Dear Parents,

Welcome to Confirmation! This is such an important step in your teen's faith journey as the Holy Spirit comes upon them in a strong and powerful way to complete their full initiation into the Catholic Church. It's not a graduation in any sense. Initiation implies beginning. Confirmation really is the start of their lifelong faith journey of growing in knowledge and love of our Lord. We are excited to partner with you on this critical step.

To stay up-to-date on everything Confirmation prep directly on your phone, please follow the instructions on the next page. This will be the main (only) source of Faith Formation communication. (I do not really use email since many people do not check it regularly).

There are several expectations for you and your teen in order to ensure your teen is properly prepared for Confirmation:

	<u>Parents must attend weekend Mass each week with their children.</u> This habit is THE most important part of your						
	teen's faith formation and lifelong journey. Drop your offertory envelope in the collection boxes each time you						
	attend Mass (regardless of if there is money in it). Please do not put multiple envelopes in as only one will "count"						
	each week. A bare minimum of 75% Mass attendance at St. Michael is required (including Holy Days of Obligation).						
	If your teen is new to St. Michael Faith Formation, a letter from your previous parish must be submitted. The letter						
	should affirm that your teen had at least 75% attendance in their Faith Formation program last year. Due October 19.						
	Certificate of Baptism: Very important; your teen cannot receive Confirmation without this unless Baptized at St.						
	Michael parish. Due October 19. If your teen has not been Baptized, please call immediately.						
	Students will be required to attend at least 75% of the classes every Sunday from 10:05-11:35am (immediately following						
	the 9am Mass) in the Malin Center (please see the schedule).						
	Confirmation Saint Form. Due December 14.						
	Sponsor Form: Please pay close attention to the sponsor qualifications listed on the form. Due December 14.						
	Sponsor Eligibility Letter: Necessary only if the sponsor is not a St. Michael parishioner. Due December 14.

The sooner the better, but <u>absolutely no later than Sunday, March 22, 2026</u>. Parents need to help their teen memorize these prayers, the catechists won't have time in class to do so. It's important to start early and stay consistent with working on these. Over the last three years, there's been <u>too many</u> teens stressing out at the last minute, particularly with the Nicene Creed. The intent is not to stress them out like on a test, but to ensure that they have the basic prayers of our faith in their minds so they can access them for actual prayer times. Please don't allow them to "cram." This will only make them forget as soon as they've "passed."

I cannot recommend using the **Hallow** app enough. If used regularly, it will help your child memorize their prayers much faster. The app allows the user to <u>hear</u> the prayer being read by a warm, human voice and <u>read</u> along while listening, then they can read along <u>aloud</u> while listening. Your child will use THREE senses hearing, reading, and speaking to memorize. I can't imagine an easier way for them to learn. Get it in your app store!

Parent Expectations Explanation and Schedule





The *Chosen: Parent's Guide* is designed to instruct you, the parent, in your integral role with your teen's Confirmation preparation. It is also an opportunity to revisit and rekindle your own faith. The *Guide* includes an overview of a parent's role, guidelines for supporting your child's journey of faith, tips for talking with your child, and more.

A foundation of the *Chosen: Parent's Guide* is to encourage at least nine focused conversations with your teen about the Confirmation process and some of the topics they will be learning. This schedule is designed so that the parent will complete the content of the *Guide* before Thanksgiving and will have the topic conversations right after your teen has learned about the particular topic.

Symbolon: The Catholic Faith Explained is a systematic presentation of our Catholic Faith. It will lead you through the "big picture" of the Catholic Faith and our Creed is the guide. Symbolon brings together some of the most trusted Catholic teachers in the world to guide you through the breadth and richness of the Catholic faith. You will watch the first 3.5 episodes of Symbolon Part 2: Living the Faith.



TIPS FOR CHOOSING A CONFIRMATION SAINT

Saints are people who have lived holy lives and are now in heaven. Their life stories provide examples for others on how to overcome spiritual obstacles on Earth. As you prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation you are asked to choose a saint as your patron/patroness. At your Confirmation you will be confirmed using this name. You may choose your Baptismal name or a canonized saint of the Catholic Church. The saint you choose should reflect a devotion you have to the saint, virtues or gifts to which you aspire, or the patron saint of certain gifts that are dear to you. Please understand that you are choosing a saint to be your inspiration and guide for your whole life, not just for right now. As an example, be mindful that you might not always be playing sports into your thirties, forties, and fifties. St. Sebastian may be great for right now, but will he be that same inspiration and guide later on in life?

- 1. Pray to the Holy Spirit, and ask him for help in finding a saint whose life you'd like to imitate. This saint will be bonded with you spiritually, and becomes your heavenly patron who intercedes for you before God. He or she wants to help you get to heaven.
- 3. Are there any saints you can relate to that have your first name or middle name?
- 4. Are there any saints you can relate to whose feast day is the same date as your Baptism...your birth?
- 5. What are your areas of enjoyment or hobbies? Who is the patron saint of those?
- 6. Ask someone who knows both you AND God well for suggestions.
- 7. Pray to the Holy Spirit...again.
- 8. Narrow your selection down to three or four saints to read and learn more about. Learn as much as you can.
- 9. Pray to the Holy Spirit...again. Pray to each of the saints you are considering asking them for guidance.
- 10. Consider the one or two special stories told about those saints on your "short" list to help you find a spiritual connection. For example, St. Maximilian Kobe gave up his life for another person's life in a German concentration camp during World War II, and so showed the virtue of selflessness. St. Francis, a spiritual leader who founded a religious order, led a simple life of poverty and greatly loved animals.
- 11. Take your list of three or four saints to a family member or friend who is a practicing Catholic. Talk about the saints' lives with that person, and discuss what attracts you spiritually to these holy people. See what they think.
- 12. Pray to the Holy Spirit...again. Pray to each of the saints you are considering asking them for guidance...again.
- 13. Make your choice and complete the Confirmation Saint Form and turn it in before January 8, 2023.

Before you are confirmed and for the rest of your life:

- 1. Pray to your saint. Ask him or her to intercede for you, to help you make the right moral choices, and overall to be a powerful spiritual guide the rest of your life.
- 2. Buy pictures, holy cards, statues and books associated with your saint. These visual reminders of your saint will regularly help you reflect upon his or her unique virtues.

TIPS FOR CHOOSING A CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

Look first to one of your Baptismal godparents. Because of the connection between the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, the Church encourages you to invite your godmother or godfather to be your Confirmation sponsor. If that's not possible, you are looking for a person who is:

- faithful to Sunday Mass and to the reception of the sacraments.
- a living witness to the Catholic faith.
- a person of prayer. He or she has spoken about or indicated an understanding of the importance of prayer.
- aware of a Christian's responsibility to follow Jesus in service of others. Someone who donates time or money to
 help the poor, works with youth, visits the homebound, helps out at the local food pantry, or does other forms of
 service.
- honest. A person of integrity who is willing to speak up and stand up for what is right even in the face of opposition. A person who encourages you to do the same.
- someone you know well and who knows you well. Someone with whom you will have an on-going relationship.

Did you recognize anyone in the description above? Think about the people in your life: aunts, uncles, older sisters or brothers, a parent of a friend, a neighbor, or a teacher at school. It is a huge privilege to be asked to be a Confirmation sponsor. The person you choose should recognize this and take it seriously. He/she should be your prayer partner and mentor in faith long after the oil of Confirmation has gone from your forehead.

The Catholic Church Code of Canon Law (Regarding Sponsors)

Can. 872 A sponsor helps the baptized person to lead a Christian life in keeping with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations inherent in it.

Can. 873 There is to be only one male sponsor or one female sponsor or one of each.

Can. 874 §1. To be permitted to take on the function of sponsor a person must:

- 1. be designated by the one to be baptized, by the parents or the person who takes their place and have the aptitude and intention of fulfilling this function;
- 2. have completed the sixteenth year of age;
- 3. be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has already received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and who leads a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on;
- 4. not be bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared; *
- 5. not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized.
- §2. A baptized person who belongs to a non-Catholic ecclesial community is not to participate except together with a Catholic sponsor and then only as a witness of the baptism.

Can. 892 Insofar as possible, there is to be a sponsor for the person to be confirmed; the sponsor is to take care that the confirmed person behaves as a true witness of Christ and faithfully fulfills the obligations inherent in this sacrament.

§2. It is desirable to choose as sponsor the one who undertook the same function in baptism.

*Can. 874 §1. #4: Simply put this means if married, the marriage is recognized by the Catholic Church.

The sponsor's duty is to see that the one confirmed acts as a true witness to Christ and faithfully fulfills the duties inherent in this sacrament (Canon 892).

Sponsor Qualifications (Canon 874 on the reverse of this page):

To be permitted to take on the function of sponsor, a person must:

- 1. be 16 years of age or older
- 2. be fully initiated in the Catholic Church (must have received Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation)
- 3. be a Catholic in good standing (regularly practices the faith & marriage recognized by the Catholic Church)
- 4. not be a parent of the individual who is receiving the sacrament

A Certificate/Letter of Eligibility is required from the Sponsor's Home Parish (if other than St. Michael.

The Sponsor needs to contact their Home Parish and have their Parish mail them (or me) the Certificate/Letter

This is also due no later than December 14, 2025
