Welcome to the VR and Gaming 2024 review, salary and contractor rate guide for the UK.

It's once again been a tough year for most in the VR & Gaming industry, I think it's fair to say we are all glad to see "Game Over" for 2024 and a good time to hit the reset button in preparation for 2025.

One thing that has remained a constant is our commitment to providing the best possible experience for the studios we work with and the amazing talented candidates we represent.

We saw a lot of studios start 2024 with stabilisation high on the agenda, whilst many other industries were looking to continue to downsize through redundancies and mitigate costs, we continued to support studios in a transformative market. Towards the end of H1 conversations started to pivot towards Cost Mitigation through our suite of solutions.

Studios we partner with were wanting solutions that reduce costs without sacrificing quality. With studios weighing up options, many had to make difficult decisions in H2 through redundancies

Top level summary of 2024 Trends in the Gaming and VR Industry

With the unfortunate circumstances not just in the Gaming and VR Industry in 2023 many studios were forced to make difficult decisions whilst the market corrected and aligned itself. This led to the supply of candidates on the market, significantly outweighing demand from studios to hire. We have seen several knock-on effects from this the most noteworthy being that candidates are being more flexible when it comes to salary expectations, with the trade-off being that they are looking for studio stability and opportunities for individual growth. One of the most common talent insights we got asked for across 2024 is the benchmarking of salaries so that studios are positioning salaries inline with candidate expectations.

Another prominent trend is the rapid expansion of cloud gaming and subscription services in the UK which has created new job opportunities, shifted skill demands, and increased competition for talent within the gaming and tech sectors. What this has meant for studios looking to hire within Cloud is that they are going up against tech sectors who have established foot in hiring personnel in this tech vertical. In addition to this many cloud-related roles allow for remote work, creating competition between UK studios and international firms hiring UK-based talent.

Art & Animation

As the gaming industry thrives on innovation, the collaboration between artists and animators stands as the driving force behind the creation of unparalleled gaming experiences. In 2024, the marriage of art and animation has not only seen enhancements in the visual allure of games but has seen storytelling and player engagement to new heights.

In 2024 we have seen advancements in animation technology which has given rise to characters that exhibit a level of expressiveness previously unseen.

Motion capture, AI and procedural animation techniques contribute to characters that move, emote and react with realism that forges deeper connections between players and their virtual counterparts.

What all this has meant from a staffing perspective is that niche requirements have been more prominent as essentials when a studio is looking to hire someone from the Art/Animation genre. With candidates in plentiful supply in 2025, competition for positions has been fierce.

Development & Testing

In 2024, game development teams are envisioned as eclectic ensembles, blending the expertise of seasoned programmers, imaginative artists, forward-thinking designers, and methodical project managers. The industry continues to recognise that diversity fosters creativity and innovation, and our VR & Gaming Division actively seek candidates whose unique perspectives contribute to the rich tapestry of gaming narratives.

Development and testing has been unquestionably our most in demand area of recruitment within VR and Gaming, we saw an uplift in live vacancies in 2024 compared to 2023, which has gone against the grain compared to other verticals hiring within VR and Gaming.

With the likes of BioTech and Medical Manufacturers increasingly opening doors into the VR space, traditional gaming developers in particular Unity Developers are being approached and recruited within different industries, with indicators pointing that these industries are set to continuing to grow within 2024/2025. We could see a candidate shortage within some development disciplines which traditionally sat within gaming.
