
A WORD FROM FATHER JIM

Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. Alleluia! This is the Good News message of Easter. Jesus' empty tomb no longer displays death, but new life. The Resurrection of Jesus reveals God's plan for humanity's salvation and redemption. On the Cross, Jesus conquers sin and death. His Resurrection displays his victory and the gift of new life in him. This Good News is meant to be shared and Christ is counting on each of us to bring this message of love to all. However, like the people in the Scriptures, we can respond to the evidence of Jesus' Resurrection in different ways.

- 1) We can respond with fear and great joy. The women at the tomb responded with such emotion. Their fear was an awe that comes from witnessing something incredible; not the terror of being in danger or frightened. Along with this style of fear was joy. This great joy came from the realization that Jesus truly is the Son of God. The Resurrection shows that Jesus redeems all things and makes them new; this includes each of us.
- 2) We can respond by trying to avoid the evidence. The chief priests took this approach. They paid off the guards, asking them to lie about what truly happened at the Lord's tomb, rather than seeking the truth. The chief priests secretly realized that Jesus is who he says he is, yet they created all sorts of reasons not to believe because they know the implications of it being true. Jesus rising from the dead means that he has absolute reign over our lives.
- 3) We can respond with fear and a lack of joy. The soldiers who were tasked with guarding the Lord's tomb had this response. They should have been convinced of the truth; however, they did nothing with it. They took the chief priests' bribe and kept the truth to themselves. They feared the punishment, which they might have received from the Roman Authorities. This fear sucked the joy right out of their lives. These soldiers represent those who only give passing attention to the most important matters in life, especially the truth.
- 4) We can respond by worshipping through our doubts. This is the response which the apostles displayed. They continued to hold on to their faith, even in times of doubt. Even though the disciples had seen, some still struggled with doubt. A major part of this response was their lack of understanding. At Pentecost, the apostles will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, who will grant them understanding and fullness of faith. Remember, faith is not the absence of doubt; however, faith is accepting what we cannot understand based on what we can comprehend.
- 5) We can respond with joy and action. This is the response that Jesus wants us to have. This is why he gives us the Great Commission (to go and make disciples) before he ascends into heaven. We receive the fullness of joy in our service to God, which includes evangelization (the teaching, preaching, and living our faith). Nothing makes us more joyful than to fulfill the will of the Father.

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ shows us that there is life after death. Our response to the Resurrection reveals a lot about our faith and trust in God. Jesus invites us to share in the joy of his victory over sin and death; he wants us to spread the Good News so all will have the opportunity to participate in the fullness of God's love. I wish each of you a very blessed Easter Season. May our Risen Lord inspire you to live and share the Good News that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. Alleluia!



Masonry Repair: \$46,000.00***The Masonry repair is now complete.***

Gutter Repair: \$51,300.00. Work includes: new copper gutters, new copper flashing, new fascia and reinstalling fascia.



CHURCH DAMAGE

Brick Damage and Gutter Issues

After removing gutters to investigate the extent of damage of masonry work: Damage to the brick wall was caused by two means;

- Leaking gutters at the center joint allowed water to wash down the face of the wall causing erosion of the bed mortar joints, rusting the existing reinforcement bars and causing the bars to migrate outside the wall.
- 2) The deformed copper cap flashing with open joints allowed water to enter the wall.

COMING SOON: Roofing Repair: We are requesting bids for a complete re-roofing of the church within the next year. We are researching all types of roofing and considering engaging a Roofing Consultant. **Window Repair**: Fogging and potential leaking issues.





Pasta, spaghetti sauce, pork and beans, peanut butter, canned soup, tuna, canned vegetables and cereal.




