## ON APRIL 3, 1860,

a lone rider left on horseback from the gates  
of one of the nation's most historic landmarks  
— The Pony Express Stables in St. Joseph,  
Missouri. Carrying saddlebags filled with our  
nation's hopes and dreams, the riders traveled  
2000 miles west to Sacramento, California.  
These brave, young souls raced against  
nature's cruel elements and rugged terrain  
in an attempt to unite a country separated  
by distance.

Today, the Stables continue to stand as a  
tribute to the legend and legacy of the Pony  
Express and its enduring era.

In the newly opened Hall of Riders, you can  
learn about life on the Trail, hear stories of the  
riders' hair-raising adventures and see historic  
photographs of 22 famous and lesser known  
Pony Express riders, including Johnny Fry,  
Buffalo Bill and Broncho Charlie Miller. On  
display are authentic objects from the riders'  
personal collections — like Robert Strickland's  
saddle, donated by his descendants.

Whatever your age, you're sure to be  
captivated by the stories and images of  
an era long passed. Broncho Charlie Miller  
was only 11 years old when he experienced  
the Pony Express ... How old  
will you be?
