of Christ's reconciling work, and it expands its reach to every tribe and nation out of our hunger to know God. The church, as

the one body of Christ, is the one and only human community capable of making Christ visible in the world. In short, it matters.

The inaugural meeting introduced the idea of setting a shared goal of multiplying leaders over the next ten years through residency partnerships where emerging leaders are formed in local church contexts while pursuing theological education. This isn't just about CORS growing. It's about churches moving from individual vision to shared vision, from individual goals to shared goals, from adjacent support to integral partnership. The Partnership Council meets twice a year to continue conversations about how we together multiply leaders for God's mission.

# LOOKING AHEAD: THREE PRIORITIES FOR 2026

In addition to serving our students and faculty well, three priorities guide our next season of ministry:

### STRENGTHEN AND EXPAND THE CORS PARTNERSHIP

In 2026, we'll continue to foster prayer, discussion, and collaborative action around the questions: Can we adopt a shared vision, mission, and goals for leadership development in our community? What other shared goals can foster unity and partnership in God's mission? How can we expand our reach to invite others into this partnership?

This isn't just about seminary growth; it's about the Church in Auburn|Opelika multiplying leaders and partnering together in God's mission.

### ESTABLISH MORE RESIDENCY PROGRAMS

A residency program is one way to move leadership development from adjacent to integral to the life and ministry of the church. With eight residency partnerships already established, we aim to add six to eight additional residency partnerships.

### INCREASE AWARENESS

We will continue to work hard to increase awareness in East Alabama through speaking engagements, partner meetings, conferences, newsletters, digital media, and more.

The vision remains unchanged: To glorify God by partnering together as the Church in Auburn and Opelika, Alabama, to equip Christlike leaders for God's global mission through accredited theological education.

## ACCREDITATION JOURNEY

In September 2025, we cleared the most significant hurdle in our accreditation journey: the Association of Reformed Theological Seminaries (ARTS) approved our Self-Study Report, upgrading our status from Applicant to Candidate.

This milestone represents more than institutional progress; it's the fruit of partnership. For over a year, our Self-Study team documented, analyzed, and improved every dimension of seminary operations. Faculty refined curricula. Staff strengthened systems. The board provided governance oversight. Students gave honest feedback. Partner churches sent emerging leaders and created ministry contexts for formation.

Why accreditation matters: For students, it means transferable credits, enhanced ministry credibility, and confidence in degree quality. For churches, it provides assurance that CORS operates with best practices and long-term viability. For CORS, it represents maturation from startup to established institution.

Next steps: A site visit team will evaluate CORS in March 2026. If approved, we anticipate full accreditation by summer/fall 2026, positioning us to serve the church faithfully for decades to come.

### LOCAL SCHOLARS FUND

The Auburn|Opelika community has numerous top-notch pastors and ministry leaders with the God-given ability to become thought leaders in theology and missions. Some desire to pursue a doctoral degree, but encounter a financial barrier. We want to provide financial aid for leaders who align with our vision and mission and would pour back into our students through teaching at our seminary. In the long run, this is one way to raise the level of Christian scholarship in our community for the good of our community and beyond.

To pursue this aim, we recently established the Local Scholars Fund to support local pastors and ministry leaders in pursuing terminal degrees. Our first beneficiary of this fund is Jere Scott Bradshaw. Jere Scott completed his ThM at Gordon-Conwell last Fall and was admitted to the PhD program at Beeson Divinity School this past May. ### DOYLE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In 2025, we established the Dr. Peter & Sally Ann Doyle Memorial Scholarship to honor their legacy by encouraging Christlike character in aspiring leaders. This scholarship is awarded annually to a master's degree student in their second or third year of seminary who exhibits a strong commitment to growing in Christlike character. # FINANCIAL REPORT

We have a unique financial model with two revenue streams: tuition covers programming costs while donor support covers 100% of staff compensation. This keeps tuition at one-third the cost of most seminaries, removing financial barriers for future pastors and missionaries.
